I. <u>THE PREVENTION OF TORTURE BILL (NATIONAL</u> <u>ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 47 OF 2016)</u>

1. Notice is given that the Leader of the Majority Party (Hon Aden Duale) intends to move the following amendment to the Prevention of Torture Bill, 2016 at the <u>Committee Stage</u>-

NEW CLAUSE 30A

THAT the Bill be amended by inserting following new Clause immediately after clause 30-

Amendment of section 129 of No 8 of 1999. **30A.** The Environmental Management and Co-ordination Act, 1999 is amended in section 129 by deleting subsection (4) and substituting therefor the following new subsection-

(4) Upon any appeal to the Tribunal under this section, the Tribunal may if satisfied-

- (a) upon application by any party, issue orders maintaining the status quo of any matter or activity which is the subject of the appeal until the appeal is determined;
- (b) upon application by any party, review any orders made under paragraph(a).

(5) Any status quo automatically maintained by virtue of the filing of any appeal prior to the commencement of subsection (4) shall lapse upon commencement of this Act unless the Tribunal, upon application by a party to the appeal, issues fresh orders maintaining the status quo in accordance with subsection (4)(a).

2. <u>Notice is given that the Member for Kibra (Hon. Kenneth Okoth) intends to move the</u> <u>following amendments to the Prevention of Torture Bill, 2017 at the Committee Stage–</u>

CLAUSE 1

THAT, Clause 1 of the Bill be amended by deleting the words "on such a date as the Cabinet Secretary may, by notice in the Gazette appoint" appearing after the word "operation" and substituting therefor the words "upon publication in the Gazette."

CLAUSE 4

THAT, Clause 4 of the Bill be amended in paragraph (a) by deleting the words "him or her" appearing in paragraph (i), (ii) and (iii) and substituting therefor the words "that person."

CLAUSE 13

THAT, Clause 13 of the Bill be amended—

(a) by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (7)—

"(7a) Where there are any visible signs of torture, the court shall record and shall, on its motion issue an order of investigation immediately and order submissions of an investigation report within seven days.

(7b) An order made under sub-section (7) and (7a) shall be directed to an officer commanding a police station within whose jurisdiction the torture occurred"; and

(b) in sub-clause (9) in sub-clause (9) by inserting the words "take all necessary measures." immediately before the word "protect" appearing in paragraph (a).

CLAUSE 15

THAT, Clause 15 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new paragraph immediately after paragraph (a)—

"(aa) for purposes of making a determination on the victims protection and welfare."

CLAUSE 16

THAT, Clause 16 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (1) by inserting the following new paragraph immediately after paragraph (c)—

"(d) a person who is under protection by the Witness Protection Agency established under section 3A of the witness Protection Act."

CLAUSE 19

THAT, that clause 19 of the Bill be deleted.

CLAUSE 20

THAT, Clause 20 of the Bill be amended by deleting sub-clause 3.

CLAUSE 21

THAT, Clause 21 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (1) by deleting the words "intentionally or recklessly" appearing immediately after the words "detainee shall not."

CLAUSE 22

THAT, Clause 22 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause 4 by inserting the words "who is suspected to have committed an offence under this Act" immediately after the words "Where a person"

CLAUSE 24

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 24 and substituting therefor the following new clause—

"24. The Cabinet Secretary may, in consultation with the Commission and with the approval of the National Assembly, make regulations generally for the better carrying into effect of the provisions under this Act."

CLAUSE 26

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 26 and substituting therefor the following new clause—

"26. (1) The Commission shall submit an annual report to the National Assembly and may, at any time submit special reports to the Cabinet Secretary on any matter relating to its functions.

(2) The annual report submitted by the Commission under sub-section (1) shall include an overall assessment of Government's performance with regard to prevention of torture and cruel, inhumane and degrading treatment during the period under review by the Commission.

(3) The Cabinet Secretary shall every year be required to report to the National Assembly, steps which the government has taken in implementing the recommendations made by the Commission."

CLAUSE 30

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 30.

THAT, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 28 on the Calendar of the Assembly (Regular Sessions), this House adjourns until Tuesday, 9th May, 2017.

The House resolved on Wednesday, January 25, 2017 as follows:-

- **III. THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4),this House orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report submitted to the House, be limited as follows: -A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.
- **IV.** THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), this House orders that, each speech in a debate on any Motion, including a Special motion be limited in the following manner:-A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.
- V. THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), this House orders that, the debate on any Motion for the Adjournment of the House to a day other than the next normal Sitting Day in accordance with the Calendar of the Assembly, be limited to a maximum of three (3) hours with not more than five (5) minutes for each Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order; provided that, when the period of Recess proposed by any such motion does not exceed ten (10) days, the debate shall be limited to a maximum of thirty minutes (30), and shall be strictly confined to the question of the adjournment.
