- 1. The Senate assembled at thirty minutes past Two O'clock.
- 2. The Proceedings were opened with prayer said by the Speaker.

## 3. **PETITION**

Pursuant to Standing Order 220(1) (a) and 224(2) (b), the Speaker reported to the Senate that a petition had been received from the Council of Chairpersons of the County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committees concerning non operationalization of certain provisions of the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act (No. 47 of 2013).

Pursuant to Standing Order 225, the Speaker invited Senators to comment on the Petition and, subsequently, committed the Petition to the Standing Committee on Land, Environment and Natural Resources pursuant to Standing Order 226.

#### 5. **STATEMENTS**

### (i) Statement Pursuant to Standing Order 46 (2) (a)

The Senator for Vihiga County (Sen. George Khaniri) made a statement on a topical issue regarding the action by the Confederation of Africa Football (CAF) to strip Kenya of the rights to host the 2018 African Nation Championship (CHAN);

- (d) Nominated Senator (Sen. Petronila Were) sought a statement from the Senate Majority Leader regarding the ongoing strike by nurses in public hospitals in the country;
- (e) Nominated Senator (Sen. Getrude Musuruve) sought a statement from the Senate Majority Leader regarding the alleged abuse of human rights of persons with disabilities;
- (f) Nominated Senator (Sen. Getrude Musuruve) sought a statement from the Senate Majority Leader regarding the mainstreaming of learners with disabilities in the education curriculum.

# 7. <u>MOTION – ESTABLISHMENT OF A SPECIAL FUND FOR REMITTANCE OF</u> <u>CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE NATIONAL HOSPITAL INSURANCE FUND (NHIF)</u> <u>FOR PERSONS LIVING WITH DISABILITIES</u>

(Department of Social Protection)

Motion made and Question proposed;

**AWARE** that about 15% of the Kenyan population are persons living with disabilities;

**APPRECIATING** that the Government has taken several measures to avail certain privileges through the National Council for Persons with Disabilities to registered persons living with disabilities;

**NOTING** that the National Hospital Insurance Fund (NHIF) is a contributory health insurance cover and the remittance of contributions for persons living with disabilities by government for the cover, is not among the privileges extended to persons living with disabilities;

**CONCERNED** that most persons living with disabilities have difficulties engaging in gainful income generating activities that would enable them pay the contributions to NHIF, hence are without any medical cover;

**FURTHER CONCERNED** that many persons with disabilities are unable to access medical services leading to high mortality rate;

**NOW THEREFORE,** the Senate urges the National Government to put in place the following measures through the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of East African Community, Labour and Social Protection-

- 1. Undertake vetting of all persons living with disabilities in Kenya to ascertain those who are unable to afford payment of contributions to the NHIF; and
- 2. Set aside a special fund for remittance of contributions to NHIF for those persons who are living with disabilities and cannot afford to pay the contributions.
