4. **NOTICE OF MOTION** – (Chairperson, Standing Committee on Finance and Budget)

THAT, this House adopts the Report of the Standing Committee on Finance and Budget on the County Governments' infrastructure projects comprising County Executive Headquarter offices, Assembly Chambers and offices and County State officers' residences, laid on the Table of the Senate on Thursday, 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018.

5. **NOTICE OF MOTION** – (Sen. (Dr.) Getrude Musuruve, MP)

THAT WHEREAS Article 43 (1)(f) of the Constitution of Kenya explicitly provides for the right to education for all;

AND WHEREAS Article 24 of the Convention of the Rights of Persons with Disability (CRPD) recognizes the right of persons with disabilities to education without discrimination and on the basis of equal opportunity and that State Parties shall ensure an inclusive education system at all levels and lifelong learning

directed to among others, the full development of the dignity and human potential of persons with disabilities;

NOTING THAT Dyslexia is a form of disability that involves difficulty in learning to read or interpret words, letters, and other symbols, but does not affect general intelligence;

COGNIZANT THAT with the appropriate intervention, dyslexic children have talents that can be nurtured in an inclusive setting;

DEEPLY CONCERNED THAT lack of appropriate curriculum for dyslexic learners in public schools disadvantages such learners resulting to failure to maximize their full potential;

NOW THEREFORE the Senate calls upon the national government through the Ministry of Education to:

1. ensure that educational needs of dyslexic learners are catered for in all public schools;
2. ensure a differentiated curriculum for dyslexic children is developed and accommodated within the regular curriculum;
3. allocate funds for purpose of developing Special Needs Education (SNE) support materials and resources for dyslexic children in regular public schools; and,
4. ensure that an inclusive mechanism is put in place to facilitate economic empowerment of dyslexic children as they transit from school to the work place.

6. **STATEMENTS**

**a) Statement Pursuant to Standing Order No. 47 (1)**

A Nominated Senator (Sen. (Dr.) Getrude Musuruve) made a statement on an issue of general topical concern, regarding the Special Olympics World Summer Games.

In the Statement, the Senator informed the House that the Special Olympics World Summer Games are a multi-sport event for athletes with intellectual disabilities, aimed at creating a new world of inclusion and community, where every single person is accepted and welcomed, regardless of ability or disability.

The Senator noted that Kenya had participated in previous editions of the Special Olympics and, on each occasion, the players had experienced challenges owing to lack of funding and support from the government. She therefore, while acknowledging that notable efforts had been made in Kenya to enhance the lives of persons living with disabilities, called for more to be done especially in the area of sports and physical activity for persons living with disabilities.

**b) Statement Pursuant to Standing Order No. 48 (1)**

The Senator for Wajir County (Sen. (Dr.) Abdullahi Ibrahim, MP) sought a statement from the Standing Committee on Roads and Transportation regarding the high parking charges in institutions that offer public services such as hospitals, schools and malls, among others.
