5. **STATEMENTS**

(i) Statements Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (1)

a) The Senator for Bungoma County issued a Statement on a matter of general concern regarding Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) between Lake Turkana Wind Power Company Ltd and Government of Kenya.

In the statement, the Senator stated that, Kenya Power Limited Company (KPLC) entered into a power purchase agreement with Lake Turkana Wind Power Company Ltd. The company was to finance, design, procure, construct, install, test, commission, operate and maintain the generation plant in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) among other scopes of work.

The Senator further stated that in this case, the Government abandoned its policy referred to as "Feed-in-Tariffs policy on Wind, Biomass, Small-Hdyro, Geothermal, Biogas and Solar Resource Generated Electricity" and syndicated a loan from the Spanish Government of Kshs.17 billion plus a Government of Kenya contribution of Kshs.3 billion for a parastatal, KETRACO, to construct the line and that there was no evidence that any arrangement were put in place to recover this construction cost from Lake Turkana Wind Power Company Ltd.

The Senator argued that the Government of Kenya ought to explain the total amount of money it intended to pay to the Lake Turkana Wind Power Company Ltd and how much power will be fed in the grid by the company, and how the same will impact on the cost of electricity to the consumer. In addition to this, the government should equally explain why it abandoned its own policy on connectivity construction and burdened Kenyans with yet another loan from Spain for constructing the connectivity line. He requested the Standing Committee on Energy to investigate this case and table a report in the Senate.

Arising from the concerns of Senators, the Deputy Speaker referred the matter to the Standing Committee on Energy pursuant to Standing Order 47 (3).

b) The Senator for Nairobi City County issued a statement on the banning of public service vehicles from entering the Central Business District (CBD) on 3rd December, 2018.

In the statement, the Senator informed the House that via a gazette notice No. 4479 dated 12th May, 2017, the County Government of Nairobi directed that all public service vehicles would no longer be allowed to drop or pick passengers within the CBD. This directive was meant to decongest the citycentre and implove the flow of traffic in and out of the City.

The Senaotr observed that the directive had resulted in residents of Nairobi suffering as many are forced to walk for long distances from the various omnibus termini on the outskirts of the CBD, an indication that the county government had erroredin operationaling the gazette notice without putting in place mechanisms to facilitate public transit from one termini to another.

The Senator requested the intervention of the Standing Committee on Roads and Transportation to look further into the matter and the progress made in the implementation of these plans and recommend the harmonization of the different intiatives by the various government agencies.

Owing to the seriousness of the matter, the Deputy Speaker referred the matter to the Standing Committee on Roads and Transportation pursuant to Standing Order 47 (3).
