4. **PETITION**

The Speaker conveyed the following Petition -

Acquisition of land and compensation of Keiyo North constituency residents

"Honourable Members,

"Standing Order 225(2) (b) requires the Speaker to report to the House any petition, other than those presented by a Member. I therefore wish to report to the House that my office has received a petition submitted by residents of Keiyo North Constituency represented by Messrs. Francis Cheplaiti, Josphat Maiyo, John Bundotich and Cosmas Cheptum of P.O. Box 44 Tambach.

The petitioners wish to draw the attention of the House to the compulsory acquisition of land by government in Keiyo North Constituency. In 1985, the Government received funds from donors for the construction of a teachers training college in Keiyo after which it gazetted the area and the land owners were notified of impending compulsory acquisition through Gazette Notices Number 4260 and 4261 of 1985.

Honourable Members, the petitioners claim that their land was acquired by the government after which they duly vacated the parcels to allow for the construction of Tambach Teachers College and awaited compensation by means of allocation of alternative land. The aforementioned compensation was afforded to other persons who were not original land owners and the legitimate beneficiaries have not received any form of compensation to date.

Honourable Members, the petitioners have averred that the matter raised in this petition have been brought before the relevant legal and constitutional bodies but remain unsolved. Further, they have stated that the matter is not pending before any court of law or any other legal bodies.

The petitioners are therefore praying that the National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Lands investigates the matters raised in this Petition with a view to ensuring that their property rights are upheld by being paid full, fair and timely compensation for their land.

Didmus Mutua Barasa) voiced his misgivings with regard to appearance of the Chief Administrative Secretary for Health before the Departmental Committee on Health to respond to his Question instead of the Cabinet Secretary herself. Various Members ventilated on the Statement, and the Speaker undertook to issue guidance on the matter in due course.
