# 7. **STATEMENTS**

The following Statements were raised/issued-

- (i) by the Member for Kamukunji (Hon. Yusuf Hassan) pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 44(2) (c), requested for a Statement from the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security regarding increased incidences of criminality and armed robberies allegedly committed by Members of the National Police Service;
- (ii) by the Member for Turkana North (Hon. Christopher Nakuleu) pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 44(2) (c), requested for a Statement from the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing regarding safety standards in the aviation industry;

- (iii) by the Chairperson, Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security in response to a statement requested by the Member for Kimilili (Hon. Didmus Barasa) regarding increased carnage and implementation of mitigation measures to curb road accidents by the National Transport and Safety Authority and the National Police Service in the Country;
- (iv) pursuant to the provision of Standing Order 44(2)(a), the Leader of the Majority Party issued a Statement regarding the Business of the House for the week commencing Tuesday, November 05, 2019;
- (v) The Member for Nandi Hills (Hon. Alfred Keter)) requested for an explanation on why **Question No. 319/2019** regarding registration of M/s. Indo African Tea Co. Limited (India), SSOE (K) Limited (India), Mcleod Russel Africa Ltd (India), andEmpire Kenya EPZ Ltd (Sri Lanka) as Foreign Direct Investments (FDI) between August 2008 and October 2014 had not yet been replied to despite being asked on 4th July 2019. The Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Trade, Industry and Cooperatives (Hon. Kanini Kega) informed the House that repeat invitations to the Cabinet Secretary for Industry, Trade and Cooperatives had been unsuccessful. The Speaker directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to issue summons to the Cabinet Secretary for Industry, Trade and Cooperatives to appear without fail before the Departmental Committee on Trade, Industry and Cooperatives on Tuesday, 5th November, 2019 at 10.00 am; and
- (vi) The Member for Homa Bay Town (Hon. Peter Kaluma) rose on a point of Order, pursuant to Article 95 (4) of the Constitution and made reference to High Court Petition 425 of 2019 which ordered the Treasury to remit Judiciary fund from the Consolidated Fund without the involvement of National Assembly. Upon hearing the views of some Members, the Speaker directed that the matter be deliberated further after conclusion of Order No. 11.
