6. **NOTICE OF MOTION** – (Vice-Chairperson, Standing Committee on Labour and Social Welfare)

THAT, the Senate notes the Report of the Standing Committee on Labour and Social Welfare on the 12th Session of the Conference of Parties to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York, USA from 11th to 13th June, 2019.

7. **NOTICE OF MOTION** – (Chairperson, Ad hoc Committee to investigate the Managed Medical Equipment Services)

THAT, AWARE that the Senate resolved to establish a select Committee comprising nine (9) Senators to investigate and establish the facts surrounding the leasing of the Medical Equipment, in the now 119 beneficiary hospitals country wide;

APPRECIATING, that the mandate of the Select Committee is due to lapse on Friday, 8th November 2019;

REGRETING, that due to heavy workload and sheer magnitude of the assignment, the Committee is yet to table its report in the House and requires more time to conduct a further and thorough inquiry into the subject matter of its mandate;

NOW THEREFORE, the Senate resolves to renew the mandate of the Committee by a further period of forty-five (45) days to enable it conclude its work and table its report in the House.

8. **STATEMENTS**

a) Statement Pursuant to Standing Order 51(1)(a)

The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights made a statement on a matter for which the Committee was responsible, namely the financial autonomy and independence of the judiciary in Kenya.

Thereupon, the Chairperson informed the Senate that access to justice for millions of Kenya was at risk, following a directive by the National Treasury to reduce the budgetary allocation to the judiciary for the current financial year. He noted that this action threatened the autonomy and independence of the judiciary as an equal arm of government, and eroded the gains made over many years of advancement in democracy and rule of the law in the country.

The Chairperson also recalled that the Constitution insulated the judiciary from the control or direction of any person or authority in carrying out its work, a hallmark of which was the establishment of a judiciary fund to ensure the financial autonomy of the judiciary. He further noted that, while best practice across the world was to allocate the judiciary about 3.5% of the national budget, in Kenya the allocation to the institution had reduced from 1.1% in the 2014/15 financial year to a low of 0.57% in the 2019/20 financial year. The proposed reduction of the said allocation by 50% would therefore significantly affect the operations of the judiciary.

The Chairperson assured the Senate that the Committee was engaging stakeholders to ensure the matter was expeditiously resolved, and that the appropriate legislative framework was put in place to ring-fence the budgetary allocation to the judiciary to safeguard its financial autonomy and independence.
