#### 5. **STATEMENTS**

### (i) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 47(1)

The Senator for Nairobi City County (Sen. Johnson Sakaja, CBS, MP) made a statement on prohibitive licensing and operational costs levied on photographers and drone operators by the Kenya Civil Aviation Authority (KCAA) and County Governments.

In the statement, the Senator informed the House that on 7<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 the KCAA announced the prohibition of the use of drones by photographers and videographers. This was followed by levying of an exorbitant fee of Kshs. 1,000,000/= for a license for operation of drones. In addition to this, county governments have been charging photographers exorbitant rates to operate within their counties. This was observed in Nairobi City County where photographers are forced to pay about Kshs.11,000 to shoot on the streets of Nairobi per day.

The Senator further informed the Senate that with the high levels of unemployment, many of the youths who are talented and innovative in the arts had taken to pursue careers in the creative economy. The Senator stated that in many countries the creative economy had proven to be a frontier for job creation among the youths which seemed not to be the case in Kenya, the impression created being the Kenyan Government had taken a deliberate action to stifle and slow down the sector with heavy taxes.

The Senator noted that due to the exorbitant fees charged to filmmakers and photographers, international film makers had opted to look for other

destinations to shoot films, including those about Kenya, thereby causing a major setback in the Kenyan economy as well as to the creative youths.

The Senator urged the KCAA to withdraw the regulations banning the unlicensed flying of drones and engage stakeholders on matters of safety and regulations so as to come up with simple and clear regulations.

# 16. MOTION - EXERCISE BY THE DEPUTY COUNTY GOVERNORS OF THE POWERS AND FUNCTIONS VESTED IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY GOVERNOR IN THE ABSENCE OF THE SUBSTANTIVE HOLDER OF THE OFFICE

Order read;

Motion made and Question proposed;

THAT, COGNIZANT THAT, Article 179(4) of the Constitution designates the County Governor and the Deputy County Governor as the chief executive and deputy chief executive of the County, respectively;

FURTHER COGNIZANT THAT, pursuant to Article 180(6) of the Constitution, a County Governor and Deputy County Governor are elected on a joint ticket, with Article 179(5) providing that, whenever the County Governor is absent, the Deputy County Governor shall act as the County Governor;

AWARE THAT, in several Counties, Deputy County Governors have had to serve as County Governors due to the absence of the substantive County Governors, arising from ill health, incapacity or orders emanating from the Courts barring the substantive Governor from accessing office;

ACKNOWLEDGING THAT, section 32(4) of the County Governments Act places limitations on the exercise, by the Deputy County Governor while acting as Governor, of the powers to nominate, appoint or dismiss that are assigned to the Governor under the Constitution or other written law;

NOTING THAT, other than the said limitations under section 32(4) of the County Governments Act, no other restraints are placed in law on the exercise, by the Deputy County Governor, of the powers and functions of the Governor whenever the Governor is absent;

AWARE THAT, in exercising the powers and functions of County Governor pursuant to Article 179(5) of the Constitution, Deputy County Governors face a myriad of legal, operational and administrative challenges, which hinder the effective functioning of county governments and the efficient delivery of services to the public;

NOW THEREFORE, the Senate directs that the National Treasury, the Controller of Budget, the Auditor General, and the respective County Assemblies and County Executive Committee Members, to work directly with the Deputy County Governor, while exercising the functions of County Governor, in order to facilitate the effective functioning of county governments and the efficient delivery of services to the public.
