- 4. **MESSAGES**

The Speaker conveyed the following Message from the Senate -

PASSAGE OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES (BENEFIT SHARING) BILL (SENATE BILL NO. 31 OF 2018); THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL (SENATE BILL NO. 3 OF 2019); AND THE COMMISSION ON ADMINISTRATIVE JUSTICE (AMENDMENT) BILL (SENATE BILL NO. 6 OF 2019)

"Honourable Members, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 41, I wish to report to the House that I have received Messages from the Senate regarding its decision on the following Bills:-

- (i) The Natural Resources (Benefit Sharing) Bill (Senate Bill No. 31 of 2018);
- (ii) The Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill (Senate Bill No. 3 of 2019); and
- (iii) The Commission on Administrative Justice (Amendment) Bill (Senate Bill No. 6 of 2019).

Honourable Members, the first Message relates to passage of the Natural Resources (Benefit Sharing) Bill (Senate Bill No. 31 of 2018) which seeks "to establish a system of benefit sharing in resource exploitation between resource exploiters, the national government, county governments and local communities."

The second Message is in respect of the passage of the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill (Senate Bill No. 3 of 2019) seeking "to amend the Public Finance Management Act to establish a collaborative framework for collection of revenues by the county governments and the National Treasury together with the Kenya Revenue Authority."

The third Message is in respect of the passage of the Commission on Administrative Justice (Amendment) Bill (Senate Bill No. 6 of 2019) seeking "to amend the Commission on Administrative Justice Act to provide for the decentralization of the office of the Commission on Administrative Justice."

Honourable Members, the Messages read in part "that the Senate considered and passed the said Bills <u>with amendments</u> on Wednesday, 23rd October, 2019 and now seeks the concurrence of the National Assembly."

Standing Order 143(1) (a) requires the Speaker to cause a Bill received from the Senate to be read a First Time upon conveyance of a Message from the Senate. Accordingly, I direct that the Bills be read a First Time during the next sitting.

Honourable Members, paragraph (2) of Standing Order 143 provides that -

"Following First Reading, the Speaker shall, within reasonable time, pronounce his or her **opinion** contemplated under Article 114(2) of the Constitution."

The opinion envisioned under Standing Order 143(2) is a pronouncement, by the Speaker, as to whether a Bill originating in the Senate is a 'Money Bill' in terms of Article 114 of the Constitution.

In this regard, I direct that, after First Reading, the three Bills be referred to the Parliamentary Budget Office to offer advice that will enable the Speaker to form the opinion contemplated under Standing Order 143(2). Thereafter, I shall guide the House accordingly on how to proceed with the consideration of the Bills.

8. **STATEMENTS**

- i). The Chairperson of the Budget and Appropriations Committee (Hon. Kimani Ichung'wah) issued a Statement detailing the proposed timelines for consideration of the Supplementary Estimates I for 2019/2020 fiscal year by Departmental Committees.
- ii). Under Standing Order 44(2)(c), the Deputy Majority Whip (Hon. Cecily Mbarire) sought a Statement from the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock on declining prices of milk and milk products in the country. The Hon. Speaker referred the statement to the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock for inquiry and reporting to the House.
- iii). The Member for Molo (Hon. Kimani Kuria) reported that the Departmental Committee on Labour and Social Welfare was yet to receive his Request for a Statement that he made on 8th August 2019 on the dismissal of Timsales Limited staff in Elburgon. The Honourable Speaker directed the Office of the Clerk to address the matter.
- iv). The Member for Kieni (Hon. Kanini Kega) reported that Members whose offices are located at KICC were unable to access their offices on account of the ongoing ICPD Conference at KICC. The Honourable Speaker directed the Office of the Clerk to liaise with the management of KICC to resolve the stalemate as soonest as practicable.

- v). The Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Trade, Industry and Cooperatives (Hon. Kanini Kega) reported that the Cabinet Secretary for Industrialization had sought a second rescheduling of a meeting in which he is to respond to a Statement sought by the Member for Nandi Hills (Hon. Alfred Keter). The Speaker directed that the said Cabinet Secretary be cautioned that Parliamentary business cannot be undertaken in such unregulated approach and the meeting be held as scheduled.
- vi). Pursuant to Standing Order 44(2)(c), the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Lands (Hon. Rachel Nyamai) presented and tabled the Committee's Response to a Statement on the encroachment of land in Kamukunji Constituency by Kenya Air Force as had been sought by the Member for Kamukunji Constituency (Hon. Yusuf Hassan).
- vii). The Member for Baringo Central (Hon Joshua Kandie) reported that the Departmental Committee on Education was taking inordinately long in responding to his Request for Statement on Special Needs Education in the country. The Deputy Majority Leader (Hon. Jimmy Angwenyi) undertook to pursue the matter with the Committee.
