"Honourable Senators,

I would like to acknowledge the presence, in the Speaker's Gallery this afternoon, of Mr. Anthony Staddon from the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) International Headquarters, United Kingdom.

Mr. Staddon is in Parliament on the invitation of the CPA-Kenya Branch, to carry out a self-assessment exercise on the CPA Recommended Benchmarks for Democratic Legislatures. The CPA Recommended Benchmarks for Democratic Legislatures were published in 2006, and comprise 87 indicators for excellence in Commonwealth parliamentary and legislative practice.

Mr. Staddon is scheduled to hold meetings with the Speakers of the Houses of Parliament, the Leadership of Houses, Chairpersons of Select Committees and members of the CPA-Kenya Branch Executive Committee.

Honourable Senators,

Upon conclusion of the self-assessment exercise, the CPA will prepare a report that will highlight the status of each Member Parliament in upholding the recommended benchmarks.

On behalf of the Senate and on my own behalf, I welcome Mr. Anthony Staddon to the Senate and wish him well for the remainder of the visit.

#### 6. **STATEMENTS**

#### (i) **Pursuant to Standing Order 47(1)**

Nominated Senator (Sen. (Dr.) Getrude Musuruve, MP) made a Statement on the commemoration of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, scheduled for 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2019.

Thereupon, the Senator informed the Senate that the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities is an international human rights treaty of the United Nations intended to protect the rights and dignity of people with disabilities. It is the only UN human rights instrument with an explicit sustainable development dimension. Further, the Senator commended Kenya for having been among the first countries to ratify the Convention in May, 2008. It is, indeed, a reality that from the time Kenya ratified the UN convention on the rights of persons with disabilities, a number of positive strides have been made in the country.

The Senator, however, decried the state of representation of PWDs after the 2017 elections as there were counties that conspicuously lacked representatives of PWDs and, in some county assemblies, PWDs were represented by persons without any disability, which flouts the UN Convention's political, social and economic stand on PWDs.

The Senator also commended H.E. the President for appointing Commissioner Washington Sati, who is Deaf, as the Vice-Chairperson of the Commission on Administrative Justice; Ms. Josephta Mukobe, who is of little stature, as a Principal Secretary; and Mr. Peter Muchiri, who has a physical disability, as the Chairperson of the National Council for Persons with Disabilities.
