8. STATEMENTS

a) Pursuant to Standing Order 47(1)

The Senator for Nakuru County (Sen. Susan Kihika, MP) made a Statement on a matter of national and international concern relating to the International Women's Day, scheduled to be observed on 8th March, 2020.

The Senator informed the Senate that the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU), to which she was privileged to serve as its Forum of Women Parliamentarians' President, had made numerous strides in the advancement of women in legislatures.

She stated that today, women were extremely prominent and vocal in the organization as a result of the mechanisms provided by the Bureau and Forum of Women Parliamentarians, for women legislators to influence the decisions made in their local parliaments. She further stated that the IPU had been a pioneer in introducing positive measures to ensure women occupy key positions in the organization. She further stated that the election of Hon. Gabriela Cuevas Barron, President of the IPU, was further testament to the organization's promotion of women in position of leadership.

The Senator drew the attention of the Senate to the fact that as a result of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), positive measures had been adopted in all parts of the world both at the level of political parties and in electoral laws. She highlighted that 130 countries had some type of gender quota in place and that these measures aimed to redress the historical discrimination that had led to women's underrepresentation in leadership due to factors such as limited access to resources, lesser decision-making power within families and society, and gender stereotypes that confine women to the domestic sphere.

The Senator informed the House that gender equality was everyone's responsibility and that national parliaments should lead the way, by becoming fully-gender sensitive institutions where women and men share responsibilities, and where there is a culture of zero tolerance towards sexism, harassment and violence against women, in line with the IPU guidelines and further highlighting that Parliaments must be gender-sensitive, inclusive and family-friendly workplaces.

The Senator concluded by extending an invitation to all Honourable Senators to a Pre-International Women's Day breakfast meeting scheduled to be held on Thursday, 5th March, 2020, at 7.30 a.m., in Parliament Buildings.
