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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

The Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill 2019 (National Assembly Bill No.40) on amendment to Article 92 of the Constitution underwent First Reading on 7th August, 2019. Thereafter, the Bill was committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs to review and report to the House pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 216(5) (c).

During its Siting held on 4th July, 2019, the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs resolved to undertake public hearings on the bill. Subsequently, the committee through local daily newspapers of Mauisay 26th August and Monday 14th October, 2019 invited members of the public and organizations to attend public hearings and submit their views or make oral presentations regarding the Bill.

The public hearings took place in the counties of Nairobi, Machakos, Mombasa, Kisumu, Kakamega, Eldoret, Nakuru, Nyeri, Meru, Turkana and Wajir during which members of the public either individually or representing institutions and organizations made presentations and submitted memoranda which the committee took into account while considering the bill.

May I take this opportunity to express gratitude to committee members for their resilience and devotion to duty which made the consideration of the bill successful. May I also appreciate the Speaker and Clerk of National Assembly for always providing guidance and direction to the Committee in the discharge of its mandate. Finally, I commend the secretariat for exemplary performance in providing technical and logistical support to the committee.

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CHAPTER 1

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

1. The Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs derives its mandate from Standing Order No. 216(5) which provides for the functions of Departmental Committees as follows:-

 - (g) Examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - (h) Make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - (i) Consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - (j) Examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

CHAPTER 2

2.0 BACKGROUND **PDF Compressor Free Version**

2.1 The Constitutional of Kenya Amendment Bill, 2019 (Bill No. 19)

2.2 Memorandum of objects and reasons

6. The principal object of the bill is to amend Article 97 (1) (c) of the Constitution to expressly include Kenyans in the diaspora as a special interest group to be catered for in the party lists from which twelve members are nominated to the National Assembly.
7. The bill further states that Kenyans in the diaspora contribute significantly to the economy and therefore require an avenue to participate in the political space of their home country. The nomination of a Member to represent the special interests of Kenyans in the diaspora will give them an adequate opportunity to voice concerns for resolution by the House.
8. The enactment of this bill will not occasion additional expenditure of public funds.
9. The bill does not delegate legislative powers nor does it limit fundamental rights and freedoms.
10. Article 97 of the Constitution which is proposed to be amended states that-
11. The National Assembly consists of-
 - (a) Two hundred and ninety members, each elected by the registered voters of single member constituencies;
 - (b) Forty seven women, each elected by the registered voters of the counties, each county constituting a single member constituency;
 - (c) Twelve members nominated by the parliamentary political parties according to their proportion of members of the National Assembly in accordance with Article 90, to represent special interest including the youth, persons with disabilities and workers; and
 - (d) The Speaker, who is ex officio member
12. The proposed amendment to Article 97 of the Constitution states that;

CHAPTER 3

3.0 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE REVIEW OF THE BILL

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13. The Committee undertook public participation on the Bill in line with the provision of Article 118 (1) (b) of the Constitution as read together with Standing Order 127 (3). Adverts inviting the public to make any submission regarding the proposed amendment were put in local daily newspapers of Monday 26th August and Monday 14th October, 2019 as attached to the report as *Annexure 4*.
14. In addition the Committee resolved to undertake public hearings for the bill in a number of counties where members of the public either individually or representing institutions and organizations made presentations and submitted memoranda which the Committee took into account while considering the Bill.
15. The Committee conducted public hearings in the following counties:
 - (a) Nairobi County to seek views from the capital city and its environs;
 - (b) Machakos County to seek views from the lower Eastern region and environs;
 - (c) Mombasa County to seek views from the Coastal region;
 - (d) Kisumu County to seek views from the Nyanza region;
 - (e) Kakamega County to seek views from the Western region;
 - (f) Meru County to seek views from the Eastern region;
 - (g) Uasin Gishu County to seek views from the Central Rift Valley region;
 - (h) Nakuru County to seek views from the Rift Valley region;
 - (i) Nyeri County to seek views from the Central Kenya region
 - (j) Turkana County to seek views from the Rift Valley
 - (k) Wajir County to seek views from North Eastern region

3.1 Sources of views

22. Several members of the public either individually or representing institutions and organizations submitted their views to the committee by way of written and oral submissions
23. A comprehensive list of members of the public who attended the public hearings in the various counties is attached for reference as annexure 5.
24. The written submissions received and comments in a matrix form in support and against the Bill are attached to this report as annexure 3.
25. Members of the public made proposals to amend the Bill as indicated in the Matrix.
26. 83% of participants across the counties visited opposed the amendment Bill. Highlights of the opposing views are captured as follows:

Individuals

- (a) **Mwasiri Sinangoa**, Deputy County Registrar of Persons opposed the amendments on grounds that the interests of Kenyans in the diaspora can be represented by their local area member of Parliament since they are established in other countries and there is an emerging trend where Kenyans in the diaspora are participating in the political affairs of their respective countries of domicile. They are also adequately represented by the Kenyan foreign missions in their countries of residence.
- (b) **Naomi Mwang'ombe**, Kang'undo constituency opposed the amendments. She argued that the existing representation is sufficient and there is need to create

- categories of minorities who should be accorded preference before considering Kenyans in the diaspora;
- (c) **Justus Kacindi**, Deputy Sub-county Administrator, Mavoko opposed the amendment and stated that Kenyans in the diaspora should be represented by Ambassadors/High Commissioners serving in their respective countries of domicile.
- (d) **Mr. Mohamed Ali** from Wajir opposed the amendments on the grounds that it will politicize and fragment the country more.
- (e) **Mr. Ibrahim Ahmed** from Wajir opposed the amendments on the grounds that recently the National Assembly declined approval of a nominee for ambassadorial appointment because of her dual citizenship status.
- (f) **Mr. Ali Garaj** opposed the amendments on the grounds that it will bring into the country "European attitudes" including homosexuality.
- (g) Ms. Fatuma Yusuf opposed the amendments on the ground that it will be an extra burden to the taxpayer.
- (h) **Mr. Hussein Mohamed** from Wajir opposed the amendments and proposed that more opportunities should be given to the youths.
- (i) **Pauline Kisili**, Mavoko Sub-county of Machakos County opposed the amendments on grounds that if Kenyans in the diaspora want to participate in governance matters of their home countries, they should come back home and seek elective positions.
- (j) Kenyans in diaspora may share air their concerns about governance matters in Kenya through Kenyan Embassies and Missions abroad or through print and social media.
- (k) **Elias Mahoma** from Nakuru County opposed the amendment as the member of Parliament will not have allegiance to Kenya or a party in Kenya and may bring about conflict of interest because the nominated member may hold dual citizenship.
- (l) **Peter Ndingu Githae** from Nakuru opposed the amendment citing inconsistency in the proposal and he did not understand how the nominated member was to represent diaspora in all countries.
- (m) Vincent Tamu from Nakuru opposed the amendment and was of the view that in drafting the Constitution, nomination was for those of special interest groups. Therefore, people in diaspora do not fit in the special interest groups.
- (n) **Speaker of County Assembly of Nyeri Hon. John Kaguchia** was opposed to the amendment and noted that the amendment was not necessary despite diaspora being an important component to Kenya. He was of the view that it was not possible to get one member to represent all the diaspora interests and it ran against the proposals to reduce the current number of members of Parliament.

- (c) **Simon Maina** from Meru opposed the amendments stating that Kenyans should be represented internally and not externally.
- (d) **Gavana Wanjohi** from Nyeri, a representative of persons with disabilities opposed the amendments on grounds that a diaspora nomination seat is not necessary in Kenya because it was impossible for a diaspora member to perform oversight role.
- (e) **William Koros** from Turbo sub-county did not support the Bill because he felt there were Kenyans residing in the country who merit consideration for nomination and there is no need to have those in diaspora nominated.
- (f) **Evelyn Akoth** from Nyalenda B Ward of Kisumu County opposed the amendment that most persons who lived in the diaspora are from wealthy Kenyan families and giving them nomination slots may further favour them and yet they did not have strong political ties to the country.
- (g) **Carmelos Otieno** from Kisumu did not support the amendment. He argued that persons who did not live in Kenya have no understanding of issues affecting the country and those with political ambitions should come back and contest for elective seats.

Institutions

27. The following persons appeared before the Committee and submitted their views on behalf of various institutions they were representing:

- (a) **Francis Ndegwa** represented Nyeri, Central businessman and opposed the amendment on grounds that Kenya is over represented and there was need to reduce the number of elected and nominated representatives in both the National Assembly and the Senate. He further noted that ambassadors adequately have catered for diaspora interests.
- (b) **Reverend Joel Gatimu** representing Faith Based Organizations in Eldoret opposed the amendment and was of the view that Kenyan's in the diaspora are already employed outside Kenya and there was no need to give them jobs through nominations.
- (c) **Felix Munyore** from Vihiga, representing the Youth Leader did not support the Bill and was of the view that there was need to reduce the wage Bill and focus on strengthening Kenyan foreign missions so that issues affecting Kenyans in the diaspora are addressed through the Kenyan missions and embassies.

28. 17% of participants across the counties supported the amendment Bill. Highlights of supporting views were captured as follows;

(b) **PDF Compressor Free Version** suffering in the diaspora and should have representation in Parliament to represent their issues and interest.

(b) Kenyans in the diaspora contributes to the national economy and deserve representation in Parliament.

(c) Kenyans in diaspora have innovative ideas which may be harnessed for the country's prosperity.

CHAPTER 4

4.0 CONSIDERATION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS BY THE COMMITTEE

4.1 Proposed amendment to Article 97 of the Constitution

29. Article 97 (1) of the Constitution is amended in paragraph (c) by inserting the words “*Kenyans in the diaspora*” immediately after the word “*including*”

4.2 Committee’s Observations

30. The Committee made the following observations; THAT;

- (a) The Youth are adequately represented in the nomination slots pursuant to Article 97 (1) (c) of the Constitution.
- (b) The Kenyans in the diaspora come from constituencies represented by their local area MPs and further their issues and concerns can be handled by Kenyan’s Embassies and High Commissioners in their respective countries of domicile.
- (c) The number of nomination slots provided in Article 97 (c) of the Constitution is enough for the various groups.
- (d) The number of nomination slots provided in Article 97 (c) of the Constitution is enough for the various groups and Kenyans living in the diaspora are well represented by the area MP’s.
- (e) There are enough qualified Kenyans in the country to represent diverse interests and diaspora representation is for own interest.
- (f) Kenyan embassies and consulates abroad are sufficient and accessible for our citizens in diaspora to pursue their interests at home.
- (g) Kenyans in diaspora injects a lot of money in the economy through remittances to their families and may a spokesperson at some point.
- (h) Kenyans in diaspora are all over the world and face unique challenges making it difficult to be represented. It is practically impossible and a logistical dilemma on how to effectively implement diaspora representation.
- (i) There is no set criterium on diaspora representation and not all interests can be represented in Parliament.


CHAPTER 10

**CONSIDERATION AND ADOPTION
OF THE DRAFT REPORT ON THE
CONSTITUTION OF KENYA
(AMENDMENT) BILL, 2019
(NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 19)
BY HON FLORENCE MUTUA**

The Committee considered its draft report on the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment), 2019 (National Assembly Bill No. 19) by Hon. Florence Mutua and observed as follows, THAT;

- 1) The principal object of the Bill seeks to amend Article 90 of the Constitution to align it with the proposed amendment to Section 33 of the Election Act No. 24 of 2011 which seeks to change the timing for submission of party lists by Political Parties for persons elected under Article 90 of the Constitution from at least forty-five (45) days from the date of General Election to within twenty-one (21) days after the date of general election.

- 2) 68% of the views of the Kenyans collected during the public hearings conducted by the Committee in various Counties were opposed to the amendments while 32 % supported to the amendments.

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- 3) During the drafting and public participation phase of the current Constitution the matter was not a contentious and it was too early to amend the same.

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Speaker Muturi to rule on legality of CAs

MANAGER OF Business Affairs in the National Assembly is mulling over the legality of last week's administrative decisions by CAs, and whether they have executive functions to perform before Parliament is in session next week and address them then.

It comes just days after Speaker Muturi gave his mandate to the Standing Committee on Constitution to address parliamentary committee's well-known lack of communication with the national assemblies.

The move is likely to trigger further debate between the opposition and the speaker. The manager has argued that Article 177(7) of the Standing Orders of Parliament does not give CAs executive functions, and hence cannot perform them in their official capacity.

Muturi will largely rely on Article 153 of the Constitution that grants CAs executive functions to oppose bills committees of the National Assembly or the Senate to assess questions of material or technical merit.

In a statement, Muturi has appealed to the Constitutional Court to rule on the matter.

Opposition members are awaiting the outcome to know if they will be able to exercise their functions.

"I am not aware of any individual or committee that has been constituted by the Standing Committee on Constitution," said Law Officer for Standing Committees, Justice Maina.

"The Standing Committee on Constitution has no executive functions. It is a committee of the Senate to assess bills.

"Any executive function that is carried out by the Standing Committee on Constitution is done by the Standing Committee on Constitution.

However, Muturi defended the creation of the positions by Standing Committees, saying that it was "within powers of the Standing Committee on Constitution to do another thing."

Inside the KQ flight cancellations sinkhole

The airline has already cancelled 52 flights in 15 days of August alone

Kenya Airways' Airspace has canceled more than 52 flights in just 15 days of August, and delayed 70 percent of its scheduled trips this year at an astronomical cost to the taxpayer.

According to a confidential memo, which gave a window into what all the less rosy numbers behind the airline's cancellations told the audience with large concern, the cost of the airline's cancellation rates since March 3 million is the last seven months of 2019.

The airline claims, however, to have incurred costs of Ksh 15.5 million in July 2019, which it says will affect for the year ending December 2019 as higher costs offset a jump in revenue.

The company's filing reveals KSh 300.1 billion, largely driven by passenger bookings.

In the last two months, the airline has faced a range of complaints from customers over flight cancellations and delays of flights. This has seen its passenger count in decline in comparison with the airline.

Below are the figures of the airline's cancellation rates over the last six months of 2019. The airline's August was a flight cancellation rate of 11.7 percent, while September was 12.5 percent.

A cancellation annual average of the airline's 2019 on-time performance (OTP) for this year states that 15% of the canceled flights were caused by crew strike, 4% by weather, 3% by pilot and crew illness, 3% by up-keep.

These are the latest findings of the airline's budgeting agreement (BGA) now in place, although it is not in effect, as of 10th November, 2019.

During the budgeting exercise, Kenya Airways' experts to provide annual services analysis accounted for 10 weeks, around transportation as the ultimate objective. What is interesting about the BGA is that the airline signed with the Boeing Airlines Project Association (BAPA) last year.

The total number of flights have been provided with compensation on account of delays stand at 25,500 for the seven months, or an average of 2,600 per month, however, they are currently at 2,000 per month.

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Governors to appeal ruling on office exit

ToG chair Oparanya says inaction causing chaos
within county offices is causing confusion

The Council of Governors (CoG) president will lead Justice Mung'anya's ruling on the govt's discharge of the county commissioners to the decision of their court.

They told the ruling violated the right of no new personnel has triggered analysis and confusion to ensue.

The Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 55 of 2015) amends Article 275(1) of the Constitution to allow the one-third gender principle in judicial and administrative bodies and to effect Article 54(2) to provide for at least one person of members of the public in judicial and administrative bodies to be Persons With Disabilities.
