#### 3. **PETITIONS**

  - Pursuant to Standing Order 232(2), the Speaker allowed comments and observations from Senators in relation to the Petition.
- ii) Pursuant to Standing Order 230(2)(a), Sen. Kipchumba Murkomen, MP, presented on behalf of Nominated Senator (Sen. (Dr.) Isaac Mwaura, MP), a Petition to the Senate by Ms. Marion Juma and three others concerning challenges faced by patients suffering from Multiple Sclerosis (MS) and Neuromyelitis Optica (NMO).

Pursuant to Standing Order 231, the Speaker invited Senators to comment and make observations in relation to the Petition and subsequently, committed the Petition to the Standing Committee on Health, pursuant to Standing Order 232 (1).

### 5. **STATEMENTS**

## a) Pursuant to Standing Order 47(1)

The Senator for Machakos County (Sen. Enoch Wambua, MP) made a Statement on the demise of Hon. Kyale Mendwa, who was the first African Director of Education in Kenya, former Member of Parliament for Kitui West and former Minister for Livestock and Development, and the Ministry of Water.

The Senator conveyed his condolences to the Family of the late Hon. Kyale Mwendwa who passed away on 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2020 at the age of 94. He stated that Hon. Mwendwa was one of Kenya's pioneer educationists and served as the first indigenous Kenyan Director of Education.

The Senator informed the House that, while Hon. Mwendwa was serving as Director of Education, he oversaw the establishment of a number of public primary and secondary schools as well as colleges and that his contribution to the education sector will be remembered for many years to come.

Additionally, the Senator informed the Senate that Hon. Mwendwa was among the political figures who founded the Democratic Party (DP) with former President Mwai Kibaki when multi-party democracy was reintroduced. The Late Hon. Mwendwa quit elective politics in 1992 to focus on other interests including the development of the education sector in the country. The Senator further stated that the late Hon. Mwendwa was the last of the famous Mwendwa brothers, with his death heralding the end of famous National Heros from Kitui County.

Thereupon, the Speaker allowed several Senators to eulogize the Member and thereafter, pursuant to Standing Order No. 1, called upon the Senate to observe a minute of silence in honour of the late Hon. Kyale Mwendwa.

Nominated Senator (Sen. Mercy Chebeni, MP), sought a Statement from the Standing Committee on Education regarding the review of accredited academic programmes and courses by the Commission for University Education (CUE).

# c) Pursuant to Standing Order 51(1) (a)

The Chairperson, Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights issued a Statement relating to the Report of the Steering Committee on the Implementation of the Building Bridges (BBI) to United Kenya Taskforce.

In the Statement, the Chairperson informed that Senate that the Committee held substantive deliberations and has made various observations on the constitutional amendments proposed in the BBI Report. Additionally, the Committee had made proposals with a view to further achieve the objectives of the BBI Report, to protect the interests of counties and the important role of the Senate.

The Chairperson informed the Senate that the Committee's deliberations bore fruit which consequently led to specific recommendations being made which would be adopted by the Senate by Resolution and form part of the official position of the Senate to the BBI Report.

The Chairperson thereafter used the opportunity to table the Statement of the Standing Committee on the BBI Report for the consideration of the Senate.
