246/2020 The Member for Kimilili (The Hon. Didmus Barasa, MP) to ask the Cabinet Secretary for Education: -

- (i) What is the current capitation for each student under the free secondary programme in the country?
- (ii) What is the basis for the approval of payment of extra levies such as lunch levies charged by various schools to students, and are such payments mandatory?
- (iii) What modalities has the Ministry put in place to ensure that day scholars are not sent out of school due to non-payment of such levies?
