

The House resolved on Wednesday, February 10, 2021 as follows-

Limitation of Debate on Committee Reports

I. THAT, each speech in a debate on **Committee Reports (except for Reports of Audit Committees)**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report submitted to the House for which limitation of time has not been specified, shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of two and a half hours, with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover in moving and five (5) minutes for any other Member speaking, including the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Committee Report is not moved by the Chairperson of the relevant Committee), and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and further that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party and the Leader of the Minority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party.

The House resolved on Tuesday, March 23, 2021 as follows-

Limitation of Debate on Bills under Article 257 of the Constitution

II. THAT, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 97(1) and notwithstanding the resolution of the House of February 10, 2021, each speech in debate on **Bills under Article 257 of the Constitution** (Amendment of the Constitution by Popular Initiative) shall be limited as follows:- a maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying and a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes for any other Member speaking, except for the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not moved by a Committee) who shall be limited to a maximum of thirty (30) minutes each, and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Majority Party and Chairperson of the relevant Committee, in that order.
