Report of the Standing Committee on Devolution and Intergovernmental Relations, on the impasse on the budgetary estimates for financial year 2020/2021 for Kirinyaga County, between the County Executive and the County Assembly

4. STATEMENTS

i) Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (1)

The Senator for Homa Bay County (Sen. Moses Kajwang', MP) made a statement concerning review of regulatory framework for unmanned aircraft systems (drones) in Kenya.

Thereupon, the Senator informed the Senate that unmanned aircraft systems refer to aircraft that are operated without humans on board and are commonly referred to as drones. He stated that drones range from hand-held consumer devices used for photography and leisure to sophisticated systems used in warfare and military operations. The Senator also informed the Senate that drones have found innovative

applications in the health sector, agriculture, disaster management and environmental conservation.

The Senator highlighted that the Government of Kenya published the Civil Aviation (Unmanned Aircraft Systems) Regulations, 2020, in March, 2020, and the Civil Aviation (Regulatory Fees and Charges for Unmanned Aircraft Systems) Regulations in January, 2021, to guide the use of drones in Kenya to ensure safety and ethical standards. The Senator argued that the Regulations have introduced bureaucracies, licenses and levies which would stifle innovation in the Unmanned Aircraft Systems sub sector in Kenya.

The Senator further argued that a clear distinction needs to be made between drones for leisure and recreation, for commerce and security and military operations and that the Government must lower ref-flags and cut red-tape to encourage innovation and the fourth industrial revolution.

The Senator concluded by urging the Standing Committee on Roads and Transportation in conjunction with the Standing Committee on Information and Technology to engage the ministry concerned and relevant stakeholders to address a number of retrogressive provisions in the Regulations and to report to the Senate on the action taken.
