Limitation of Debate on Individual Members' Bills

THAT, each speech in a debate on Bills NOT sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of three hours and thirty minutes, with not more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover, in moving and ten (10) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each; and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.

277/2021 The Member for Mwingi Central (Hon. Gideon Mulyungi MP) to ask the Teachers Service Commission: -

What steps is the Teachers Service Commission taking to address the acute shortage of teachers in Mwingi Central Constituency which has greatly contributed to the decline in quality of education in the Constituency?

(Question for Written Reply by the Teachers Service Commission)

279/2021 The Nominated Member (Hon. Gideon Keter, MP) to ask the Cabinet Secretary for Interior and Coordination of National Government: -

- (i) Could the Cabinet Secretary explain the measures that the Ministry has put in place to address psycho-social and stress-related issues occurring among Police Officers which have led to numerous incidents of suicides, murders, desertion of duties, and drunkenness?
- (ii) Could the Cabinet Secretary also explain whether an evaluation has been conducted to determine the effectiveness and efficiency of the above measures, and if so, provide any report available on the same citing challenges identified and recommendations put forth?
- (iii) What steps has the Ministry taken to promptly identify mental health challenges amongst uniformed officers and provide free, unrestricted and unbiased access by such officers to the necessary professional help?
