THE KENYA DEFENCE FORCES (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES) (OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) REGULATIONS 2021 ^{309/21}

The Ministry of Defence has developed the Kenya Defence Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service members) Regulations 2021 (copy attached).

Pursuant to Sections 4(a) and 5(3)(a) and (b) of the Statutory Instruments Act 2013, the Ministry invited members of the general public to submit comments, contributions and memoranda on the draft regulations. The comments received have been considered and taken on board.

The Kenya Defence Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service members) regulations 2021 have been published vide Legal Notice No. 194 (Special issue 178) of 24 September 2021.



THE KENYA DEFENCE FORCES ACT

(No. 25 of 2012)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 304(1)(aa) of the Kenya Defence Forces Act, 2012, the Defence Council makes the following Regulations—

THE KENYA DEFENCE FORCES (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES)
(OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) REGULATIONS, 2021

PART I — PRELIMINARY

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Kenya Defence Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service Members) Regulations, 2021.

Citation.

2. These Regulations shall apply to all claims arising after the 1st July, 1978, in respect of all officers and service members of the Kenya Defence Forces and the dependants of such Officers and Service Members provided that no additional benefits shall accrue to service personnel by virtue of the amendments herein.

Application.

3. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation.

“approved institutional treatment” means approved treatment in hospital or similar institution;

“approved treatment” means such medical, surgical or rehabilitative treatment as may be medically certified to be desirable in connection with any award payable under or by virtue of these Regulations;

“Assisted Living Allowance” means allowances payable to Officers or Service Members who have extra care needs or mobility needs as a result of a disability and is payable in accordance with regulation 40;

“being on duty” means anytime during any twenty-four hour period that an officer or a service member is in the lawful service of the Kenya Defence Forces;

“child” means a child of an officer or service member who is under the age of twenty-one years and who is a dependant and includes a posthumous child, a stepchild and an adopted child, and children shall be construed accordingly;

“Committee” means the Pensions Assessment Committee established by regulation 18;

“debt due to government” includes non-public funds;

“death” includes presumption of death under section 298(3) of the Act or by an order of a court of competent jurisdiction;

“degree of disablement” means the percentage of disablement assessed in accordance with Regulations 19 and 21;

“dependant” means a member of the family of an officer or service member or retired officer or discharged service members who before the death of such officer or service member or retirement of the

officer or discharge of the service member was in receipt from him or her of regular and substantial support or benefit;

“disability or disablement” means a physical, sensory, mental or other impairment, injury or damage including any visual, hearing, learning or physical incapability which impacts adversely on social, economic or environmental participation;

“discharge” means, in the case of a service member, being relieved of military duties by the Commander or an officer authorized by him or her in that behalf;

“heir” means a person named by the deceased in his or her will as heir or joint heir, or if the deceased dies intestate, the person who is accepted as the heir by the community to which the deceased officer or service member belonged whether by any law for the time being in force or by the law or custom applicable to that community and includes any two or more persons who are accepted as joint heirs or the person declared as an heir by a competent court;

“legal officer” means an officer who is qualified in accordance with the Advocates Act; Cap. 18.

“Medical Board” means a board of medical officers appointed by the Pensions Assessment Committee;

“medical officer” means any person who is registered as a medical practitioner under the Medical Practitioners and Dentists Act; Cap. 253.

“medically certified” means certified by a medical officer or a medical board;

“military service” means service with the Armed Forces and Kenya Defence Forces or service in any of the British Armed Forces and shall include for the period prior to the 12th December, 1963;

“month” means a calendar month, including broken periods at the beginning and the end of service;

“officer” has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Act;

“pay” includes the basic salary, additional pay and any entitlements which the Defence Council or the Salaries Remuneration Commission may, with the concurrence of the National Treasury, specifically declare to be pensionable entitlements;

“pensionable emoluments” means the rate of pay including additional pay in issue to an officer or service member at the time of his retirement or discharge;

“resignation”, in the case of an officer, means leaving service in the Kenya Defence Forces in circumstances not amounting to dismissal from the Kenya Defence Forces or termination of commission;

“retirement”, in the case of an officer, means leaving service while holding a regular commission in the Kenya Defence Force—

- (a) compulsorily after attaining the specified age of his or her rank as laid down in the terms and conditions of service and being eligible by length of service to a pension in accordance with these Regulations;
- (b) voluntarily after serving for a period that makes him or her eligible by length of service to a pension in accordance with these Regulations;

“retired officer” means an officer who has retired from the Kenya Defence Forces;

“service member” has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Act;

“termination of commission” means terminating the commission of an officer pursuant to the provisions of section 251 of the Act;

“third party compensation” means compensation received arising from a claim of bodily injury or death caused by the faulty party responsible for any act, omission or circumstances in accordance with regulation 29(7);

“Appeals Committee” means the Pensions Appeals Committee established under regulation 38;

“widow” includes a widower; and

“wife” includes, in the case of an officer or service member in whose religion or customs, polygamy is lawful, any person to whom the officer or service member is lawfully married in accordance with the tenets of the religion or customs, and in that case the amount of the pension, gratuity or other allowance to which a wife is eligible under these Regulations shall be divided equally among all the wives during the period in which there is more than one wife eligible therefore; and “widow” shall be construed accordingly.

(2) For the purposes of assessing pension under these Regulations, qualifying service shall be ten years for officers and twelve years reckonable service for service members subject to the fulfilment of the requirements of regulation 37 in the case of officers and regulation 38 in the case of service members.

(3) For the purposes of assessing pension and gratuity under these Regulations, reckonable service shall be any paid service with the Kenya Defence Forces excluding therefrom—

- (a) all periods during which an officer or service member has been absent from duty by reason of imprisonment, desertion or absence without leave for a period exceeding seven days;
- (b) any period of service while the person was below the age of eighteen years;
- (c) any periods ordered by a court-martial to be forfeited; or
- (d) service preceding a five-year interval in the service unless specifically allowed by the Defence Council at the time

service is resumed; except that where during the break in service, the officer, or service member has been a member of the regular reserve and has been called out for periodical training as provided under Part XVI of the Act, and the period during which the officer or service member was on the regular reserve shall not be considered as an interval in the service for the purposes of deciding whether the previous service is admissible.

(4) For the purpose of these Regulations, a disablement or death shall be deemed to be due to service if—

- (a) the disablement is due to wound, injury or disease—
 - (i) which is attributable to service; or
 - (ii) which existed before or arose during the service and has been and remains aggravated thereby;
 - (iii) in both cases the injury or wound shall not have been self-inflicted; and
- (b) the death was due to or hastened by—
 - (i) a wound, injury or disease which was attributable to service; or
 - (ii) the aggravation by service of a wound, injury or disease which existed before or arose during service.

(5) For the purpose of these Regulations, where a commander issues a certificate of presumption of death in respect of any officer or service member or where declaration of presumption of death is made by a court of competent jurisdiction, the date on which the officer or service member is deemed to have died shall be the date stated in the certificate of presumption of death or declaration of presumption of death by the Court.

PART II — POWER TO GRANT AND THE ASSESSMENT OF PENSIONS, GRATUITIES AND ALLOWANCES

4. Pensions, gratuities and other allowances may be granted by the Defence Council with the concurrence of the National Treasury in accordance with these Regulations to officers and service members of the Kenya Defence Forces.

Power to grant pensions, gratuities and allowances.

5. The Defence Council may at any time review an award of pension made under these Regulations where it has been made in error or where, in the opinion of the Defence Council, it has been obtained by improper means and may on such review confirm, vary or cancel the award.

Power to review pensions.

6. (1) No officer or service member shall have an absolute right to compensation for past services or to pension, gratuity or other allowance nor shall anything in these Regulations affect the right of the Defence Council to terminate the commission of any officer or the Commander to discharge or dismiss a service member at any time and without compensation except disability pension, where applicable.

Pensions, gratuities and allowances not a right.

(2) An officer or service member sentenced to dismissal by Court Martial or Commanding Officer shall not be entitled to pension, gratuity or other allowance except disability pension, where applicable.

7. If a retired officer or a discharged service member enters the service of a foreign power without the consent of the Defence Council, or he or she continues in such service after the consent previously granted is withdrawn, his or her service pension or other allowances granted under these Regulations may be suspended or withheld for such period as the Defence Council, with the concurrence of the National Treasury, may determine.

Suspension of pension on employment by a foreign power.

8. A pension, gratuity or allowance granted under these Regulations shall not be assignable or transferable except for the purpose of satisfying an order of any court for the payment of periodical sums of money towards the maintenance of the wife or former wife or child of the officer or service member to whom the pension, gratuity or other allowance has been granted, and shall not be liable to be attached, sequestered or levied upon for or in respect of any debt or claim other than a debt due to the Government.

Pensions, gratuity and allowance not assignable.

9. Where an officer or service member has held an acting position for a period of 90 days or more at the date of retirement, the pension granted to him or her shall be that applicable to such higher rank.

Pensions where appointed to acting position.

10. (1) Every pension granted to an officer or service member in accordance with these Regulations shall be assessed at the annual rate of one four hundredth of the pay for each completed month of his or her reckonable service.

Computation of pension.

(2) A pension payable to an officer or service member shall not be less than fifteen thousand shillings per month:

Provided that a pension granted to an officer or service member under these Regulations shall not exceed the highest pensionable emoluments drawn at any time in the course of service in the Kenya Defence Forces.

(3) Any officer or service member who is entitled to a pension under these Regulations shall commute up to one-quarter of that annual pension at the equivalent of twenty times the amount of the annual pension commuted.

(4) The normal retirement date is the date when an officer or service member attains retirement age.

11. Every officer or service member, otherwise qualified for a pension, who has not been in the service of the Kenya Defence Forces for ten years in the case of officers and twelve years in the case of service members, may be granted, on retirement or discharge, as the case may be, a service gratuity not exceeding five times the annual amount of the pension which would have been granted to him or her had he or she served in the Defence Forces for a period of not less than ten years in the case of officers and twelve years in the case of service

Gratuity where length of service does not qualify for pension.

members worked out at an annual rate of one-four-hundredth of the pensionable emoluments for each completed month of the reckonable service.

12. (1) Subject to these Regulations, in the case of the death of an officer or a service member or a retired officer or discharged service member there shall be continued to be paid a dependant's pension, in addition to the grant made under regulation 13, on the terms and subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (3), to the widow or widower or the children of the officer or service member for a period of five years next following the officer's or service member's death at the rate of the officer's or service member's pension on the date of his death.

Pension to dependants of an officer or a service member.

(2) Where a widow or a widower to whom a dependant's pension has been granted under this regulation dies or otherwise ceases to be entitled to a dependant's pension, the child or children who are entitled in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in paragraph (3), to a dependant's pension shall be entitled in accordance with these terms and conditions to receive the dependants' pension for the remainder of the period of 5 years from the date of the officer's or service member's death, which is still outstanding at the date when the widow or widower dies.

(3) For the purposes of paragraph (1), a dependant's pension under these Regulations shall be paid on the following terms and subject to the following conditions—

- (a) where the deceased officer or service member leaves a widow or a widower whether or not he or she also leaves a child, for so long as he or she is alive shall be entitled to receive the whole of the dependants' pension at the appropriate rate provided for under paragraph (1);
- (b) where the deceased officer or service member does not leave a widow or a widower, or within the period of five years during which the dependants' pension is payable under this regulation the deceased officer's or service member's widow or widower dies, any child of the deceased officer or service member who is entitled at the appropriate date to receive the dependants' pension shall be entitled to receive, and if more than one child, in equal shares, the dependants' pension at the appropriate rate provided for under paragraph (1);
- (c) a dependant's pension or a share thereof shall only be payable to a child up to the age of 24 years including during the time that the child is receiving full time education at university, college, school or other educational institution approved by the Committee for the purposes of this regulation;
- (d) where the deceased officer or service member leaves more than one widow then the dependants' pension shall be shared equally among them and in the event of any one of them dying or otherwise ceasing under any of the provisions of this regulation to be entitled to a share of the dependants'

pension, then the pension shall be paid to the child or shared equally among the children of the dead widow and in the case the dead widow leaves no child or children then the pension shall be paid to the remaining widow or shared equally among the remaining widows accordingly;

- (e) no dependants' pension or share thereof shall be payable at any time after the fifth anniversary of the officer's or service member's death;
- (f) the dependant's pension shall be paid irrespective of the cause of the circumstances of the officer's or service member's death.

13. (1) Where an officer or service member dies while still serving in the Kenya Defence Forces, the Defence Council, in consultation with the National Treasury, may grant to his or her dependants a death gratuity of an amount not exceeding twice his or her annual pensionable emoluments or his or her commuted pension or gratuity, whichever is the greater.

Gratuity where officer or service member dies in service or after retirement or discharge.

(2) The death gratuity payable to dependants under paragraphs (1) shall be paid irrespective of circumstances or cause of the officer's or service member's death.

14. (1) Where an officer or service member dies while still serving in the Kenya Defence Forces, the Defence Council shall pay a death and indemnity benefit to a beneficiary or the widow or widower recorded in the officer's or service member's records or the designated next of kin where the officer or service member is unmarried, for a period of three consecutive months following the death of the officer or service member.

Death and Indemnity Benefit.

(2) The death and indemnity benefit shall be equivalent to the officers or service member's salary net after statutory deductions.

(3) The death and indemnity benefit shall not be deemed to be part of the estate of the deceased officer or service member.

15. (1) Subject to paragraph (3), where an officer or service member to whom a pension has been granted under these Regulations is adjudicated bankrupt by a judgement of a competent court the pension shall cease as from the date of adjudication or declaration.

Pension to cease on bankruptcy.

(2) Where an officer or service member qualifies for a pension under these Regulations and is adjudicated bankrupt by a judgement of a competent court—

- (a) after qualifying, he or she may be granted a pension or gratuity, but the pension shall cease as at the date of adjudication or declaration, or the gratuity shall not become payable, as the case may be; or
- (b) before qualifying and at the date of qualifying he or she has not obtained his or her discharge from the bankruptcy, he or she may be granted a pension or gratuity, but the pension shall cease from the date of qualifying or the gratuity shall not become payable, as the case may be.

(3) Where by virtue of paragraph (1) pension ceases to be payable or a gratuity fails to become payable to any person, the Defence Council may, from time to time, during the remainder of that person's life or such shorter periods either continuous or discontinuous as the Defence Council, with the concurrence of the National Treasury, thinks fit, direct that all or any part of the money which the person would have been entitled to by way of pension or gratuity had he or she not become bankrupt shall be paid or applied for the maintenance or benefit of that person and his wife or her husband, children or other dependants or any of them in such proportion and manner as it thinks proper or for the discharge of that person's debts and the money shall then be paid or applied accordingly.

(4) Where a person whose pension has ceased or whose gratuity has failed to become payable by virtue of paragraph (2) obtains his or her discharge from the bankruptcy, the Defence Council may direct that his pension shall be restored from the date of such discharge or that he be paid any unpaid balance of his gratuity which has not been paid or applied, as the case may be, and his pension or gratuity shall then be paid accordingly.

16. Where the Defence Council is satisfied that an officer or service member to whom a pension has been granted under these Regulations—

- (a) has shown himself or herself by act or speech to be disloyal or disaffected towards the Republic of Kenya;
- (b) has during any war in which the Republic of Kenya is engaged, unlawfully traded or communicated with the enemy or been engaged in or associated with any business that was to his or her knowledge carried on in such manner as to assist an enemy during war;
- (c) has failed to fulfil his or her commitments concerning the reserve;
- (d) has committed any criminal offence for which he or she is convicted and sentenced to a term of imprisonment; or
- (e) has engaged in activities which are subversive within the meaning of Chapter VII of the Penal Code,

Pension may cease for subversive activities, etc

it may direct that the pension granted to the officer or service member shall cease from a specified date:

Cap. 63.

Provided that the Defence Council, with the concurrence of the National Treasury, may in its discretion at any time divert the whole or part of the pension to or for the benefit of his wife or her husband, children or other dependants and may at any time after his pardon or release from prison restore the pension.

17. (1) Where an officer or service member to whom pension, gratuity or other allowance has been granted under these Regulations is sentenced to a term of imprisonment by a competent court for any criminal offence, such pension, gratuity or allowance shall cease if the Defence Council so directs with effect from such date as the Defence Council shall determine.

Pension may cease on conviction.

(2) Where after retirement an officer or service member is sentenced to a term of imprisonment by a competent court for any criminal offence and in the circumstances in which he or she is eligible for pension, gratuity or some other allowance under these Regulations, but before that pension, gratuity or some other allowance is granted then—

- (a) paragraph (1) shall apply in respect of any pension, gratuity or allowance which may be granted to him or her ; and
- (b) the Defence Council may direct that any pension, gratuity or allowance which should have been paid to such an officer may not be paid.

(3) Where pension, gratuity or any other allowance ceases by reason of this regulation, it shall be lawful for the Defence Council to direct all or any part of the money to which such officer or service member was entitled by way of pension, gratuity or any other allowance to be paid to or for the benefit of his wife or her husband, children or other dependants as provided for in these Regulations and such money shall be paid and applied accordingly.

(4) Where an officer or service member whose pension, gratuity or any other allowance has ceased under this regulation, subsequently receives pardon from the President his or her pension, gratuity or other allowance shall be restored to him or her from the date of the pardon.

18. (1) There is established a committee, to be known as the Pensions Assessment Committee, which shall consist of—

Establishment of
the Pensions
Assessment
Committee.

- (a) two retired senior military officers, one of whom shall be the chairperson appointed by the Defence Council;
- (b) a civilian public officer qualified on matters relating to human resources appointed by the Defence Council;
- (c) a legal officer appointed by the Defence Council; and
- (d) a civilian medical practitioner appointed by the Defence Council on the recommendation of the Director of Medical Services.

(2) The members of the Committee shall hold office for a period of three years renewable once from the date of appointment.

(3) The Defence Council shall on the recommendation of the Director of Pensions appoint a public officer to be the secretary to the Committee.

(4) The Defence Council shall authorize the payment of adequate compensation to members of the Pension Assessment Committee.

(5) The Chairperson shall preside over all meetings of the Committee and in the absence of the Chairperson, the other members present at the meeting shall appoint one of the members to act as Chairperson for the purpose of that meeting.

(6) The quorum for a meeting of the Committee shall be three members and the Secretary.

(7) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations and to any direction issued by the Defence Council under these Regulations, the Committee shall regulate its own procedure.

19. (1) Where an officer or service member suffers disablement as a result of a wound, injury or disease, the Committee shall—

Duties and powers
of the Committee.

- (a) determine whether the wound, injury or disease was due to, hastened by or aggravated by his or her service; and
- (b) in the case of disability, assess the degree thereof, and may, where it is satisfied that the wound, injury or disease was due to, hastened by or aggravated by his or her service, proceed to award pension for permanent disablement and additional hardship allowance in accordance with Regulations 22 and 23;
- (c) award pension on insanity;
- (d) award Assisted Living Allowance in accordance with regulation 40;
- (e) receive, revise, hear and determine any claim for review and assessment of pension or gratuity.

(2) In the exercise of its powers and duties under these Regulations the Committee may appoint a service medical officer or board of service medical officers—

- (a) to advise on any claim; or
- (b) to carry out any medical examination which is required to be carried out by or under these Regulations or which, in the opinion of the Committee, should be carried out in order to enable the Committee to assess the entitlement or the degree of disablement of any officer or service member for any other reason which the Committee considers sufficient.

(3) Where in these Regulations a power is conferred upon the Committee to review and revise any pension, gratuity or allowance, such power shall include the power to review and revise any pension or allowance awarded under the provisions of any of the Regulations repealed by these Regulations except that the Committee shall not revise such award if the effect of such revision would be to decrease the amount previously awarded.

(4) The Committee shall keep a record of all the awards made and shall—

- (a) furnish a copy thereof to the Chief of the Kenya Defence Forces and the Military Pensions Liaison Officer; and
- (b) inform every person in respect of whom an award has been made of the terms of the award and the procedure to be followed in order to obtain payment.

20. (1) The disablement of an officer or service member or retired officer or discharged service member shall be accepted as due to service for the purpose of these Regulations if—

Entitlement to disability pension.

- (a) the disablement is due to a wound, injury or disease which was inflicted or caused while on duty; or
- (b) it arose during service or has been aggravated by service.

(2) For the purpose of these Regulations, every officer and service member shall, unless the contrary is proved, be deemed to have been medically fit and not suffering from any wound, injury or disease at the effective date of his or her commissioning or enlistment, as the case may be.

(3) Where a wound, injury or disease which has led to an officer's or service member's retirement or discharge during service was not recorded in any medical report made on the officer or service member at the commencement of his or her service, such wound, injury or disease shall be accepted as being due to service unless the evidence shows that the conditions set out in paragraph (1) are not fulfilled.

(4) Where after the expiration of the period of seven years from the retirement of an officer or discharge of a service member, a claim is made in respect of his or her disablement, such disablement shall be accepted as due to service if—

- (a) in the case of disablement, the Committee is satisfied that the conditions set out in paragraph (1) are applicable and fulfilled; and
- (b) in the case of death, the retired officer or discharged service member was at the time of his death, or had at any time previously thereto been, in receipt of a pension or temporary allowance awarded by the Committee in respect of the wound, injury or disease which was the cause of or substantially hastened his or her death and the Committee is satisfied that the conditions set out in paragraph (1) are applicable and fulfilled.

(5) Where upon reliable evidence a reasonable doubt exists as to whether in respect of a claim under paragraph (3) the conditions set out in paragraph (1) are fulfilled, the benefit of that reasonable doubt shall be given to the claimant, and where there is no note in contemporary official records of a material fact on which the claim is based, other reliable corroborative evidence of that fact may be accepted.

(6) Where a wound, injury or disease which has led to an officer's or service member's death during his or her service was not recorded in any medical report made at the commencement of his or her service, the wound, injury or disease shall be accepted as being due to service unless the evidence shows that the conditions in paragraph (1)(a) and (b) are not fulfilled.

(7) Where after the expiration of a period of seven years from the retirement of an officer or discharge of a service member, a claim is made in respect of his or her death (being death occurring after the expiration of that period), such death shall be accepted as being due to service if at the time of his or her death or anytime previous thereto the officer or service member had been in receipt of a pension or temporary allowance awarded by the Board in respect of the wound, injury or disease which was the cause of or substantially hastened his or her death and the Board is satisfied that the death is due to service.

21. (1) The degree of disablement to be assessed by the Committee shall be the measure of disablement which is considered to have been suffered by an officer or service member or retired officer or discharged service member by a comparison of his or her current condition with the condition of a healthy able-bodied person of the same age without taking into account—

Degrees of
disablement.

- (a) his or her earning capacity, in his or her disabled condition, in his or her own or in any other specific trade or occupation, and
- (b) the effect of any individual factors or extraneous circumstances.

(2) The degree of disablement shall be expressed as a percentage (100 per cent representing total disablement) in any one of the following classifications—

- (a) 100 per cent;
- (b) less than 100 per cent but not less than 80 per cent;
- (c) less than 80 per cent but not less than 60 per cent;
- (d) less than 60 per cent but not less than 40 per cent;
- (e) less than 40 per cent but not less than 20 per cent;
- (f) less than 20 per cent but not less than 11 per cent;
- (g) 10 per cent and under.

(3) In the case of disablement suffered by reason of two or more disabilities attributable to service, the degrees of disablement shall be determined with reference to the combined disablement from the disabilities together, but it shall not exceed 100 per cent.

(4) The degree of disablement for specified injuries and certain other disabilities shall be assessed in accordance with the Schedule to these Regulations.

22. (1) Subject to the provisions of regulation 20, in the case of the permanent disablement of a retired officer or discharged service member, the Committee shall award, in addition to the gratuity or pension provided for under these Regulations, pension in accordance with the following table—

(f)

(2) An award of pension under this regulation shall, where temporary allowances have been granted under these Regulations, be made to take effect after the cessation of the payment of such temporary allowances, and where no temporary allowances has been granted such award shall, except where the Committee otherwise directs, be made to take effect—

- (a) in the case of a retired officer or discharged service member, where the application for the award was made prior to his or her retirement or discharge, from the day following the date of his or her retirement or discharge; or
- (b) in any other case, from the date on which the application for the award was made or on such other date as the Committee may determine.

(3) Disability pension shall be payable to an officer or a service member who qualifies for the award of disability pension notwithstanding that he or she has not qualified for the award of pension.

23. (1) Where a pension has been awarded under these Regulations based on a degree of disablement, and in the opinion of the Committee there are conditions of exceptional hardship, the Committee may award an additional allowance of an amount not exceeding fifty per cent of the disability pension.

Additional pension allowance for permanent disablement.

(2) An additional pension allowance under paragraph (1) may be of either a temporary or permanent nature as the Committee may determine.

(3) Where the allowance is made on a temporary basis, it shall be reviewed and may be varied or terminated, at such time or times as the Committee may direct.

24. (1) Every award under these Regulations shall be made on the degree of disablement assessed by the Committee at the time it accepts the disablement as permanent, except that the Committee may at any time make a final assessment of the degree of disablement and if,

Basis of award for permanent disablement.

at the expiration of seven years from the date of retirement or from the date on which the retired officer or discharged service member was first notified of the award, whichever is the later, the Committee has not made such final assessment, it shall thereupon do so having regard to all the circumstances of the case.

(2) Nothing in this regulation shall preclude a review of a final assessment in accordance with these Regulations.

25. (1) Where the Committee has reason to believe that the disablement accepted as being due to service may not be permanent, and the degree of disablement is assessed at less than 20 per cent, but the Committee considers that the disablement or the degree of disablement accepted as due to service is likely to persist for more than one year from the date of retirement or from the date of application, as the case may be, it may award a gratuity equal to one-half of the disablement pension payable in twelve months appropriate to the degree of disablement then found in accordance with these Regulations.

Procedure where
disablement is not
permanent.

(2) The retired officer or discharged service member shall appear for re-assessment of the disability within one year following the initial assessment and the Committee shall inform retired officer or discharged service member of the re-boarding requirement.

(3) Where—

- (a) the Committee has reason to believe that the disablement or the degree of disablement accepted as being due to service may not be permanent;
- (b) in the case of a disablement accepted as permanent, in the opinion of the Committee and on the medical evidence there is likely to be a material and early decrease in the degree of disablement; or
- (c) in either case, the degree of disablement is assessed as 20 per cent or over,

the Committee may award a temporary disability allowance which shall be at the appropriate rate set out in these Regulations, which allowance may be reviewed and reassessed after medical examination at a date to be recorded in the proceedings of the Committee and which medical examination shall be carried out at such time and place as the Committee may direct.

(4) The Committee shall have power to direct that the medical examination referred to in paragraph (3) be done by service medical officers.

(5) Where a retired officer or a discharged service member has been awarded a temporary disability allowance under paragraph (3) and there has been no material decrease in the degree of his or her disablement during the period of two years from the date of his or her retirement or from the date on which he or she was notified of the award of such temporary disability allowance, whichever is the latter, during which time he or she has received adequate medical treatment, the Committee may in its discretion make an award of a gratuity equal

to one-half of the disablement pension payable in twelve months and appropriate to the degree of disablement than that found in accordance with regulation 19, which award shall be deducted from any award of gratuity made thereafter, and should the Committee accept the disablement as permanent, the retired officer or discharged service member shall be required to make any refund if the amount of the final gratuity is less than the award made by the Committee under this paragraph.

(6) Where the Committee has reason to believe that an increase in the degree of disablement of a retired officer or discharged service member to whom an award of a pension has been made after a final assessment under these Regulations may not be permanent, it may award a temporary disability allowance, in addition to the pension, of an amount that will bring the combined awards up to the rate appropriate to the increased degree of disablement, and such temporary disability allowance shall be reviewed and reassessed from time to time after medical examination as the Committee may direct, and may be reduced, increased, terminated or made permanent as the Committee having regard to the circumstances, may decide.

26. (1) Where an award is to be made in respect of disablement suffered by reason of two or more disabilities, not all of which are accepted as permanent, and the permanent disability or disabilities is as set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, the Committee shall, subject to the provisions of these Regulations, award the appropriate gratuity immediately, notwithstanding that the award made in respect of the combined disablement from the disabilities together may be temporary.

Award for two or more disabilities.

(2) Where the disability or disabilities referred to in paragraph (1) and which are not accepted as permanent are subsequently so accepted or disappear, and when a final assessment is made and a pension awarded, then the amount of gratuity appropriate on assessment of the combined disablement may be awarded.

27. In cases where it is medically certified that the disablement in respect of which an award has been made under these Regulations renders surgical appliances necessary the Committee may order that such appliances be supplied free of charge.

Supply of surgical appliances.

28. Any retired officer or discharged service member who has been awarded a pension under these Regulations other than on an interim basis may at his or her own request be medically examined by a service medical officer or a board of service medical officers appointed by the Committee, once in every year, at such time and place as the Committee may consider appropriate.

Optional medical examination.

29. (1) Where a retired officer or discharged service member who has been awarded a pension whether on an interim or other basis, for any reason neglects or refuses to be medically examined as required by the Committee under these Regulations, the Committee may, if it considers that such neglect or refusal is unreasonable, reduce the pension as it thinks fit, and the amount so reduced shall not be restored until the retired officer or discharged service member has been

Power to reduce disability award for misconduct.

medically examined or unless the Committee is satisfied that the neglect or refusal was not or is no longer unreasonable.

(2) Where a retired officer or discharged service member who has been awarded a temporary disability allowance neglects or refuses to present himself or herself for medical examination as required under these Regulations, the Committee may, if it considers the neglect or refusal unreasonable, suspend the award until he or she so presents himself.

(3) The Committee may restore a suspended award after a retired officer or discharged service member presents himself or herself for medical examination.

(4) Where it is medically certified that a retired officer or discharged service member should receive approved treatment or approved institutional treatment, and such retired officer or discharged service member, having been so informed, refuses or neglects to receive such treatment, the Committee may, if it considers the refusal or neglect unreasonable, reduce the gratuity, disability pension or temporary disability pension in respect of such retired officer's or discharged service member's disablement by such amount, not exceeding one-half, as the Committee may deem fit.

(5) For the purpose of paragraph (4), any misconduct on the part of a retired officer or discharged service member which, in the opinion of the Committee, prevents the treatment from being given or counteracts its effects may be considered as a refusal by such retired officer or discharged service member to receive the treatment.

(6) Where the Committee is satisfied that the disablement in respect of which a claim is made is attributable to negligence or misconduct on the part of the retired officer or discharged service member concerned, it may refuse to award a disability pension, gratuity or temporary disability allowance, either in whole or in part.

(7) Where third party compensation is paid by or on behalf of a person alleged to be responsible for any act, omission or circumstances which caused the injury or death of an officer or service member or a retired officer or discharged service member the Committee may reduce any pension, gratuity or allowances to be awarded under these Regulations by such amount as the Committee may, in all the circumstances of the case, consider appropriate.

30. The Committee may at any time review an award made under these Regulations where it has been made in error or where, in the opinion of the Committee, it has been obtained by improper means, and on any such review the Committee may confirm, vary or cancel the award or may substitute another award.

Power to review awards.

31. (1) The Defence Council shall have the power to suspend or withhold pensions or gratuities either wholly or in part as the case may be, and subject to any other Regulations made under the Act or generally relating to pensions.

Suspension or withholding of pension.

(2) In exceptional cases payment of part or the whole of suspended pensions, gratuity or any other allowance, may with the consent of the National Treasury be made by the Defence Council to or for the benefit of the wife or husband or other dependant of the officer or service member.

32. (1) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, the Principal Secretary to the National Treasury shall pay all pensions, allowances, gratuities and other charges payable under or by virtue of these Regulations, including such travelling and other expenses as may be certified under these Regulations.

Payment of pensions, etc.

(2) Every pension payable under or by virtue of these Regulations shall be payable monthly in arrears.

(3) Every temporary allowance payable under or by virtue of these Regulations shall be payable in arrears, at intervals not less frequent than once in every month for such length of time as may be determined by the Committee.

33. An officer or service member who is pronounced by a medical board to be mentally unfit shall be granted a service pension provided that it is determined that the illness arose during the period of service and, notwithstanding that the period of reckonable service is less than ten years in the case of officers and less than twelve years' reckonable service in the case of service members.

Award of pension on insanity.

34. All claims for pensions, allowances or gratuities under these Regulations shall be submitted to the Committee, which shall, on receipt thereof, obtain from the appropriate service authorities—

Procedure as to claims.

- (a) full particulars of the officer or service member in respect of whom the claim is made, including all such particulars regarding his or her service as may be relevant to the claim;
- (b) the medical history of the officer or service member and a copy of the proceedings and findings of the medical board with regard to him or her;
- (c) a copy of the proceedings of any court of inquiry into the cause of the accident, injury or death giving rise to the claim, and where the claim is based on the death of an officer or service member—
 - (i) a certificate of death signed by a medical officer; and
 - (ii) unless unobtainable, a declaration of death signed by a responsible service authority; or
 - (iii) where the claim is based on presumed death, a certificate of presumption of death or a declaration of presumption of death made by a court of competent jurisdiction, as the case may be; and
- (d) the names, addresses and particulars of—
 - (i) the officer's or service member's dependants and the

degree of their dependency on him or her; and

- (ii) the officer's or service member's heir; or
- (iii) where there is a will, particulars of the executor named in the will.

35. (1) In the case of the death of an officer or service member or retired officer or discharged service member (in this regulation referred to as the "deceased") the Committee may, as from the day next following the death of the deceased, award—

Nature of award in respect of death.

- (a) where the deceased leaves a widow or widower, a pension to him or her at the rate not exceeding one-third of the deceased's rate of pay as at the date of his or her death or retirement and if there is more than one widow, the pension shall be divided equally between them;
- (b) if in addition to the widow or widower, the deceased leaves a child or children, a pension in respect of each child until such child attains the age of twenty-four years, the age of 24 years of an amount not exceeding one quarter of the pension awarded to the widow;
- (c) where the deceased leaves no widow or widower but leaves a child or children, or if the pension payable to the widow or widower ceases, or if no pension is payable to the widow or widower, the pension payable to each of the children under subparagraph (b) shall be doubled from the date following the date of the death of the deceased or from the date on which the pension payable to the widow or widower ceases, as the case may be,

Provided that—

- (i) a pension to a child under subparagraph (b) shall cease upon the marriage of such child;
- (ii) where any widow who is in receipt of a pension under subparagraph (a) and who has under her charge a child or children in receipt of a pension under this subparagraph dies or otherwise ceases to be entitled to a pension, the Committee may in its discretion continue to pay the pension or any part of it to an approved guardian, provided that it is applied towards the maintenance and education of the child or children to the satisfaction of the Committee.

(2) Where any widow or widower to whom a pension has been awarded under this regulation remarries, or cohabits with any person as his wife or as her husband, the Board shall, if there is no child of the deceased under his or her charge, cease payment of the pension from the date next following such remarriage or cohabitation upon confirmation of the same, but if the widow or widower has under his or her charge such child or children of the deceased the Board may continue to pay the pension or any part thereof to the widow or

widower or in the event of his or her death to an approved guardian on the conditions set out in paragraph (1)(b).

(3) Where any child is in receipt of a pension under paragraph (1)(b) and is under the charge of the widow or widower of the deceased, the pension shall be paid to the widow or widower provided that it is applied towards the maintenance and education of the child to the satisfaction of the Committee.

(4) Where there is no widow or widower, or if the widow or widower abandons any child of the deceased, the Committee may in its discretion continue to pay the pension or any part thereof to which the child may be entitled under paragraph (1)(b) to an approved guardian provided it is applied towards the maintenance and education of the child to the satisfaction of the Committee.

(5) Where the deceased leaves neither a widow or widower nor children, the Committee may in its discretion, award a gratuity to any surviving parents, brothers and sisters of the deceased of an amount not exceeding the pension for six months that would be awarded to the widow or widower and such gratuity shall be distributed at the discretion of the Committee.

(6) Where the deceased leaves neither a widow or widower, children nor dependants, the Committee shall award to the heir of the deceased a gratuity not exceeding the deceased's pay for one month as at the date of his or her death or retirement.

(7) No widow or widower shall be entitled to an award under this regulation unless his or her marriage to the deceased was recognized by any law for the time being in force or by the law or custom of the community to which the deceased belonged.

(8) A gratuity awarded under paragraph (7) shall be in full and final settlement.

36.(1) There is established an appeals committee to be known as the Pensions Appeals Committee which shall consist of—

Establishment of
Pensions Appeals
Committee.

- (a) a chairperson who shall be a retired general officer appointed by the Defence Council;
- (b) a medical officer appointed by the Defence Council on the recommendations of the Director of Medical Services; and
- (c) three other persons appointed by the Defence Council, one of whom shall be a legal officer, and one of whom may also be a member of the Pensions Assessment Committee established under regulation 18.

(2) The Chairperson, the secretary and two other members shall constitute quorum for any meeting of the Appeals Committee.

(3) The members of the Appeals Committee appointed under paragraph (1) shall hold office for a period of three years renewable for a further term of three years.

(4) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations and to any

direction issued by the Defence Council under these Regulations, the Appeals Committee shall regulate its own procedure.

(5) There shall be a secretary who shall be a public officer to be appointed by the Defence Council on the recommendation of the Director of Pensions.

(6) The Defence Council shall authorize the payment of adequate compensation to members of the Pension Appeals Committees.

(7) An appeal shall lie to the Appeals Committee against any decision of the Committee established under these Regulations affecting—

- (a) an entitlement to pension, gratuity or allowance under these Regulations;
- (b) the degree of disablement under these Regulations where—
 - (i) final assessment and award of a disablement pensionⁱⁱⁱ or gratuity or both, has been made; or
 - (ii) a disablement pension awarded on an interim basis, or a temporary allowance, has been terminated by the Appeals Committee on the ground either that there is now no disablement due to or aggravated by service or that disablement still persisting is under 20 per cent;
- (c) the suspension of a temporary disability allowance under regulation 31; or
- (d) the reduction of or refusal to make an award, under these Regulations, and against any decision of the Committee on review.

(8) Every appeal under this regulation shall be brought within twelve months from the date on which the decision of the Appeals Committee is notified to the claimant except that the Appeals Committee may allow an appeal to be brought after the expiration of the period limited by this paragraph if in the opinion of the Appeals Committee there was reasonable excuse for delay.

(9) Notice of the time, date and place of hearing of an appeal shall be given to the appellant provided that where the Appeals Committee is satisfied that an appellant cannot be traced it shall be sufficient if such notice shall have been sent to him or her by registered post or email or electronic means to his or her last known address or place at which he or she was last known to reside.

(10) Every appellant shall have the right of appearing before the Appeals Committee in person or by a legal representative and should an appellant fail to appear, either in person or by a legal representative, at the time and at the date and place notified to him or her for the hearing of the appeal, the Appeals Committee may, in the absence of any

satisfactory explanation, proceed to determine the appeal.

(11) The Appeals Committee shall have power to vary the amount of any award made by the Committee, either by increasing or decreasing the award, but except in an appeal against such a decision, the Appeals Committee shall not make an award where no award has been made by the Committee.

(12) The Appeals Committee shall have power to call for any document relating to the appellant's service from the appropriate service authority, and to order the appellant to undergo a medical examination by a medical officer to be appointed by the Appeals Committee in any particular case and may certify to the Principal Secretary to the National Treasury any reasonable travelling and other expenses which have been incurred by any person appearing, with the permission and in accordance with the instructions of the Appeals Committee or before any medical examination of such person under the provisions of this paragraph.

(13) The decision of the Appeals Committee upon an appeal made under this Regulation shall be final.

PART III — OFFICER'S PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES

37. (1) An officer who is—

- (a) retired or allowed to retire on or after reaching the normal age of retirement as laid down in the terms and conditions of service in the Defence Forces drawn under the provisions of the Act; or
- (b) retired compulsorily before reaching the age of retirement because it has been decided that further employment is not available,

may, provided that he or she has completed at least ten years reckonable service, be granted on retirement a service pension in accordance with these Regulations.

(2) Every officer otherwise eligible for pension who has not completed ten years' reckonable service may be granted on retirement a gratuity in accordance with regulation 11.

(3) An officer who is removed from service in the Defence Forces for misconduct or whose services are terminated pursuant to section 251 of the Act, and who has at least ten years reckonable service may be granted a pension at such rate as the Defence Council may determine, not exceeding ninety per cent of the sum which would have been granted to him or her under paragraph (1) had the officer retired in normal circumstances.

(4) Notwithstanding any other regulation, an officer who has suffered disablement as a result of a wound, injury or disease may, if the retirement is necessitated or materially accelerated by the wound,

Officer's service and disablement pensions.

injury or disease before completing ten years' reckonable service, be granted, in lieu of a gratuity under paragraph (2), a pension under paragraph (1).

PART IV — SERVICE MEMBER'S PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES

38. (1) A service member who is—

- (a) discharged on or after the completion of colour service; or
- (b) discharged compulsorily having regard to the usefulness of such service member in the Kenya Defence Forces and the circumstances of the case,

may, provided that he or she has completed twenty one year's reckonable service, be granted a service pension in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

(2) A service member who is discharged for inefficiency, or misconduct or any other cause within his control but not amounting to gross misconduct and who has completed at least twelve years' reckonable service may be granted a service pension at such rate as the Defence Council may determine, not exceeding ninety per cent of the sum which would have been granted under paragraph (1) had he or she applied for his discharge.

(3) A service member who is pronounced by a medical board to be mentally or physically unfit may be granted a pension provided it is not connected to the service, and provided he or she has completed at least twelve years' reckonable service and the mental or physical unfitness is not connected to the service.

(4) Notwithstanding any other regulation, a service member who has suffered disablement as a result of a wound, injury or disease due to, hastened by or aggravated by his or her service may, if his or her retirement is necessitated or materially accelerated by his or her service and has not completed more than twelve years' reckonable service, be granted in lieu of a gratuity, a pension under paragraph (1).

39. (1) A gratuity in accordance with the provisions of regulation 11 may be granted to—

- (a) a service member who is transferred to the reserve or discharged before or after the completion of his or her colour service without being granted a service pension; or
- (b) a service member who is discharged under section 255(d), (e), (f) and (g) of the Act, provided that he or she has completed at least one year's reckonable service.

(2) A gratuity of thirty per cent of the amount that would have been granted under paragraph (1) may be granted at the discretion of the Defence Council to a service member discharged for inefficiency or unsuitability due to causes not within his or her control.

Service member's

PART V—ASSISTED LIVING ALLOWANCE

40. (1) An officer or service member who is deaf or blind or physically disabled and uses a wheel chair or has suffered disablement due to diseases or surgical conditions or psychiatric conditions contemplated in Part D and E of the Schedule to these Regulations shall be entitled to award of Assisted Living Allowance in the sum of Kenya shillings twenty thousand (Kshs. 20,000.00) payable on a monthly basis to cater for expenses of assisted living.

Assisted Living Allowance.

(2) The Defence Council with the concurrence of the National Treasury may every 4 years adjust the award of Assisted Living Allowance payable in accordance with these Regulations to officers and service members of the Kenya Defence Forces.

PART VI — MISCELLANEOUS

41.(1) An officer or service member retired or discharged from the service when eligible for pension in consequence of the abolition of his or her office or for the purpose of facilitating improvement in the Defence Forces by which a greater efficiency or economy may be effected, may be granted an additional pension of one-sixtieth of his or her annual pension for each period of three years' reckonable service:

Reduction of establishment and services.

Provided that such additional pension shall not exceed ten sixtieth of such annual pension.

(2) When an officer or a service member who is in receipt of a pension is recalled for service with the Defence Forces, he or she shall be entitled to his or her full pension notwithstanding that he or she is in receipt of any other pay.

(3) When an officer or service member who was previously retired or discharged with a pension is re-commissioned or re-enlisted, as the case may be, his or her pension shall cease from the date on which his or her further service commences, and he or she shall either repay his or her pension or gratuity already received or have it deducted from the pension he or she would finally be entitled to so as to allow his or her previous service to count towards his or her pension when he or she finally retires.

42. The Defence Council may from time to time issue such directions, not inconsistent with the provisions of these Regulations, as it may consider necessary for the administration of these Regulations, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing such direction may make provisions for—

Administrative directions.

- (a) the registration of pensions, allowances and gratuities awarded;
- (b) the issue of pension certificates;
- (c) the notification to the person entitled thereto of the amounts of the pensions, allowances and gratuities awarded;
- (d) the procedure to be followed in drawing pensions, allowances and gratuities;
- (e) the procedure to be followed in the hearing of an appeal by

the Appeals Committee;

- (f) the payment of adequate compensation to members of the Pension Assessment and Pension Appeals Committees;
- (g) the procedures and processes to achieve efficiency and effectiveness in the administration of claims.

43. A declaration of presumption of death by a Service Commander shall be done in accordance with Regulations 5 and 6 of Kenya Defence Forces (Missing Persons) Regulations, 2017.

Presumption of Death.

No. 232 of 2017.

44. (1) The Defence Council shall appoint an officer to serve as the Military Pensions Liaison Officer, who shall liaise with the National Treasury on pension matters.

Military pensions liaison officer.

45. (2) The Military Pensions Liaison Officer shall be logistically supported with adequate manpower, office space and equipment to enhance effectiveness and efficiency.

46. Any pension or gratuity awarded under these Regulations shall be paid within 90 days from the date of retirement or 90 days from the date of the death of an officer or service member except where such payment is delayed by legal proceedings.

Payment of pension and gratuity within 90 days.

47. The Armed Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service members) Regulations, 1980 are revoked.

Revocation of L.N No. 61/1980.

48. (1) Despite regulation 46, an officer or service member or retired officer or discharged service member entitled to a pension, gratuity or allowance under the revoked Regulations shall be deemed to be entitled to pension, gratuity or allowance under these Regulations provided that no additional benefits shall accrue to service personnel by virtue of the amendments herein.

Savings and review.

(2) These Regulations shall be reviewed after every 10 years upon commencement.

(3) Notwithstanding the above, these Regulations may be reviewed before the period of 10 years as may be considered necessary.

(4) The operation of these Regulations beyond 10 years may only be extended once and for a maximum period of 12 months.

*Part – E**Psychiatric Conditions*

Part – F

Inclusion Of The "X" Factor In Certain Composite Injuries Other Than Injuries To The Hand And Feet

57. 59. The "X" factor shall be 20% of the sum of the several injuries involved.
60. Injuries involving the hand or the feet:
- Where 2 digits are lost D1 + D2 + "X" factor of 20%;
 - Where 3 digits are lost D1 + D2 + D3+ "X" factor of 30%;
 - Where 4 digits are lost D1 + D2 + D3 + D4 + "X" factor of 40%;
 - Where the big toe or the big thumb has been lost in addition to the other;
 - 4 digits on one foot or hand D1 + D2 + D3 + D4 + Big toe/thumb + such an "X" factor as to render the assessment 100%.
- "D" means a digit of the hand or foot and the figure following it represents the number of digits lost by the claimant.
61. In each of the first four of the mentioned cases in this part, the sum total assessment for the lost digits shall be increased by 20%, 30% or 40% as the case may be according to the number of digits lost. In the last case of this part the assessment shall amount to 100% where the big toe or thumb, as the case may be, and whether on one foot or one hand or on all the said limbs has been lost in addition to all the other digits on the same foot or hand or on all the said limbs.

THE REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

In the matter of Public Participation on The Draft—

1. Accountants Regulations, 2021;
2. Accountants (Professional Practice And Ethical Conduct) Regulations, 2021;
3. Accountants (Quality Assurance Review) Regulations, 2021.
4. Accountants (Examinations) Rules, 2021; and
5. Accountants (Remuneration) Order, 2021.

(1) The objectives of and reasons for the proposed sets of Accountants Regulations are mainly the following:

- (a) to provide for means of administering the Accountants Act, 2008 by the Cabinet Secretary with respect matters affecting the operations of the Institute and practice by members of the Institute; and the administration and management of the Examinations Board;
- (b) to provide for means of administering the Accountants Act, 2008 by the Council of the Institute with respect to matters affecting the operations of the Institute and practice by members of the Institute; and set standards of professional practice and ethical conduct;
- (c) to provide governance framework/rules on matters relating to the administration, management and conduct of examinations offered and accreditation of institutions offering training in subjects examinable by the Examinations Board, in accordance with the Accountants Act, 2008; and
- (d) to provide for a framework to monitor compliance with professional, quality assurance and other standards published by the Council for observance by the members of the Institute.

(2) The effect of the proposed sets of Accountants Regulations includes the following:

- (a) It is expected that enactment and implementation of these regulations will facilitate Government execute its role in the regulation of the accountancy profession while ensuring that such regulation achieves public interest objective at the lowest possible cost while safeguarding quality and consistency, in the supply of accountancy service;
- (b) Create training and employment opportunities to accountancy professionals in Kenya through the guarantee of a rebate of up to 20% of the firm's annual license fees to any firm offering practical work experience for associate members or trainee accountants for a period of two years;
- (c) Minimize Professional Misconduct in the Accountancy profession through the measures prescribed to deal with such professional misconduct and promote financial accountability in Kenya. These regulations will in essence enable the Institute deal with public interest issue on fraud, misappropriation of funds and any other unethical behaviours, in both private and public sectors of the economy.
- (d) Secure regional and global presence of the Kenya's accountancy professionals through the regional and international preferential treaties with regard to mobility of labour.
- (e) Safe guard the quality and credibility of the examinations on accountancy and regulate the Institutions that offer examinations on accountancy through accreditation and strict monitoring including prescription to deal with for any compromise on examinations credibility;
- (f) The regulations have placed standards and predictable fees or various licensing regimes of accountancy profession practice thus guaranteeing predictability while at the same time providing for revenue streams of the Institute and the Examinations Board;
- (g) These regulations envisage to foster regional integration efforts by the government through provision of subsidized license fees for individuals and firms from the East African Community, who would wish to apply and practice in the country;
- (h) The regulations have put in place an appropriate system for monitoring the performance of the bodies charged with regulating the accountancy profession in the country and aligned tenets of accountancy practice to global best practices, with focus on outcomes, in this case overall quality and consistency of accountancy services;
- (i) Ensured coverage of the entry and licensing requirements including education and on-going professional development requirements, monitoring of the behavior and performance of professional accountants, the standards including ethical standards, that professional accountants must meet; the discipline systems and procedures for those individuals and firms that fail to meet such requirements;

(j) Almost all the gaps in the Accountants Act, save for areas which require amendments to the Act have been fully espoused by these regulations thus guaranteeing full implementation of the Accountants Act, 2008;

(k) These regulations have accorded Government a stakeholder driven understanding the nature and characteristics of issues of the accountancy profession and qualification process that should be regulated and identified clear policy recommendations on the issues to be addressed; and

(l) These regulations have accorded Government with the flexibility to explore ways to amend legislation and regulation seamlessly where circumstances require; directly and through the Institute and the Examinations Board.

(3) Possible alternative and practicable means of achieving the foregoing objectives, including other regulatory as well as non-regulatory options:

(a) An alternative to operationalization of the Accountants Act, 2008 would have been to leave the Council of the Institute and the Examinations Board, through resolutions and consultations with the Minister, handle specific matters case by case and on a need basis. This alternative is highly depended on the good will of the institutions and neutrality in the leadership and oversight of Institute the Examinations Board;

(b) The alternative to the role of Government to execute the regulation of the accountancy profession while ensuring that such regulation achieves public interest, would have been to allow the Institute and the Examinations Board to make such decisions through their leadership and oversight bodies established in the Accountants Act, 2008, however the bearing maybe;

(c) The alternative to administration and management of the operations of the institute and practice by members of the Institute including setting standards of professional practice and ethical conduct, would have been left to the decisions of the Council of the institute guided by several pieces of By-laws, Guidelines and Council resolutions, which have no bearing in law in accordance with the provisions of the Statutory Instruments Act, 2013;

(d) The alternative to governance on matters relating to the administration, management and conduct of examinations offered and accreditation of institutions offering training in subjects examinable by the Examinations Board, in accordance with the Accountants Act, 2008, would have been allowed through various pieces of By-laws, Guidelines and Council resolutions, which have no bearing in law in accordance with the provisions of the Statutory Instruments Act, 2013;

(e) The alternative to monitoring compliance with professional, quality assurance and other standards published by the Council for observance by the members of the Institute, would have been left to the discretion of the council and the prescribed International Federation of Accountants guidelines, which are not domesticated to fit into the Kenyan work and academic environment; and

(f) The alternative to a prescribed, benchmarked and predictable licensing fees regime for the individual and firms from the country, region and the globe at large willing to set practicing operations in Kenya, would have been left to the decisions of the Council and the Examinations Board through resolutions or existing fragmented pieces of bylaws and guidelines.

(4) Assessment of the costs and benefits of the proposed sets of the Accountants Regulations and of any other practicable means of achieving the same objectives;

(a) It is expected that enactment and implementation of these regulations will facilitate Government execute its role in the regulation of the accountancy profession while ensuring that such regulation achieves public interest objective at the lowest possible cost while safeguarding quality and consistency of quality, in the supply of accountancy services; Enactment and implementation of these regulations will guarantee full implementation of the Accountants Act, 2008 and bring forth legal legitimacy of the existing By-laws, Guidelines and resolutions of the Council of the Institute and the Examinations Board as required by the Statutory Instruments Act, 2013;

(b) Enactment and implementation of these regulations will guarantee sound regulatory framework for the accountancy profession in Kenya, adherence to internationally recognised standards and code of ethics for the accountancy profession, and secure the accountants professionals from the country a place or recognition in the global arena;

(c) With the predictable licencing and fees regimes prescribed in these regulations, their enactment and implementation would not only guarantee stable revenue streams for the Institute and the Examinations Board, but also place Kenya as a globally complete destination for accountancy profession and enhance global confidence in ease of doing business in the country; and

(d) Enactment and implementation of these regulations will guarantee quality of accountancy services, enhance compliance and strict adherence to controls thereby assist in fighting corruption and fraud in institutions and support the larger government agenda of promoting financial accountability in the country.

(5) Any other matters specified by the guidelines;

Overall, the net impact of the proposed regulatory rule is positive on practice of the accountancy profession in Kenya and beyond including qualifications for the profession.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM FOR THE KENYA DEFENCE FORCES PENSION AND GRATUITIES (OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) REGULATIONS 2021

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PART II

1. Purpose of the Statutory Instrument

1.1. To give effect to and ensure the full implementation of the substantive provisions of Section 304(1)(aa) of the Kenya Defence Forces (Amendment) Act No. 44 of 2016 in respect of the establishment of the Pensions Assessment Committee and the Pensions Appeals Committee, their composition and functions.

2. Legislative Context

2.1 The Defence Council has pursuant to Section 304 of the Kenya Defence Forces Act, developed the Pension Regulations 2021. The draft regulations are intended to regulate the administration of pension and gratuities within the Kenya Defence Forces.

2.2 Sections 20(1)(d) of the Kenya Defence Forces Act empowers the Defence Council to formulate policies in respect of the Kenya Defence Forces. Section 304(1) (aa) of the Kenya Defence Forces Act further empowers the Defence Council to make regulations for the better carrying out and for good government of the Defence Forces regulations in respect of the establishment of the Pensions Assessment Committee and the pensions Appeals Committee, their composition and functions. The regulations are intended to operationalize the provisions of this section by prescribing the procedures, powers, entitlements and functions of the two Committees to ensure the effective administration of pension and gratuities for service personnel.

2.3 The Kenya Defence Forces Pension and Gratuities (Officers and Service Members) Regulations, 2021 are therefore intended to give effect to the provisions of the parent Act.

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3. Policy Background

3.1 The Defence Council is mandated to formulate policies and regulations in respect of the Kenya Defence Forces. The regulations will regulate the administration of pension and gratuities which is key in ensuring that service personnel are taken care of post – retirement so they can live in dignity.

3.2 The regulations further provide rights for the dependents of service personnel and service personnel with disabilities.

3.3 In light of this, there is a clear need to regulate all aspects of the administration of pension and gratuities by providing inter alia for the following key facets:

- a. Application of pension/gratuity
- b. Computation of pension/gratuity
- c. Disability pension
- d. Establishment of the Pension Assessment Committee and Pension Appeals Committee
- e. Duties and powers of the Committees

4. Consultation Outcome

4.1 Service personnel, public institutions with a role to play in the administration of pension, legal practitioners, senior Defence Forces officers and Ministry officials and general members of the public were consulted between November 2020 and May 2021.

4.2 The Committee in charge of developing the regulations also met with Treasury officials in February 2021 and incorporated their comments in the regulations. In compliance with Section 5 of the Statutory Instruments Act, the Ministry called for comments and memoranda from members of the public through print media and the Ministry's website for those who preferred to submit written comments. Digital copies of the regulations were available on the website.

4.3 Through comments received from the invitation for comments made on print media and digital platforms, the Committee in charge of developing the regulations further fine-tuned the regulations; considered and incorporated the views of the public and key stakeholders. The Regulations were then forwarded to the Attorney General for clearance, legislative drafting and publication in the Kenya Gazette.

5. Guidance

5.1 The Kenya Defence Forces Pension and Gratuities (Officers and Service Members) Regulations, 2021 are meant to ensure the effective and efficient administration of pension and gratuities in the Kenya Defence Forces.

5.2 The Ministry will conduct targeted training and awareness raising of service personnel on continuous and periodic basis regarding their requirements in order to enhance compliance.



6. Impact

6.1 The Impact on Fundamental Rights and Freedoms

The Regulations will guarantee the right to dignity and the right to economic and social rights provided under Articles 28 and 43 of the Constitution. The statutory instrument will facilitate the full realization of these rights, their protection and respect so that retired service personnel can lead a dignified life after active service.

6.2 Impact Assessment

An impact assessment has not been prepared for this statutory instrument as it falls within the exceptions provided under Section 9 of the Statutory Instruments Act, No. 23 of 2015.

7. Review

The Ministry shall review the outcome of the implementation of these Regulations after 4 years to gauge the effectiveness and efficiency of the administration of pension and gratuity to service personnel. Their implementation shall further be subjected to annual review by the Ministry as part of performance contract appraisal and evaluation.

REPORT ON PUBLIC PARTICIPATION
ON THE DRAFT DEFENCE FORCES (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES)
(OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) DRAFT REGULATIONS 2021

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Executive Summary

Parliament in the exercise of its legislative mandate revoked the Kenya Defence Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service Members) Draft Regulations 2021 in 2018 by dint of two grounds.

a. The Pension Assessment Committee and Pension Appeals Committee were irregularly created through Regulations instead of a substantive statutory instrument.

b. Pension had been charged to Consolidated Fund through the regulations instead of the Act.

Subsequently, the Ministry moved to amend the Kenya Defences Forces Act which was amended in 2018 at Sec 304 (now Sec 304aa) to provide for the Pension Assessment Committee and Pension Appeals Committees including composition and functions. In addition, and following advice of the National Treasury, pension is no longer indicated at regulation 4 as a charge on the Consolidated Fund.

The Pension and Gratuities regulations are therefore meant to operationalize and implement Section 304(1) (aa) of KDFA which also vests the power to make regulations under the Act in the Defence Council.

Public participation of the Regulations was also conducted as per the requirements of the Constitution and the Statutory Instruments Act. We therefore submit this report to appraise the Committee on the public participation on the draft regulations.



Objectives of Public Participation

Article 118 of the Constitution requires that public participation be conducted in the enactment and application of the law.

Section 5 of the Statutory Instruments Act similarly require that before the making of any regulations, the regulation making authority/entity, in this case the Defence Council must consult persons 'inter alia' directly affected by the proposed regulations.

The objective of this report is to satisfy the Committee of the fulfilment of both the constitutional and statutory requirements prerequisite to the coming into force of the regulations to operationalize and implement Section 304(1) (aa) of the Kenya Defence Forces (Amendment) Act, No. 44 of 2016.



Methodology

The methodology adopted in the process of participation of the stakeholders was both by way of invitation for submission of written memoranda, comments and oral submissions from active and retired service personnel.

Both written and oral submissions were received from active and retired service personnel, partner government institutions and members of the public.



Background

Pursuant to Article 118(1)(b) of the Constitution which provides that public participation must be held, the Ministry placed in the local dailies that is,

- a. Daily Nation dated (copy attached)
- b. 'My gov' dated 20 April 2021 (copy attached)

The Ministry also placed the same ad on its website inviting comments, submissions and memoranda from the public and other stakeholders. By the deadline of the submissions, the Ministry had received a total of five memoranda from Maj Gen (Rtd) Aruasa, True North, ANARK Welfare Association, Joseph Awuoth on behalf of KAF Veterans Welfare Group. The stakeholders were all responded to via email.

Due to COVID – 19 restrictions, the Committee in charge of the review process also received in – person submissions from members of the Defence Forces at the Ministry of Defence Headquarters.



Public Participation

1. Maj Gen (Rtd) Aruasa

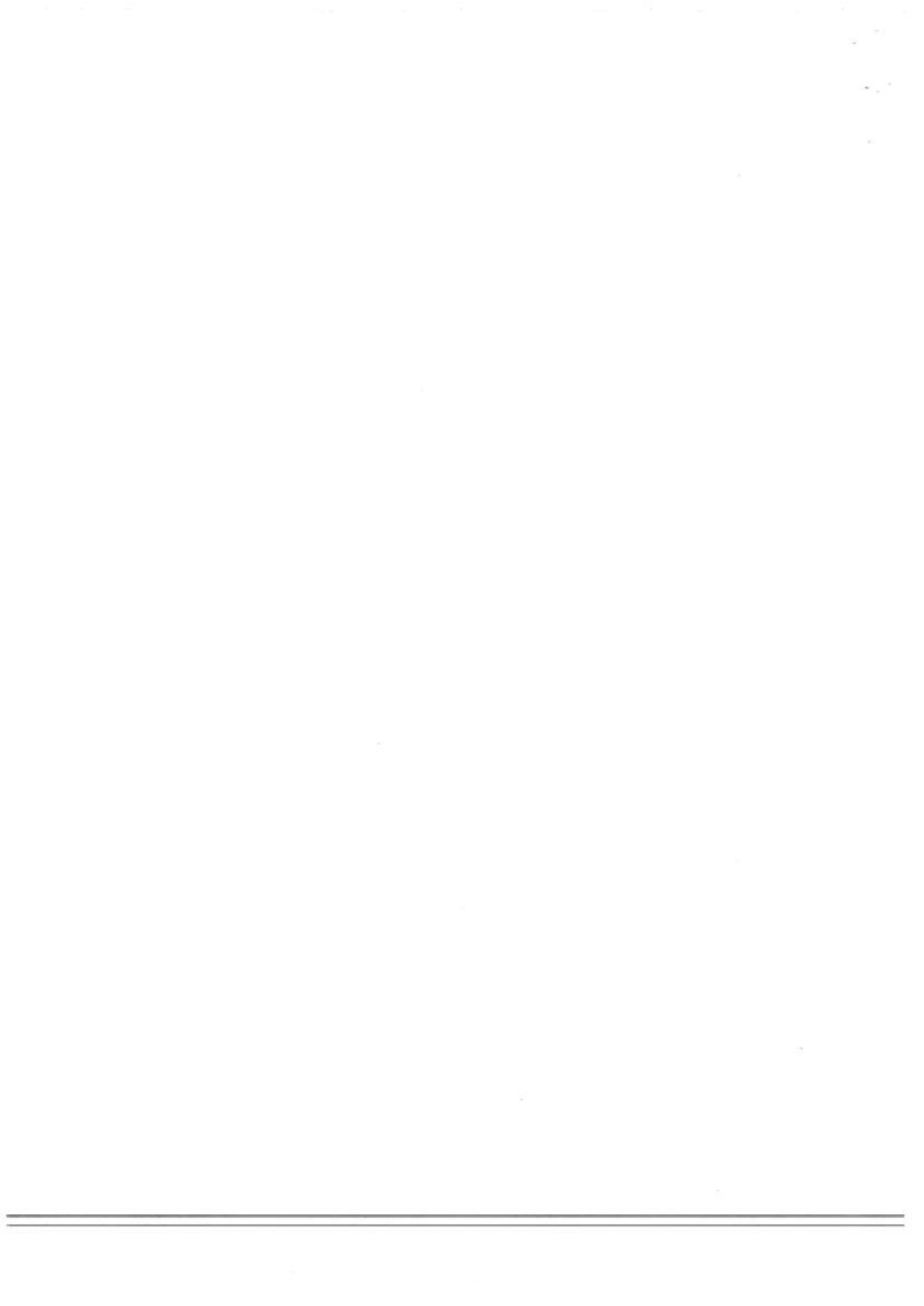
He submitted that the regulations are well crafted and was a big leap forward from the 1980 edition. He highlighted that the title should change from 2020 to 2021 plus the following clauses.

- a. Reg 18 - Recommends additional para for Defence Council (DC) to authorize the payment of such remuneration, fees, allowances or compensation. He also recommends that the Committee should instead be referred to as 'board'. As this is a key decision- making organ given that a Committee makes recommendation for higher authority to consider.
- b. Reg 36 - Recommends additional para for Defence Council (DC) to authorize the payment of such remuneration, fees, allowances or compensation. He also recommends that the Committee should instead be referred to as 'board'. As this is a key decision- making organ given that a Committee makes recommendation for higher authority to consider.
- c. Reg 44 - The senior officer submitted that the MPLO is in effect the CEO of the secretariat and services both committees and is important for the operationalization of the regulations. He recommended proper support of the office of the MPLO in terms of manpower, office space and office equipment.

2. True North

TN submitted that the regulations were annulled for because of being charged to consolidated fund and for providing for the two committees without a legal basis and hoped that the new regulations would not suffer a similar fate. Below are the specific clauses;

- a. Reg 2 as read with reg 46 - The two clauses when read together remove the option for officers and service members the right to choose to either be paid pension/gratuity under the outgoing regulations, as reg 2 as



drafted will lock out application of incoming regs to claims made after promulgation of the new regulations.

- b. Reg 6 as read with section 244 KDFA – Submits that the denial of pension by stating that the same is not an absolute right is discriminatory and erroneous and Defence Council has no duty or right to deny anyone pension or gratuity.
- c. Reg 12- On the demise of retired officer/serviceman/woman, pension should continue to be paid to widow/widower till death and to offspring up to the age of 25 years.
- d. Reg 19(1)(a) and (b) – Inelegantly drafted.
- e. Reg 42 - Ensure that the timeline of 90 days for payment of pensions and gratuities days set out in reg 45 is adhered to hence important to add value propositions to be made by DC to ensure efficiency.
- f. Schedule Part E - Only mentions two psychiatric conditions yet PTSD requires special mention because of its prevalence.
- g. Reg 47 - Submitted that the regulations should provide for periodic reviews such as existed in the 1980 and 2017 regulations.

3. ANARK

- a. Reg 2 - The association ponders as to the rationale of having 1 July 1978 as commencement date and suggests the expansion of members to include those who served in the British forces.
- b. Reg 10 – Submitted that the reg be rephrased to read: “A pension payable to an officer or service member shall be adjusted regularly at every pay review cycle and should never fall between fifteen thousand shillings per month.”
- c. Reg 12 - Limitation of 5 years should be amended for payment of widow or widower’s pension and to be paid for life.
- d. Reg 15,16 and 17 - DC wields too much power and lacks jurisdiction to deny pension for subversive activities, ambit of courts of law, violates arts. 41, 57 Constitution and sec 244 KDFA.



- e. Reg 29 (7) – Submitted that the title should specify that misconduct is by persons with disabilities and also specify the meaning of “third party”.
- f. Reg 31 – Recommended that the provision either be deleted or specify circumstances under which pension and gratuity may be suspended or withheld by the Defence Council.
- g. Reg 36 - Rephrase to remove the word “lie”.
- h. Reg 37 – Revise to disengender the text.
- i. Reg 40 - The allowance should be defined.
- j. Reg 45 - Officers and svc members are to be retained on full salary and allowances until pension is paid in full. Delay shall earn interest.
- k. Submitted that pension should be payable based on the One Rank One Pension (OROP) principle such that Retirees in one band earn same pension regardless of time and future enhancements of rates of pension to automatically pass on to past pensioners. In our view, this may be considered in future.
- l. Submitted that the military ought to go the contributory pension way similar to the public service which is at various stages of making pension contributory. Idea should be studied so members can enjoy enhanced pension that is more flexible.

4. *Joseph Awuoth (representing KDF Veterans)*

The group submitted that the good management of KDF officers/svcmen/women post retirement is a major morale factor for the active personnel as improper handling would undermine national security. The aspects of the regulations presented in the memoranda are the following:

- a. Reg 6 - Pension is a constitutional and social protection right hence power of Defence Council is arbitrary. DC has no duty or right to deny anyone pension or gratuity.



- b. Reg 7 - Provision is oppressive to retired personnel, curtails their personal development, and is contrary to the right of dual citizenship provided in the constitution.
- c. Reg 10 – Submitted that there was a massive disparity with the cost of living which infringes Art 57 of the Constitution.
- d. Reg 12 – submitted that the payment of widow/widower’s pension should be for life as social protection measure.
- e. Reg 15, 16 and 17 - Pensioners likely to suffer more economic misery. Stoppage of pension contrary to the bill of rights. Pension has no bearing with punitive control by former employer.
- f. Reg 20 – On disability pension, it was submitted that disability pension has not been reviewed over the years and DC cannot deliberate on issues regarding retirees.
- g. Reg 31 – Submitted that DC should not manage over retirees pension as they are no longer subject to KDFA.
- h. Reg 40 – Figure of Kshs. 20,000 should be reviewed upwards and management left to SRC. DC should leave this to insurance schemes to cover disabilities.

Resolutions

- a. *Reg 2 - No amendment as reg 2 as read with reg 3 address the concern. Every regulatory framework must have an applicable period. Has existed since 1980 when regs were first passed. Those who served in the British forces are catered for.*
- b. *Reg 7 - Pension is earned by virtue of prior military service. The military is a unique institution.*
- c. *Reg 10 - No amendment as pension is determined by the base salary at the date of retirement and may not be reviewed during the pay review cycle.*



- d. Reg 12 - No amendment as this has deep financial Implications which were declined by Treasury.
- e. Reg 15,16 and 17 - Pension is non – contributory. If engaged in subversive activities against the government, pension may be denied.
- f. Reg 18 – New para 18(4) added to read “The Defence Council shall authorize the payment of adequate compensation to members of the Pension Assessment Committee.” In addition, it’s not possible to change from “committee” to” board” given that the provision for “committee” is already in the K DFA.
- g. Reg 19(1)(a) and (b) – Redrafted.
- h. Reg 20 – Defence Council is properly clothed under the law to determine on various issues regarding retirees hence no amendment. Treasury was not agreeable on increasing the amount payable to disabled retirees besides what was determined as per reg 22.
- i. Reg 29 and 29(7) - Both amended and a definition of “third party” added in reg 2.
- j. Reg 31 - Circumstances under which pension may be denied are specified in arts 15 and 17.
- k. Reg 36 – New para 36(6) added to read “The Defence Council shall authorize the payment of adequate compensation to members of the Pension Appeals Committees.” Also rephrased to remove the word “lie”.
- l. Reg 37 – Text revised in order to disengender it as much as possible.
- m. New reg 42(f) added to read “the payment of adequate compensation to members of the Pension Assessment and Pension Appeals Committees.”
- n. Reg 40 – ALA is already defined in the interpretation section. In addition, the regs have gone way beyond SRC circulars that provide only for in-service assisted allowance. Also, KDF has a compensation policy and scheme for disabilities arising from service.



- o. Reg 44 – New para 44(2) added to read “The Military Pensions Liaison Officer is to be logistically supported with adequate manpower, office space and equipment to enhance effectiveness and efficiency.”*
- p. Reg 45 - An added financial implication that would be declined by Treasury.*
- q. Reg 2 and 46 - No amendment as clauses are okay as drafted. Misconceived, pension is determined by base salary at point of retirement/exit. Amendments made are not meant to alter computed pension.*
- r. Reg 6 as read with Section 244 KDFA - No amendment as pension is non – contributory. In most organizations with contributory pension schemes, summary dismissal does not earn you any pension, only what has been contributed by the employee.*
- s. Reg 42 - Amended. New para 42(g) that reads; “the procedures and processes to achieve efficiency and effectiveness in the administration of claims.”*
- t. Reg 47 – Amended and added new reg 47 (2) that reads “These Regulations shall be reviewed after every 10 years upon commencement.”*

New reg 47(3) reads “Notwithstanding the above, these Regulations may be reviewed before the period of 10 years as may be considered necessary.”

New reg 47(4) reads “The operation of these Regulations beyond 10 years may only be extended once and for a maximum period of 12 months.”
- u. Schedule Part E - Part E amended and added para 54 to include the prescription, “including Post traumatic stress disorder.....”*

Benefits of the Proposed Regulations

The draft regulations will operationalize and provide a mechanism for the overall administration of pension and gratuities in the Kenya Defence Forces.

The regulations will not only streamline operations at the Pensions office and enhance efficiency but will also serve to motivate active service personnel, boost morale and strengthen performance. The regulations will also help improve the lives of retired personnel, dependants and disabled service personnel.

This will have direct interlinkages with enhanced national security goals.

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Conclusion

In this regard, the Ministry has adhered to all the constitutional and statutory prerequisites in the development of the regulations. The approval of the regulations will have a huge benefit to service personnel and serve to enhance security.

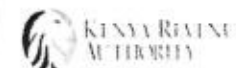

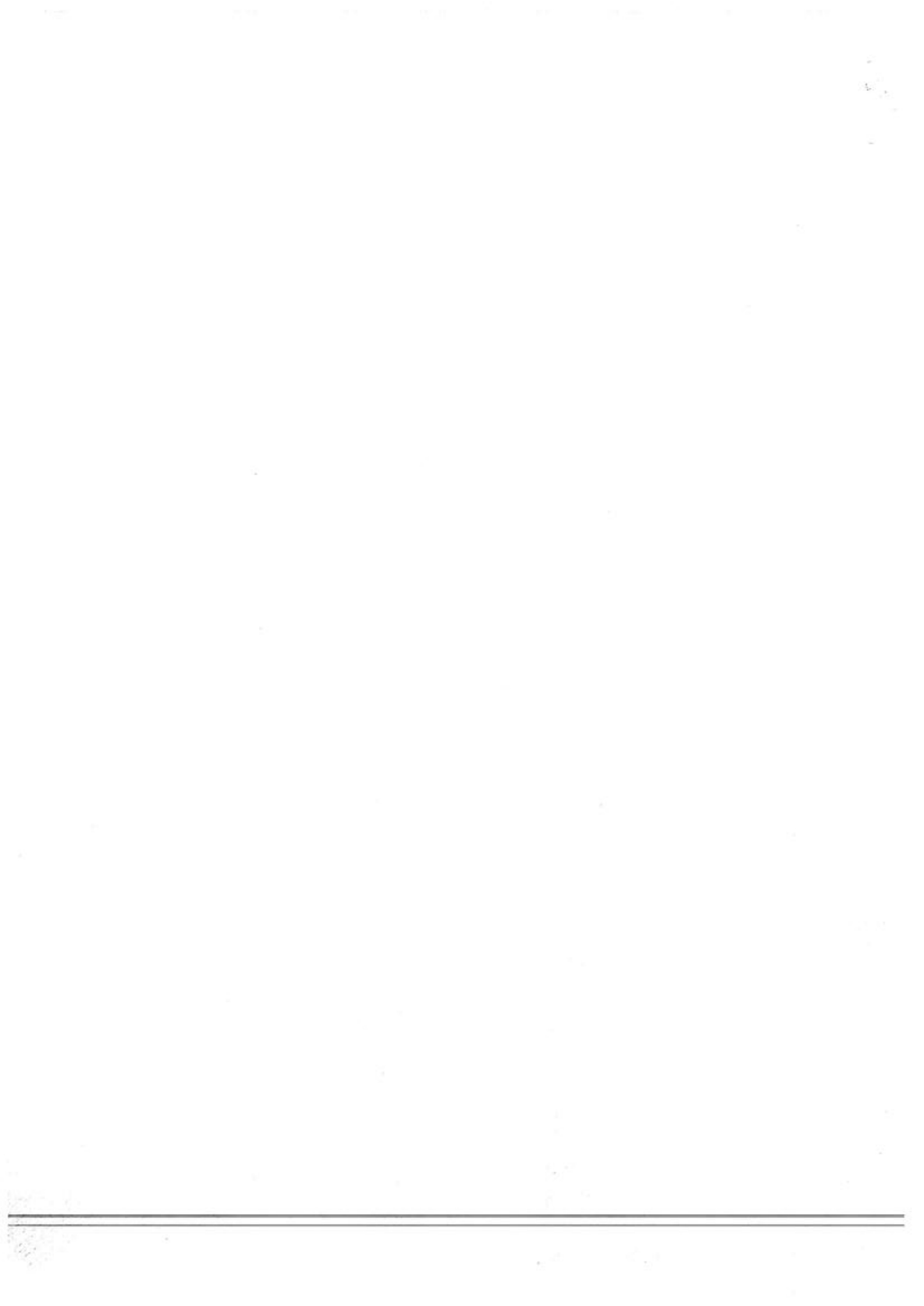

As a politician, Deby grew from a mere military commander who seized power from his erstwhile boss Hissène Habré in 1990, to manoeuvring his way to a lengthy stay in power. In 2006, Habré, who had fled to Senegal, was sentenced to life in prison by a Dakar court. Deby amended the Constitution for a third time in 2018, expanding his powers by

done away with the post of prime minister and transferring those powers to the President. Five-year presidential terms were turned to six-year terms, but Presidents were limited to two terms. However, as the law could only apply to future events, it meant Deby, who was by then in his fifth term, would continue to contest, and win, until 2033. On Monday, the country had announced him winner of April 11 elections, garnering 79.3 percent of the vote.

Yet Deby was popular mostly by crushing dissent. In this election, the Human Rights Watch said Deby had targeted his opponents, forcing most to quit. In one attack on February 28, security forces raided the home of opposition leader and presidential candidate Yaya Dillo and killed his 80-year-old mother and injured several other family

members. Officials claimed Dillo had resisted arrest.

"As many Chadians are bravely taking to the streets to peacefully call for change and respect of their basic rights, Chadian authorities have responded by crushing dissent and hopes for a fair or credible election," said Ida Sawyer, deputy Africa director at Human Rights Watch.

Deby's presidency, though was one of locking over his shoulder. He faced coup attempts, rebellions, armed terror groups and corruption.

He responded by crushing critics. In 2005, after removing term limits from the constitution, Deby ran an election largely boycotted by opponents the follow-

ing year. He won by a landslide and celebrated that by adopting the name Itno from his local ethnic group.

He had seen the first multiparty election in 1996 (having been in power since taking over in a coup in 1990). Yet the polls were also marred with irregularities. Subsequent polls in 2001 and 2006 followed the same pattern.

Deby's rise was also a case of cronyism and nepotism.

He has said in the past that he joined the army to protect his community at a time factions were fighting in the country. But he became one of Habré's trusted lieutenants, helping him secure power in a 1983 coup.

Their relationship, however, started to sour towards the end of 1980s when he was accused of plotting to depose Habré.

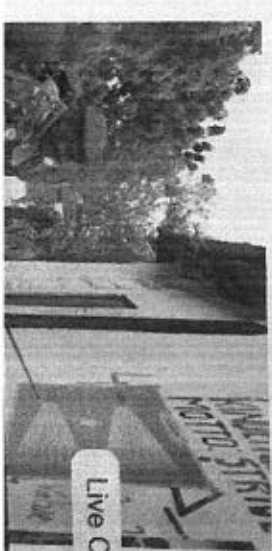

ANARK Welfare Association was started by a group of retired military officers in October 2011, who gathered in response to the death of a retired senior military officer whose family appealed to his “military family” to accord him a decent burial. His pension could barely afford him a decent standard of living commensurate to his rank. The Association was registered in 2013 under the Societies Act and is headquartered in Nakuru, with a membership from across the country. Members are retired officers and service members, their spouses and widows of deceased military personnel. Officers who gathered at the sad event described above mooted the idea of forming a welfare organization to respond to each other in times of distress. It is also through this event that the ANARK rallying and enduring motto to “be your brother’s/sister’s keeper” was born and still thrives in all our activities to this day. ANARK is apolitical and draws membership across the rank and file of retired Kenya Defence Forces personnel. Currently we have 76 registered members. Accordingly, ANARK is an interested stakeholder and feels obligated to contribute to the call for public participation in the KDF Draft Bill on Pensions and Gratuities Regulations 2021.

Preamble

The Kenya Defence Forces is mandated as one of the security organs under Article 241 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010. Article 260 of that constitution has defined “Public Service”, which definition places the Kenya Defence Forces as an entity in the public service and therefore subject to the Pensions Act Cap 189 and the Pensions Increase Act Cap 190 (all revised 2012) of the Laws of Kenya. Consequently, retired officers and service members enjoy pensions and other allowances payable under these legislations. Pensions and other awards enjoyed so far, should not be varied to the detriment of the recipients, rather, they should be improved.



ANARK supports the Draft Bill on Pensions and Gratuities and its timely propagation into law. The draft bill describes the true reality of where we are, and where we want to go in order to achieve a sustainable living pension package for retired officers, service members and dependants upon the demise of the pensioner.

The military occupies a unique place in society whereby its members offer their lives to secure the sanctity of the nation. In this regard, we are reminded of a statement by our first Minister for Defence, the Late James Gichuru, who described the military as 'the Nation's comprehensive insurance policy' whose premium is bound to be high and should never be claimed. The nation spends a large portion of its GDP to procure expensive military hardware, manned by skilled men and women who go to war not knowing whether they will come back to their loved ones. This has been the case since the Shifta Campaign and continues today in 'Operation Linda Inchi' in Somalia. Those who survive the vagaries of wars and retire and those who pay the ultimate price, expect the nation to take care of them and those they leave behind by providing them with a decent standard of living. It is therefore our expectation and prayer that this Draft Bill once enacted will be one of the steps towards that end.

It is in view of the above military work environment that the universal 'X' factor was introduced in calculating military pensions. There is no denying the fact that other sectors of the public service have also adopted this factor in their calculations and given it varying designations thereby denuding the value of this factor. The Pensions Committee, in advancing this Bill, should therefore endeavor to persuade other relevant organs of government, particularly parliament, the SRC and the Pensions Department of Treasury to accept the import of the Draft Bill and pass it into law

There are certain issues that are not covered in the Draft Bill that we would like the Committee to consider with a view to enriching the Bill. They include:

1. The Concept One Rank, One Pension (OROP) which is practiced in some countries and which our proposed version for adoption is attached herewith as Annexure 'A'.
2. A proposal for adoption of the contributory pensions scheme under the RBA Act No. 3 of 1997 to be in line with the development in other sectors of the public service.

In view of the foregoing, ANARK makes the following observations and recommendations:

15 and 17. Pensions may cease on bankruptcy and conviction	Pensioners have dependants who rely on the pension as the only means of livelihood. Stopping the pensions on grounds of bankruptcy and conviction would by default also punish the dependants for actions in which they bear no responsibility. These two sections (15 and 17) should be reviewed to allow the dependants to continue drawing the pensions in the same manner we have recommended in the case of death of a pensioner. Where a portion of the pension may have been withheld and the condition of bankruptcy is reversed or upon pardon from conviction, such withheld pensions shall be restored retrospectively. In the spirit Section 15 (3) of instead of giving the Defence Council that discretionary power to determine who, when and how much should be paid to the dependant, we propose that one quarter of the pension be paid automatically to the dependants of the officer or service member.
27. Supply of surgical appliances	We view this section as appropriate and a good addition for military pensioners due to their service environment.
29. Power to reduce award for misconduct	This heading should specify that the misconduct is by persons with disabilities. Amend heading "Power to reduce disability Award". Subparagraph (7) introduces the term "third party". Specify the meaning of "third party" in the interpretation section of the Bill.



31. Suspension or withholding of pensions	Section 5 of the Pensions Act Cap 189 states that pension is a right. Subparagraph (1) states "Every officer shall have an absolute right to pension and gratuity". Amend subparagraph 31 (1) of the Bill to specify under what circumstances pensions and gratuities may be suspended or withheld by the Defence Council. Otherwise this subsection should be expunged. In any case these circumstances have been covered under Sections 15 and 17.
35. Nature of award in respect of death	In the current dispensation, administration of pensions to dependants has been riddled with myriad of contestations and has become difficult to administer. We find this to be a good inclusion that comprehensively clarifies payments to a pensioner's dependants and children.
36. Pensions Appeals Committee	Rephrase subparagraph (6) particularly in the usage of the word "lie", to avoid misinterpretation.

37. Officer's service and disablement pensions	Revise this section to become gender sensitive.
PART V	
40. Assisted Living Allowance	The meaning of "Assisted Living Allowance" should be defined in the interpretation section of the Bill. Amend wording to read "...in the sum not less than Kenya shillings twenty thousand".

41. Reduction of establishment and services	Subparagraph (2) seems to be at variance with subparagraph (3). Qualify subparagraph (2) to specify the nature of duties the recalled officer or service member will perform. Amend to clarify that such duties will not include active field service and whether the recall will be on contract basis.

Payment of pension and gratuity within 90 days	Amend this section so that it resonates well with Section 16(A) and 19(A) of the Pensions Act Cap 189 of the Laws of Kenya, which states that the officer or service member shall be retained on full salary and allowances until the pension is paid in full, and that such delayed pension or gratuity shall earn interest.

CONCLUSION

In the spirit of the Pensions Act Cap 189, Laws of Kenya, pension is a right. KDF retirees are public servants and they have a right to enjoy pension along with every other retired public servant in Kenya. Reducing that right in anyway by allocating the proposed KDF Pensions Act the blanket power to vary, review and alter pensions in any way other than those specified above is denying the military pensioners an undeniable right.

This Bill by and large, seeks to improve pension and pension administration, hence will make life better for retirees. ANARK therefore, whole heartedly supports the enactment of the Bill into law.

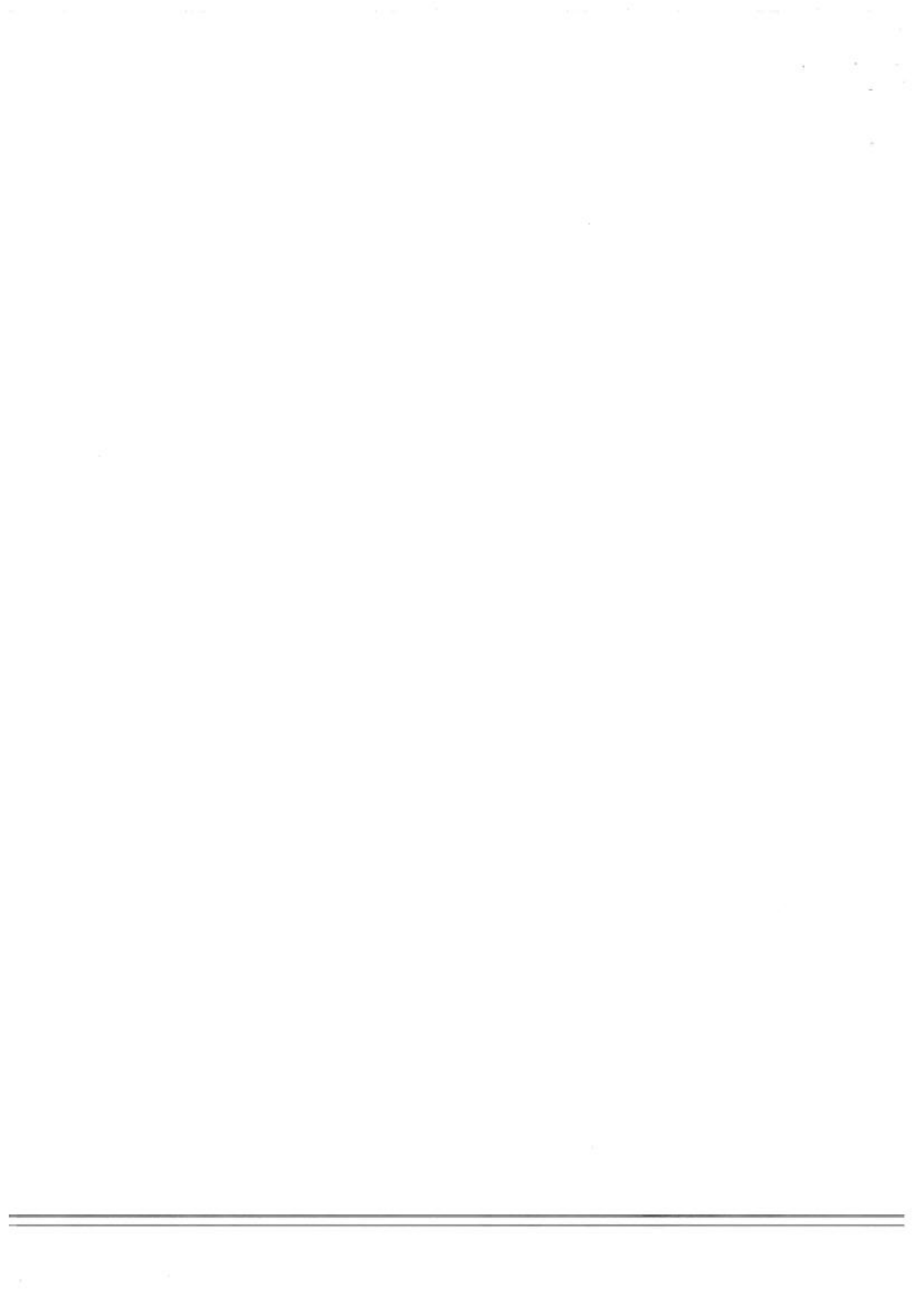
**A PROPOSAL ON HOW THE ONE RANK, ONE PENSION (OROP) CONCEPT COULD BE ADOPTED BY THE
KENYA DEFENCE FORCES**

Globally, the award and administration of military retirees' pensions poses serious challenges which are addressed in various ways unique to each dispensation. Although there are significant efforts to improve pensions in Kenya, some military retirees like every other public servant remains very poorly paid and the pension administration processes involved are tedious, frustrating and time taking leaving many of these pensioners desperate and helpless. In spite of these efforts to improve pensions in Kenya, disparity and asymmetry of the various pensions paid are increasing, causing hue and cry among the pensioners.

In the AFPRB pay review of 2003, the pension computation formula was improved, to use the factor of 1/400 in place of the previous 1/480 that continues to apply to the majority of other public servants. The principle purpose of any salaries or pensions review is to enhance good life, under circumstances of transparency and equity. With the subsequent substantial increase in salaries, members who were affected by the review of July 2003, and the subsequent reviews of 2007, 2011, and the SRC general public salaries review cycles of 2017 and 2021, military pensions have improved substantially but with immense disparities in pensions resulting in members of same rank receiving disparate pensions.

This phenomenon is not unique to Kenya, many other countries recognize this as a challenge and they seek to ensure equity in pensions by adopting various methods to streamline pensions so that members who retired at the same ranks earn as reasonably and rationally close pension as possible under the principle of "One Rank One Pension" (OROP). The philosophy underlying OROP is that retired officers of the same rank receive same pension regardless of when they retired.

It is generally argued that since the number of military retirees is continually increasing, and that the salaries, upon which the pensions are computed are increasing regularly, the bill resulting is unmanageable and fiscally unsustainable. But there is also consensus that the OROP principle and philosophy is the ideal way to address the pension disparities, and there is deliberate securitization of the philosophy and purpose to strive to achieve the principle through the best possible methods to achieve OROP as closely as possible. The methods adopted have included housing subsidization, enhanced reemployment in the public service upon retirement, medical facilitations, free transport etc. One unique effort to address the OROP challenge is in India, where all pensions are banded in periods of successive salaries reviews creating bands covering the period's interim in salary reviews.



In adopting OROP, India has put into consideration, the disparate salaries, and the ratio between pensions for one particular rank, and the commensurate salary of the same rank in service. At the time of adoption of the principle it stood at 1.7 to 1, while in civil service it stood at 0.56 to 1. The Indian Government in mid-2014, after years of protracted protests by veterans, adopted OROP, and in February 2016, issued orders to implement the scheme creating four classes or bands; - pre-1996, post-1996 to December 2005, post-January 2006 to September 2008 and post-October 2008. **The principle continued to be that retirees in one band, earn the same pension regardless of the time, in that period, the members retired and any future enhancement in the rates of pension to be automatically passed on to the past pensioners.**

In order that the asymmetries observed in the pensions of the KDF retirees may be partially but rationally addressed, OROP is a start point. **In Kenya, several bands would be recommended as follows:**

- 1. Pre-1996 (whose pension continues at the ratio of 1/480 – start by adjusting to 1/400);**
- 2. August 1996 to July 2003;**
- 3. August 2003 to July 2007,;**
- 4. August 2007 to July 2013 and**
- 5. thereafter bands correspond to the SRC salary review cycles.**

It is also recommended that as a principle and an inspiration in KDF in future, the OROP principle be adopted in the KDF Pensions Act, in addition to the administration of pension, after adoption of the formula of 1/400 in Article 10, and amend the article to include the adoption of OROP as discussed above.

Questions arising would be, which pay point in the band would be adopted. It is recommended that the bands adopt the apex of each band i.e., the highest pension worked out for this band and any future enhancement in the rates of pension to be automatically passed on to the past pensioners.

DIVERSIFICATION TO THE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS SCHEME UNDER THE RBA ACT No. 3 OF 1997

The Kenyan public service is at various stages of adopting the contributory pension scheme under the RBA Act of 1997. There are various benefits of the contributory schemes in that while the employer continues paying the obligations under the pensions act, the serving members of the public service are also allowed to contribute to the same resulting in higher contributions and hence a chance of increasing the payable pension on retirement. The members are also able to invest their pension while in service, where it can accrue best returns. They can also use pension as security, for mortgage and other loans.

Whereas KDF for apparently good reasons have not adopted the contributory pension strategy, it is proposed that the idea be studied, so that retiring military officers and service members can in future be able to enjoy a more flexible pension, like every other member of the public service.

We recommend that the possibility of establishing a KDF pension scheme in line with the RBA Act No. 3, of 1997, be studied and implemented.

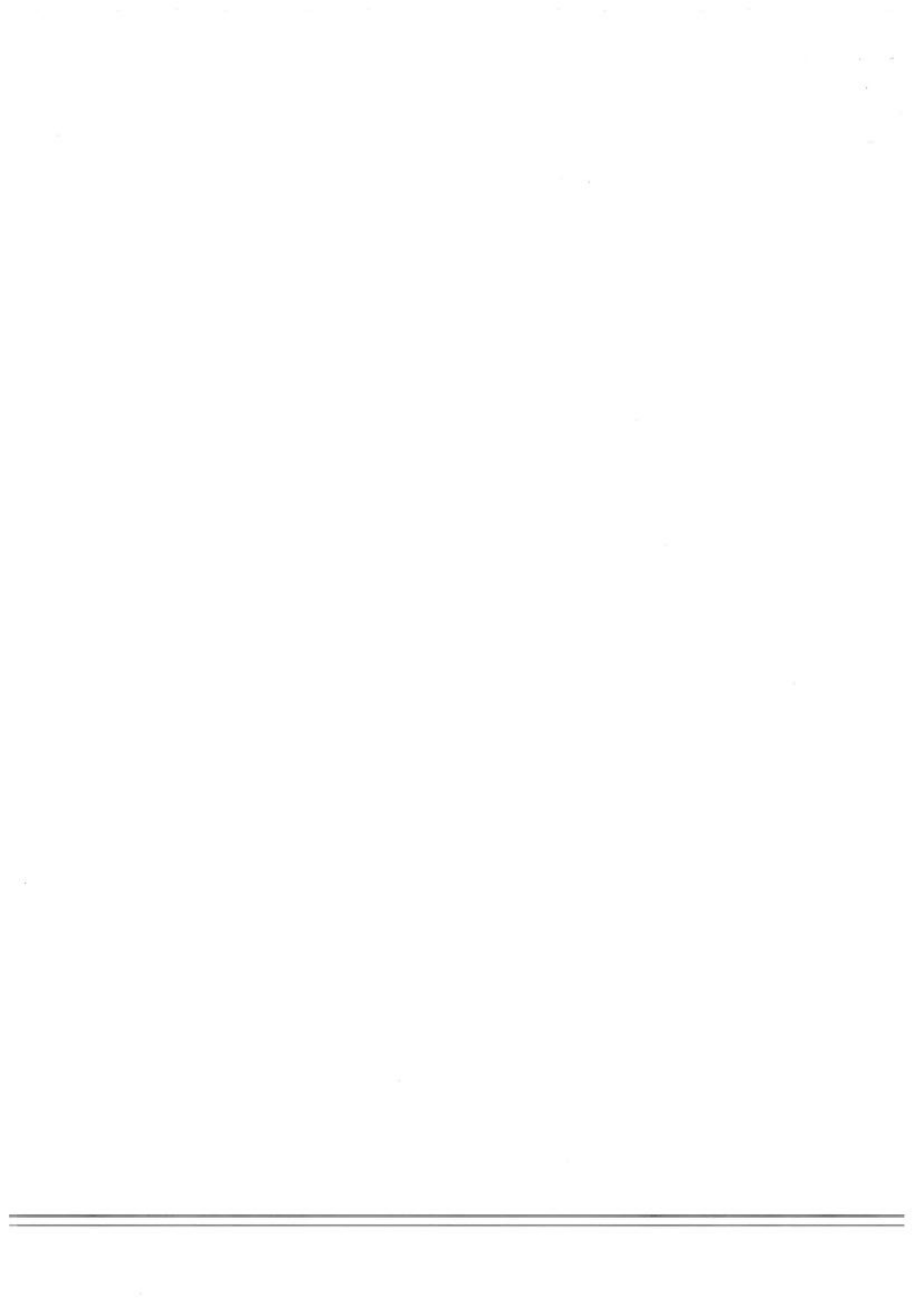
MEMORANDA ON KENYA DEFENCE FORCES (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES) (OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) REGULATIONS, 2021

INTRODUCTION

1. This memorandum is a compilation of comments, suggestions and recommendations expressed by retired KDF officers (Veterans) following the call for stakeholder and citizen participation on the KDF pension and gratuities regulations 2021.
2. Several references alluded when drawing this memorandum has been mainly from the following:
 - a. Constitution of Kenya 2010
 - b. Article 241 establishment of Defense forces and Defense Council.
 - c. The KDF Act no. 25 of 2012 section 244
 - d. The Veterans bill
 - e. Various Court Judgments and Rulings.
3. The memoranda have been divided into three parts with the first part listing several considerations coming into play when dissecting the regulations.
The second part examines some of the selected regulations in detail suggesting possible recommendations while the third lists the overall recommendations before concluding.

CONSIDERATIONS

4. The following are some of the major considerations looked at when dissecting the proposed regulations:
 - a. The good management of the officers' /service personnel post retirement is a major morale factor for the rank and file still in active service; improper handling may also undermine national security.
 - b. The ongoing KDF campaign in Somalia theatre is bound to be long drawn with the country's military commitment unlikely to end in the foreseeable future. Repeated tours of duty for some officers and service members are bound to have some negative after-effects deep into their sunset years.
 - c. The modern concept of all of government approach where KDF works hand in glove with other government agencies in a multi-agency set up to curb internal security challenges is bound to remain so moving forward. Unlike yester years, the modern soldier is perennially involved in one operation or the next. These could have undesirable comebacks to some of the officer's/Service member post retirement.
 - d. The bill of rights as enshrined in the constitution is sacrosanct, binding on all persons and state organs. It is an integral part of Kenya's democratic state and framework for social economic and cultural practices. The 21st century officer and service personnel are well versed on this and are bound to challenge any perceived infringement through the courts.



e. The veteran bill is at an advanced stage to being made into a law and only needs a slight nudge from various quarters for it to be completed.

f. Dual Citizenship is now enshrined in the constitution and with collapsed international borders, it is accepted practice for retired personnel both from the disciplined services and other sectors to be gainfully employed outside the national boundaries. This offends and infringes on articles 2,10, 12, 41 & 27 as its mainly discriminative since even serving officers and service members are routinely seconded to friendly countries abroad on full pay and allowances

g. With advances in medical science, many retirees now have longer lifespans and also generally take on second careers post retirement so as to sustain themselves and their families.

h. The existing Defense Medical Insurance Scheme (DEFMIS) and the Defense Forces Old Comrades Association (DEFOCA) continue have a very positive impact on the life of retirees.

REVIEW OF SELECTED REGULATIONS

5. These are recommendations on selected regulations.

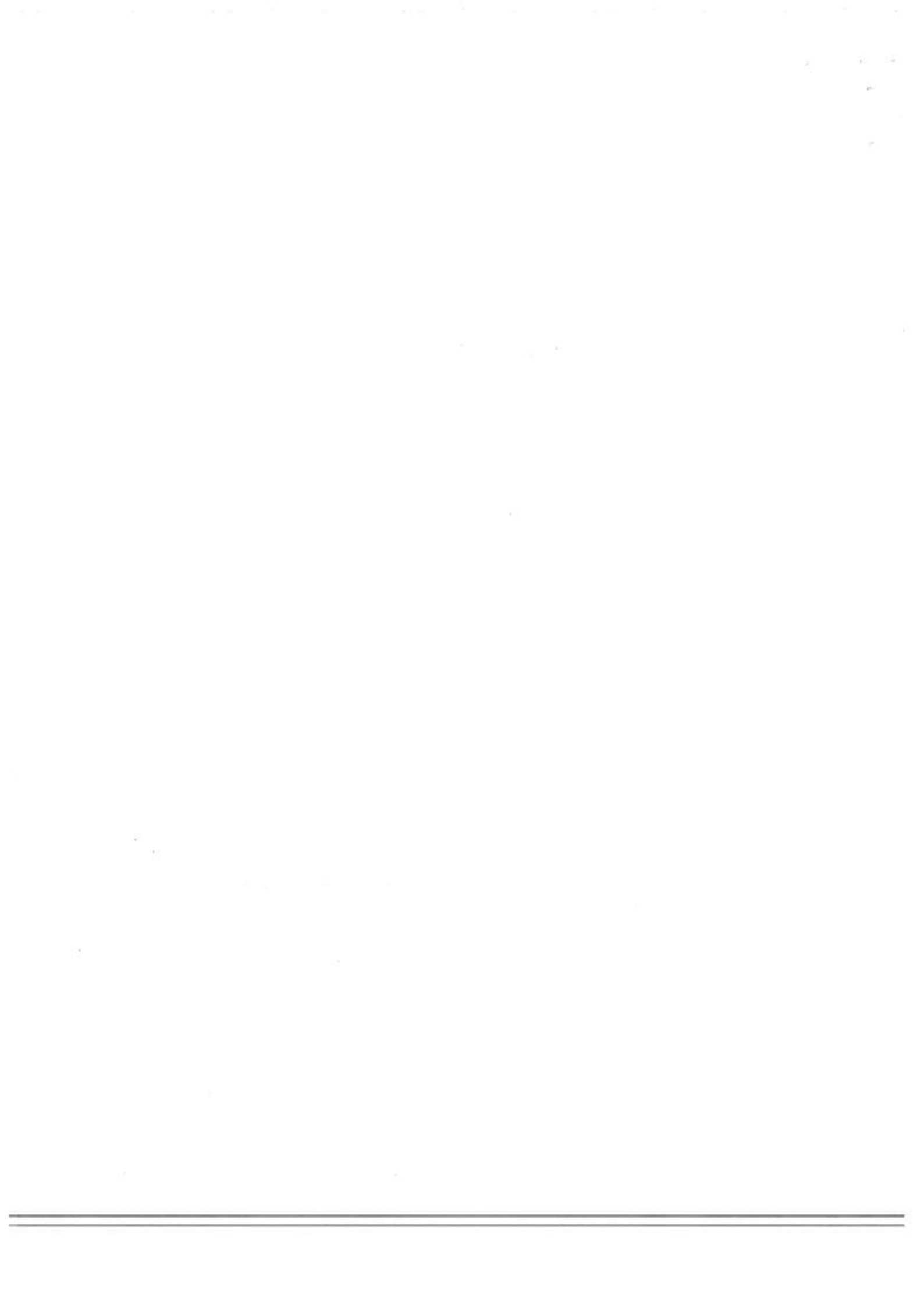
a. Pensions, etc., not a right

(1) No officer or service member shall have an absolute right to compensation for past services or to pension, gratuity or other allowance nor shall anything in these Regulations affect the right of the Defence Council to terminate the commission of any officer or the Commander to discharge or dismiss a service member at any time and without compensation except disability pension where applicable.

(2) An officer or service member sentenced to dismissal by Court Martial or Commanding Officer shall not be entitled to pension, gratuity or other allowance except disability pension where applicable.

Recommendations: Pension is a constitutional right and essential part of social protection. Further; one of the terms for employment was entitlement to pension. Nowhere in the statutes or Constitution is Pension for KDF personnel denied. It would be futile to negate on such. The Defence Council or anyone has NO Jurisdiction to deny any one who qualifies for Pension or gratuity as the case may be.

b. **Suspension of pension on employment by a foreign power** -If a retired officer or discharged service member enters the service of a foreign power without the consent of the Defence Council, or he continues in such service after the consent previously granted is withdrawn, his service pension or other allowances granted under these Regulations may be



suspended or withheld for such period as the Defence Council, with the concurrence of the National Treasury, may determine.

Recommendation: *As pointed out in the considerations, dual citizenship is enshrined in the constitution and employment beyond the national boundaries is now accepted practice. This regulation is deemed oppressive to retired officers and service personnel and curtails on their personal development while also running contrary to the constitutional bill of rights. The regulation also seems to doubt the patriotism of the retired officer and service member. It's also discriminatory contrary to article 27 of the Constitution in that serving members are not subject to the same yet they are seconded or even directly sent for duty on full pay and allowances beyond the national borders.*

c. Computation of pension

- (1) Every pension granted to an officer or service member in accordance with these Regulations shall be assessed at the annual rate of one four hundredth of his pay for each completed month of his reckonable service.
- (2) A pension payable to an officer or service member shall not be less than fifteen thousand shillings per month:
Provided that a pension granted to an officer or service member under these regulations shall not exceed the highest pensionable emoluments drawn by him at any time in the course of his service in the Kenya Defence Forces.
- (3) Any officer or service member who is entitled to a pension under these Regulations shall commute up to one-quarter of that annual pension at the equivalent of twenty times the amount of the annual pension commuted.

Recommendation: *Presently there is a massive disparity on the pension payments for officers'/Service members. This is attributed to the failure of timely adjusting of the pension in line with the cost of living. This infringes on article 57 on older members of society (above 60 years of age), that requires the state to take measures to ensure the rights of older persons to fully participate in the affairs of society, pursue their personal development, live in dignity and respect and be free from abuse and receive reasonable care and assistance from their family and State.*



d. Pension to dependants of an officer or a service member

- (1) Subject to these regulations, in the case of the death of an officer or a service member or a retired officer or discharged service member there shall be continued to be paid a dependant's pension, in addition to the grant made under regulation 13, on the terms and subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (3), to the widow or widower or the children of the officer or service member for a period of five years next following the officer's or service member's death at the rate of the officer's or service member's pension on the date of his death.
- (2) Where a widow or a widower to whom a dependant's pension has been granted under this regulation dies or otherwise ceases to be entitled to a dependant's pension, the child or children who are entitled in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in paragraph (3), to a dependant's pension shall be entitled in accordance with these terms and conditions to receive the dependants' pension for the remainder of the period of 5 years from the date of the officer's or service member's death, which is still outstanding at the date when the widow or widower dies.
- (3) For the purposes of paragraph (1) a dependant's pension under these regulations shall be paid on the following terms and subject to the following conditions—
- (4) where the deceased officer or service member leaves a widow or a widower whether or not he or she also leaves a child, for so long as he or she is alive shall be entitled to receive the whole of the dependant's pension at the appropriate rate provided for under paragraph (1);
- (5) where the deceased officer or service member does not leave a widow or a widower, or within the period of five years during which the dependants' pension is payable under this regulation the deceased officer's or service member's widow or widower dies, any child of the deceased officer or service member who is entitled at the appropriate date to receive the dependants' pension shall be entitled to receive, and if more than one child, in equal shares, the dependants' pension at the appropriate rate provided for under paragraph (1);
- (6) a dependant's pension or a share thereof shall only be payable to a child up to the age of 24 years including during the time that the child is receiving full time education at university, college, school or other educational institution approved by the Committee for the purposes of this regulation;
- (7) where the deceased officer or service member leaves more than one widow then the dependants' pension shall be shared equally among them and in the event of any one of them dying or otherwise ceasing under any of the



provisions of this regulation to be entitled to a share of the dependants' pension, then the pension shall be paid to the child or shared equally among the children of the dead widow and in the case the dead widow leaves no child or children then the pension shall be paid to the remaining widow or shared equally among the remaining widows accordingly;

- (8) No dependants' pension or share thereof shall be payable at any time after the fifth anniversary of the officer's or service member's death. The dependant's pension shall be paid irrespective of the cause of the circumstances of the officer's or service member's death.

Recommendation: on the demise of the retired officer or service member, Pension should continue to be paid to the widow/widower until natural death. It should also continue to be paid to the offspring up to 25 years of age. This should be harmonised with Cap 201 and 206 Laws of Kenya.

e. Pension to cease on bankruptcy

(1) Subject to paragraph (3), where an officer or service member to whom a pension has been granted under these Regulations is adjudicated bankrupt judgement of a competent court the pension shall cease as from the date of adjudication or declaration.

(2) Where an officer or service member qualifies for a pension under these Regulations and is adjudicated bankrupt by a judgement of a competent court—

- i. After qualifying, he may be granted a pension or gratuity, but the pension shall cease as at the date of adjudication or declaration, or the gratuity shall not become payable, as the case may be; or
- ii. Before qualifying and at the date of qualifying he has not obtained his discharge from the bankruptcy, he may be granted a pension or gratuity, but the pension shall cease from the date of qualifying or the gratuity shall not become payable, as the case may be.

Recommendation:

- a. It is no crime to be bankrupt; Bankruptcy is more likely to occur to retirees due to poor pension and lack of employment which most of retirees are subjected to after leaving the service. Retirees should never be subjected to more economic misery though stoppage of pensions due to bankruptcy declarations. Stoppage of pension would therefore be contrary to the Bill of Rights and the Constitution at large. A hefty pension if anything will ensure no bankruptcy takes place.***

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b. Pension is payment for past services and should bear no relation to Bankruptcy post retirement and should bear no punitive control from the former employer

f. Pension may cease for subversive activities, etc

Where the Defence Council is **satisfied** that an officer or service member to whom a pension has been granted under these Regulations—

(1) has shown himself by act or speech to be disloyal or disaffected or

(2) has failed to fulfil to the Republic of Kenya; his commitment 112 & 113 pension rights and procedure, articles (2) on the supremacy of the Constitution; article 10 on the principles of governance; article 12 on entitlements of citizens; articles 19 – 22 on the Rights and fundamental freedoms, application of the bill of rights, Implementation of rights and fundamental freedoms and enforcement of the bill of rights; articles 24 limitation of rights; article 28 on human dignity; article 41 (1) (2) (a) & (b) on right to fair labour practices and remuneration; article 43 on rights on economic and social rights; article 47 on fair administrative action; article 57 on rights of older members of society; article 236 on protection of public officers; article 238 on principles of national security; article 239 on national security organs and

(3) Has committed any criminal offence for which he is convicted and sentenced to a term of imprisonment; or

has engaged in activities which are subversive within the meaning of Chapter VII of the Penal Code (Cap. 63), it may direct that the pension granted to the officer or service member shall cease from a specified date: Provided that the Defence Council, with the concurrence of the National while taking cognizance of existing statutes like cap 206, cap 201 Laws of Kenya that have never been complied with as a result of these statutes being plucked from the statute books and not available to the public and KDF in particular. This is contrary to article 2, 10 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 pension to or for the benefit of his wife or husband, children or other dependants and may at any time after his pardon or release from prison restore the pension.

g. Pension may cease on conviction.

(1) Where an officer or service member to whom pension, gratuity or other allowance has been granted under these regulations is sentenced to a term of imprisonment by a competent court for any criminal offence, such pension, gratuity or allowance shall cease if the Defence Council so directs with effect from such date as the Defence Council shall determine.



(2) Where after retirement an officer or service member is sentenced to a term of imprisonment by a competent court for any criminal offence and in the circumstances in which he is eligible for pension, gratuity or some other allowance under these regulations, but before that pension, gratuity or some other allowance is granted then—

- i. paragraph (1) shall apply in respect of any pension, gratuity or allowance which may be granted to him; and
- ii. the Defence Council may direct that any pension, gratuity or allowance which has been paid to such an officer may not be paid. Where pension, gratuity or any other allowance ceases by reason of this regulation, it shall be lawful for the Defence Council to direct all or any part of the money to which such officer or service member was entitled by way of pension, gratuity or any other allowance to be paid to or for the benefit of his wife or husband, children or other dependants as provided for in these regulations and such money shall be paid and applied accordingly.

(3) Where an officer or service member whose pension, gratuity or any other allowance has ceased under this regulation, subsequently receives pardon from the President his pension, gratuity or other allowance shall be restored to him from the date of the pardon.

Recommendations:

- a. *Pension is for past service.*
- b. *A decision on possible subversive activities should be in the ambit of the courts of law and treasury. The defence council should not be involved in the management of the pension.*
- c. *Pension is a basic human right and not a privilege. The Defence Council has no Jurisdiction to deny it.*
- d. *The regulation cannot purport to amend the constitution at articles 41, 57 and the KDF Act no. 25 of 2012 section 244. Section 244 particularly addresses dismissed KDF personnel, in that it does not in any way deny one a Pension, but requires that it can be withheld, reduced or suspended but with the concurrence of the Public Service Commission, this proviso does not in any way deny one a pension.*
- e. *Dismissal is a major punishment in itself as allowed in law, however loss of benefits like pension is not provided for as part of sentence, allowing both amounts to double jeopardy or double punishment for the same offence, which is illegal.*

h. Establishment of the Pensions Assessment Committee

i. Entitlement to disability pension



Recommendation-

- a. The disability pension has remained constant and has not been timely reviewed during the years.*
- b. The Defence Council operates under the Defence Act and it is subordinate to the Courts of Law, hence it cannot assume powers of the Courts through deliberating on issues regarding retirees who are no longer subject to the Defence Act.*

j. Suspension or withholding of pensions

- (1) The Defence Council shall have the power to suspend or withhold pensions or gratuities either wholly or in part as the case may be, and subject to any other regulations made under this Act or generally relating to pensions.
- (2) In exceptional cases payment of part or the whole of suspended pensions, gratuity or any other allowance, may with the consent of the Treasury be made by the Defence Council to or for the benefit of the wife or other dependant of the officer or service member.

Recommendation:

- a. The defence council should not manage the pensions of retired officers' /service personnel. The control over the retired officers' /service personnel ceases on retirement.*
- b. The Defence Council is subordinate to Parliament and the Courts; hence they cannot deliberate on issues regarding retirees who are no longer subject to the Defence Act, once they become senior citizens beyond Reserve liability.*
- c. There is no proviso in the Act setting up this body. Membership of the Defence Council is as setup in the article 241 of the constitution and there is no proviso of enlarging its membership.*

17. An officer or service member who is deaf or blind or physically disabled and uses a wheel chair or has suffered disablement due to diseases or surgical conditions or psychiatric conditions contemplated in Part D and E of the Schedule to these Regulations shall be entitled to award of Assisted Living Allowance in the sum of Kenya shillings twenty thousand (Kshs 20,000.00) payable on a monthly basis to cater for expenses of assisted living.



Recommendation-

- a. Assisted living has not been well spelt out. The figure of Ksh. 20,000 mentioned to be paid monthly seems arbitrary. The cost of assisted living in the country is high and ranges between 75 thousand shillings and one hundred and fifty thousand shillings monthly which changes each year due to inflation and economic conditions. The listed figure need to be reviewed upwards, and the management left to Salaries and Remunerations Commission.*
- b. The Defence Council is within powers to set up insurance scheme or policies to cover such disabilities. The services of Professional Actuarial assessors should be hired always in the assessment of payables for injuries and disabilities suffered while in service*

OVERALL RECOMMENDATIONS

7. The draft memorandum lacks depth and was apparently made failing to take consideration of the changing times. The following are the overall comments:

- a. Whereas, the good management of veteran affairs is a major morale factor to personnel in active service. At present, there is no established body authorized to represent Veterans in all their affairs in the Country. This draft too has not attempted to address on the improvement of retirees Pension. Retirees' issues will only be effectively handled by a constitutional Office which is yet to enacted. It is strongly recommended that the DHQ push for enactment of Veterans Bill now still pending before Parliament and or harmonizing it with Caps 201 and 206 Laws of Kenya.*
- b. Defence Forces Old Comrades association (DEFOCA) is commended for continued good effort; the major drawback is that the entity has failed to embrace fully the entire veteran community. It is recommended that an oversight team consisting of Veterans be considered at national level to supplement the effort of the branch representatives.*
- c. Defence Forces Medical Insurance Scheme (DEFMIS) is also registered to be doing a splendid job. It is noted that the veteran community who are directly affected by this entity has no representation or having a say in the strategic direction and formulation of DEFMIS. It is recommended that this is reviewed and regional branches set up manned by veterans who can act as appropriate oversight authority over the same.*
- d. The current disparity on disability has not been addressed for correction. Despite frequent price increase of medication, the disability pension has never been reviewed.*
- e. The concerned offices at KDF work hand in hand with the appropriate offices to ensure that the Veterans Bill sails through and becomes law.*



Conclusion

8. The KDF Veteran community is grateful for the goodwill from the former employer as espoused by the timely payments of pension and the appointments of veterans in the Government top offices, parastatals and absorption in other national security agencies.

This draft repeal Regulations 2021 edition has been well crafted, and thus spawned some great leap forward from the current Regulations 1980 edition, and thus snugly nestles in the year 2021. However, I just wish to input a few simple comments/observations/suggestions for your esteemed consideration as follows:-

The title of the Regulations indicates the year 2021, whereas at Part 1, Preliminary, Citation indicates the year 2020. Should these years be rationalized to both read the year 2021?

Under Regulation 18 and Regulation 36, a paragraph could be added to each to indicate authorization by the Defence Council for both the Assessment Committee and the Appeals Committee Chairpersons and Members to be paid such remuneration, fees, allowances and such other reimbursements as may be approved by the Defence Council. In addition, these are the decision making organs under these repealed Regulations 2021. In my view they should have the title of "Boards" rather than "Committees". Committees are, in general, organs that make recommendations for a higher authority to consider for approval, whereas Boards are usually final decision making bodies (See Regulation 36, Paragraph 12, regarding the Appeals Committee).

The Military Pensions Liaison Officer at Regulation 44 is a very critical officer in the operationalization of these Regulations 2021. In effect, he or she is a "Chief Executive Officer (CEO)". Hence, this Office should be properly supported in the provision of adequate manpower, office space and office equipment. The effectiveness of both the Assessment Committee and the Appeals Committee heavily relies on this Liaison Office. The Office assists both Committees Secretaries in assembling the necessary documents for all the Meetings, and in facilitating retired officers, discharged service members and dependants to travel and appear before the Committees as required. It also acts full time as the "Customer Care Centre" on matters pension for retired officers, discharged Service members and dependants.

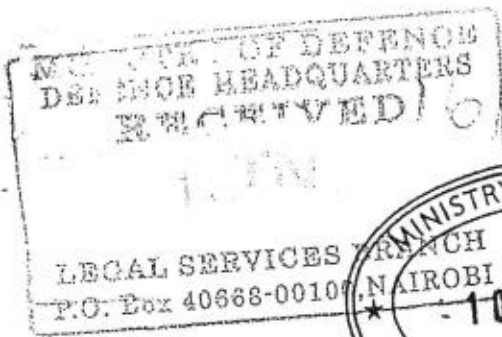

SUBJECT: **MEMORANDUM BEARING VIEWS ON THE DRAFT KENYA DEFENCE FORCES (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES) (OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) REGULATIONS, 2021**

Introduction

1. The True North Society is registered under the Societies Act Laws of Kenya. Its principal objectives are:
 - a) To enrich the lives of armed security personnel and their families by improving their mental and behavioural health.
 - b) To leverage technology innovations in the service delivery of mental and behavioural health care services.

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- c) To build a network of circles of care which support armed security personnel and their families in all of life's spheres.
- d) Non-political and non-profit making

The True North Society draws its membership from the armed security forces.

2. By notice published in the Ministry of Defence website <https://mod.go.ke/>, public views and memoranda were invited regarding draft regulations by the Defence Council titled the KENYA DEFENCE FORCES (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES) (OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) REGULATIONS 2021. These are hereinafter referred to as the 'Draft Regulations' or 'Regulations' as the context allows.
3. The Regulations relate to matters of pensions and gratuities for officers and service members of the Kenya Defence Forces, which matters are important to the members of True North Society and well within its objectives. The True North Society, therefore, by means of this memorandum wishes to raise for consideration various issues regarding the Regulations with hope that they will be taken into account before the final draft regulations are presented to the National Assembly.

The current regulations

4. The current operating regulations are the Armed Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service members) Regulations, 1980 (L.N. 61/1980) (hereinafter referred to as 'current regulations' or the '1980 Regulations'). These regulations have been revised a number of times over the years through various legal notices.
5. An overhaul of the 1980 regulations was attempted through the Kenya Defence Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service members) Regulations, 2017 (hereinafter referred to as the 'annulled regulations' or the '2017 Regulations'). The 2017 regulations sought to revoke the 1980 regulations and bring the regulation of pensions for the armed forces in line with the Kenya Defence Forces Act (No. 25 of 2012). The 2017 regulations were, however, annulled by

Parliament for reasons, among others, that they did not conform with the Constitution of Kenya 2010 by wrongly providing for pension and related benefits as a charge on the Consolidated Fund and for wrongly creating the Pensions Board and Pensions Appeals Board which were not recognised under the Kenya Defence Forces Act. In the draft regulations, under Regulation 4, it is now provided that pensions, gratuities and other allowances may be granted by the Defence Council with the concurrence of the National Treasury, without stating that the same shall be a charge on the Consolidated as had earlier been stated in the 2017 regulations. Additionally, Regulations 18 and 36 establish the Pensions Assessment Committee and the Pensions Appeals Committee, respectively, which conform with section 304 (1) (aa) of the Kenya Defence Forces Act.

6. The result of the annulment of the 2017 Regulations is that the system of military pensions and gratuities is saddled with the 1980 regulations with all their myriad practical and legal shortfalls. It is then hoped that, with contributions such as are contained in this memorandum, the newly proposed regulations will not suffer the fate of the 2017 regulations and that there will be reprieve in the eventual promulgation of modern, practical and legally compliant regulations that address the pressing pensions and gratuities' needs of the officers and service members.
7. Herebelow, then are some of the matters provided for in the Regulations that the True North Society wishes to highlight for consideration.

The operative starting date

8. Regulation 2 provides that the Regulations '...shall apply to all claims arising after the 1st July, 1978..' and '..provided that no additional benefits shall accrue to service personnel by virtue of the amendments herein'. This proviso does not appear in the 1980 regulations nor the 2017 annulled regulations.

9. This proviso is extended to Regulation 46 which provides that an officer entitled to a pension, gratuity or allowance under the current 1980 Regulations (to be revoked) shall be deemed to be entitled under the new Regulations '...provided that no additional benefits shall accrue to service personnel by virtue of the amendments..' in the new Regulations. It is noteworthy that the current 1980 Regulations gave the option for officers and service members entitled under the out-going regulations the option to choose to be paid their pension, gratuity or allowance under the out-going regulations.

10. Whereas it is conceivable that concluded awards and decisions made under the current regulations should not be reopened under the new regulations under the principal that laws should generally not apply retroactively, Regulation 2 as drafted will lock out the application of the new regulations to claims made after, but relating to retirement, disablement or death arising before, promulgation of the new regulations.

Pension as a right

11. Regulation 6 is titled 'Pension etc not a right'. This regulation expressly states that 'No officer or service member shall have an absolute right to compensation for past services or to pension, gratuity or other allowance...' The reason for this definitive statement is not easily discernible even though what immediately follows the denial of the notion of right may be indicative of the purpose to be served- that '...nor shall anything in these Regulations affect the right of the Defence Council to terminate the commission of any officer or the Commander to discharge or dismiss a service member at any time and without compensation except disability pension where applicable.' Further that an 'officer or service member sentenced to dismissal by Court Martial or Commanding Officer shall not be entitled to pension, gratuity or other allowance except disability pension where applicable.' It would appear the reason for stating that pension and other related benefits are not an absolute right is to disabuse the notion that those whose services are terminated without

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compensation have residual right of pension and other related benefits. The only exception provided is disability pension.

12. Section 244 of the Kenya Defence Forces Act that provides for pensions and gratuities for officers and service members proceeds to say that upon dismissal of an officer or service member under the Act, his pension or gratuity benefits may be withheld, reduced or suspended by the Defence Council with the concurrence of the Public Service Commission. There does not seem to be express provisions under the Act for denial of pensions and related benefits as punishment for offences or as a consequence of termination of commission or dismissal. Donation of this blank power to the Defence Council appears unanchored and arbitrary. In any event, it should not be left to regulations to exceed the contemplation of the Act by providing for further punishment which the Parent Act did not expressly provide.

13. The general principle under Regulation 6 that pensions and related benefits are not a right finds expression in the following:

- a) Regulation 7 provides for suspension of pension and related benefits on employment by a foreign power
- b) Regulation 16 provides that pension may cease for subversive activities, which are listed as when the officer or service member has: shown by act or speech to be disloyal or disaffected towards the Republic of Kenya; unlawfully traded or communicated with the enemy or been engaged or associated with any business carried on in a manner to assist an enemy during war; failed to fulfil his commitments concerning the reserve; is convicted and sentenced to a term of imprisonment; engaged in subversive activities as set out in the Chapter VII of the Penal Code (Treason and Allied Offences).
- c) Regulation 17 provides that pension and related benefits may cease when an officer or service member is sentenced to a term of imprisonment. The Defence Council is allowed to direct all or any part of the pension, gratuity or any other

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allowance to be paid to or for the benefit of his wife or husband, children or other dependants. It may also be restored upon Presidential pardon.

- d) Regulation 29 provides that: pension may be reduced where a retired officer or discharged service member unreasonably neglects, or refuses to be medically examined as required by the Pensions Assessment Committee, or; a temporary disability allowance suspended if he unreasonably neglects or refuses to present himself to be medically examined as required, or; gratuity, disability pension or temporary disability pension may be reduced, not exceeding one-half, if he unreasonably refuses or neglects to receive approved treatment or approved institutional treatment, or; award of disability pension, gratuity or temporary disability allowance may be reduced where the disablement is attributable to negligence or misconduct on the part of the retired officer or discharged service member, or; pension, gratuity or allowances may be reduced where a compensation is paid by a third party responsible for act, omission or circumstances causing injury or death of an officer of service member.
- e) Regulation 30 provides that an award may be reviewed, by variation cancellation or substitution, if it is made in error or obtained by improper means.
- f) Regulation 31 provides that the Defence Council has powers to suspend or withhold pensions or gratuities wholly or in part, and may, in exceptional cases, make payment of part or whole of suspended pensions, gratuity or allowance to the wife or other dependant.
- g) Regulation 41 provides that pension of a retired officer or discharged service member ceases when he is recommissioned or re-enlisted, and he will repay or have deducted any pension received to allow previous service to count.

Procedural

14. Regulation 6 of the Draft Regulations contrasts with the Pensions Act governing pensions and gratuities for public officers whose section 6 is titled 'Pensions as of right' and states in subsection (1) that 'Every Officer shall have an absolute right to pension and gratuity'. The denial of pension as of right must therefore be peculiar to the Kenya Defence Forces. It is discriminatory.

Pension for service personnel is not compensatory as such so it cannot be an absolute



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15. This peculiarity of constricted right to pension for the Kenya Defence Forces mirrors, but does not find support in, the Constitution of Kenya 2010 which under Article 24 provides for limitation of fundamental rights and freedoms 'only to the extent that the limitation is reasonable and justifiable in an open and democratic society based on human dignity, equality and freedom...'. This protection is taken away under Article 24 (5) for persons serving in the Kenya Defence Forces or the National Police Service by providing that legislation may limit application to them of fundamental rights and freedoms relating to privacy, freedom of association, assembly, demonstration, picketing and petition, labour relations, economic and social rights and rights of arrested. It is noteworthy that this provision applies to 'persons serving' in the KDF, and to extend the same limitations after officers and service members have left the service of the KDF is not contemplated in the constitution.

16. The constriction of rights and freedoms for persons serving in the Kenya Defence Forces are acknowledged as necessary. This constriction should, however, not be extended to pension, gratuities, allowances and other benefits to be enjoyed once the persons have ceased being members of the military. This is beside the case that can be made for a military veterans' law that caters for other needs of retired officers and discharged services members post-military.

17. It is proposed here that, like for other public officers, the Regulations should state categorically that pension and related benefits are a right. And again, just like for other public officers, the denial of pension should be limited only to conviction and sentence to a term of imprisonment as provided under Regulation 17, such that various other limitations listed under paragraph 13 of this memorandum above should be removed. It is particularly erroneous to give unlimited and discretionary power as is donated under Regulation 31 for the Defence Council to withhold or suspend pension and gratuities for no specified reasons.

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Inadequate provisions

18. Apart from the above-noted regulations that entrench the principle that pension and related benefits are not available as a right to retired officers and service members, other regulations make inadequate provisions in view of the needs of retired officers and discharged service members:

a) Under the Schedule to the Regulations Part E thereof provides for assessment of disability on account of Psychiatric Conditions and lists two conditions, namely, Chronic neurotic condition and Chronic Psychotic condition. A major condition affecting officers and service members is Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. While PTSD may be classified as a form of neurotic condition, its prevalence calls for specific mention, for instance that the Schedule may read 'Chronic neurotic condition, including Post Traumatic Stress Disorder'. Part of the challenges of retired officers and discharged service members involve lack of mental wellness arising from service that may need attention by way of counselling and other psychosocial interventions and rehabilitation. Provision should be made for psychological trauma such as would be caused by sexual assault or that does not amount to insanity but significantly affects the individual in a way not accounted for by the Schedule.

b) The administration of claims for pension, gratuities and allowances is inefficient. Though Regulation 45 provides for payment of pension or gratuity within 90 days of retirement or death of an officer or service member except where there is delay due to legal proceedings, there is no provision for recourse that ensures this timeline is not defeated further. To guard against inadequacy in internal mechanism such as in medical boards, recording of injury reports, rehabilitation and recovery support, incidences of AWOL, resignations and desertions as well as corruption in processing benefits, it is proposed that Regulation 42 that empowers the Defence Council to issue administrative directions be expanded to include value propositions such as providing that the directions shall not only be issued for administration of the Regulations but that it shall be with a view to achieve efficiency, care and integrity in the administration of claims and conform with the principle of fair administrative action.

c) Periodic review of pensions has been removed from the Regulations. It was provided for under the 1980 Regulations (Reg. 28A to be done 'from time to time') and under the annulled 2017 Regulations (Reg. 31, to be done within a maximum of four years). Equally Cost of Living Allowance was removed from the Regulations. It was provided for under the 1980 Regulations (Reg. 29) and under the annulled 2017 Regulations (Reg. 33). This allowed for increase of the awarded pensions, gratuities and allowances to account for increase in cost of living that is constantly published by the government. Periodic review of pensions should be specifically provided for to mandate and require the Defence Council to ensure that the pension system does not become obsolete due to vagaries of time and inflation, by stating a period for such review to be for a period not exceeding, say five (5) years. Additionally, the Cost of Living Allowance should be provided for in the manner suggested in the 2017 regulations.

d) Regulation 12 as read together with Regulation 35 limit the payment of pensions to dependants of deceased retired officer or discharged service member to five years and up to the age of 24 years for children. Service in the military is such that it takes a toll, material and otherwise, on immediate families of the officers and service members. Quite often, the officers and service members are sole breadwinners for families. Additionally, many retire with young families still requiring care particularly in terms of education. It is proposed that the limitation of payment of pension for a period of five years be removed so that with respect to the widow/er payment will continue so long as he or she is alive and up to 24 years for the case of children.

Corrections to be made

19. Under Regulation 19 (1) after (a) and (b) it is provided '... and may award pension for permanent disablement and additional hardship allowance in accordance with regulations 22 and 23' which, as drafted, is inelegant and confusing as it does not appear to be applicable to both preceding sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) as it should, and not just for sub-paragraph (b). Corrections should be made accordingly.




20. The Armed Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service Members) Regulations, 1980 (L.N.61/1980) have not been specifically revoked. Aside from the 'Savings' provisions of Regulation 45, there is need for a specific clause stating that 'The Armed Forces (Pensions and Gratuities) (Officers and Service Members) Regulations, 1980 (L.N.61/1980) are revoked'.

Conclusion

21. We trust that our above views and observations shall be taken into account in the preparation for eventual promulgation of the KENYA DEFENCE FORCES (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES) (OFFICERS AND SERVICE MEMBERS) REGULATIONS, 2021. We owe it to our retired officers and discharged service members to put in place a system of administration of pensions, gratuities and allowances that is fair, humane and meets their modern needs.



- a. You recommend the amendment of reg 42 to ensure that the timeline of 90 days for payment of pensions and gratuities days set out in reg 45 is adhered to.
Action: Reg 42(f) added to read "the procedures and processes to achieve efficiency and effectiveness in the administration of claims."
- b. You recommend amendment to Schedule Part E because PTSD requires special mention owing to its prevalence
Action: Part E para 54 amended to include the prescription, "including Post traumatic stress disorder....."
- c. You note that reg 2 and reg 46 when read together remove the option for officers and service members the right to choose to either be paid pension/gratuity under the outgoing regulations.
No action: No amendment as pension is determined by base salary at point of retirement/exit. Amendments made should not alter computed pension.
- d. You note that reg 4 does not state that pension is to be a charge on the consolidated fund
No action: You can't charge pension to CF through regs. Sec 244 K DFA also addresses this concern. Pension to be paid same way salaries are paid without such a provision in K DFA.
- e. You recommended removal of reg 6 as Defence Council has no duty or right to deny anyone pension or gratuity
Action: Pension is non – contributory.



- f. You recommend limitation of 5 years in reg 12 be amended for payment of widow or widower's pension and to be paid for life.

No action: This has financial Implications and Treasury declined.

- g. You recommend redrafting of Reg 19(1)(a) and (b)

Action: Redrafted.

- h. You recommend periodic reviews and cost of living allowance to be reinstated as existed in 1980 and 2017 regs.

Action: Amendment done and periodic reviews clause integrated. Changes for cost of living allowance declined by Treasury. To be revisited in the next review.

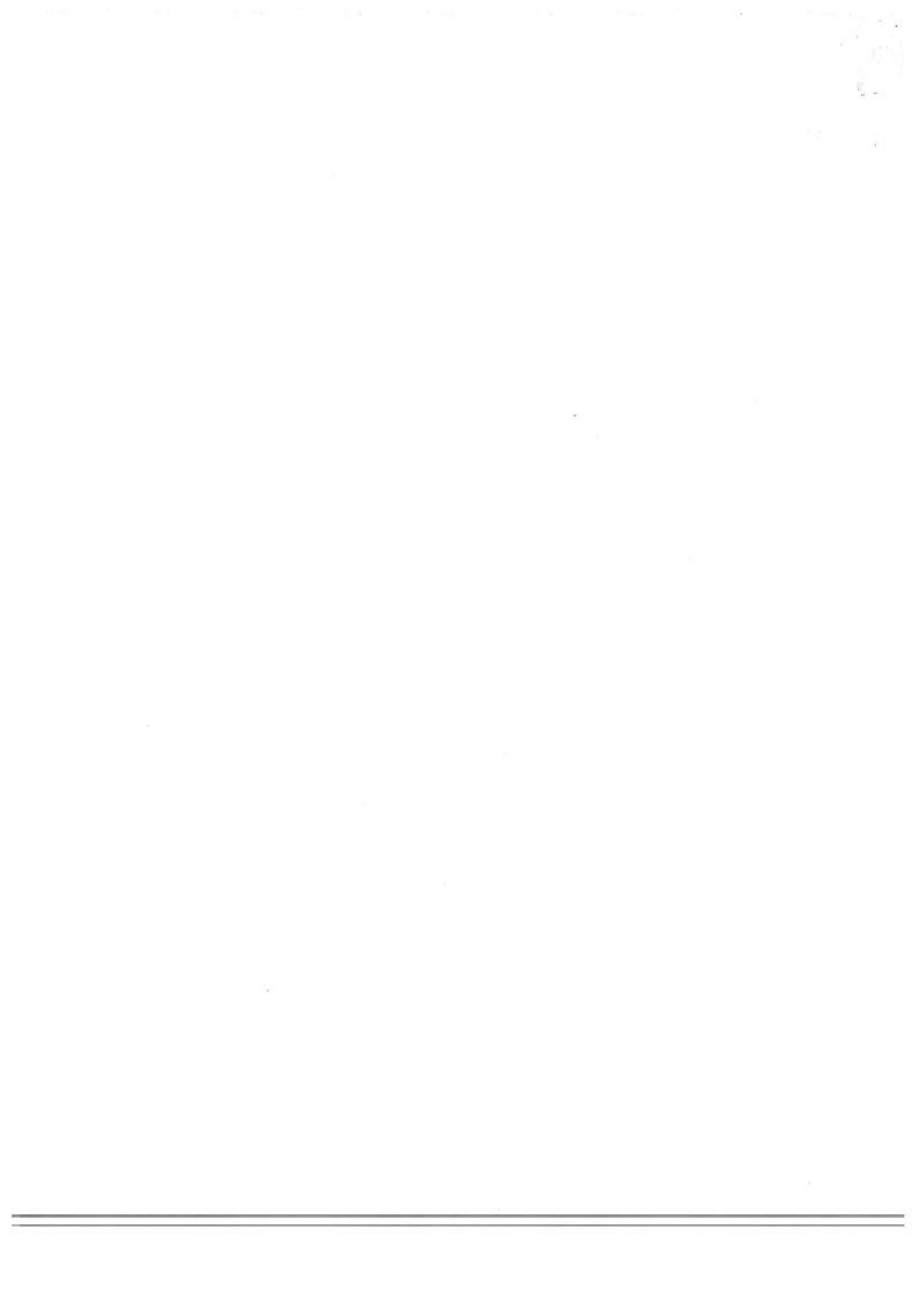

a. You recommend removal of reg 6 as Defence Council has no duty or right to deny anyone pension or gratuity.

No action: *Pension is non – contributory.*

b. You recommend the removal of reg 7 as provision is oppressive to retired personnel, curtails their personal development, and is contrary to the right of dual citizenship provided in the constitution.

No action: *No amendment because pension is earned by virtue of prior military service. The military is a unique institution.*

c. You recommend to relook reg 10 because of massive disparity between pension paid and cost of living.

No Action: *No amendment because pension is determined by the base salary at the date of retirement and may not be reviewed during the pay review cycle. Treasury declined. To be considered in the next review cycle.*

d. You recommend limitation of 5 years in reg 12 be amended for payment of widow or widower's pension and to be paid for life.

No action: *This has financial Implications and Treasury declined.*

e. You recommend amendment of regs 15, 17 and 31 as Defence Council lacks jurisdiction to deny pension for bankruptcy, conviction and subversive activities.

No action: *Note that pension is non – contributory and military is a unique environment. Subversive activities may lead to denial of pension.*

f. You recommend additional clause at reg 20 for review of disability pension as this

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has not been reviewed over the years.

No action: *Declined for now by Treasury because of financial implication.*

g. You recommend the review of reg 40 for Assisted Living Allowance and management left to SRC or insurance schemes to cover disabilities.

No action: *No amendment. The regs have gone way beyond SRC circular that provide only for in-service assisted living allowance. KDF has a compensation policy that insures for disabilities arising from service.*


