### CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Sports and Culture during the approval hearings of Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke, nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Sports and Arts and Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir, nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Culture and Heritage as requested by H.E. the President and communicated to the House by the Speaker on Thursday, 3rd November 2022.

Pursuant to Article 155(3) (b) of the Constitution, Section 5 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act (No. 33 of 2011) and the S.O 45 (1) through a letter dated 2nd November 2022, H.E. the President notified the National Assembly of the nomination of fifty-51 (51) Principal Secretaries to various State Departments vide a letter dated 2nd November, 2022. The Hon Speaker vide a communication made on Thursday, 3rd November 2022 conveyed to the House the Message from H.E. the President and subsequently referred the names of the nominees, curricula vitae, and the report of the Selection panel on their recruitment to the Departmental Committees for approval hearings. While referring the matter to the Committees, the Speaker directed that the Committees undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominees and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearings by Friday, 4th November 2022.

In compliance with Article 118 (b) of the Constitution and section 6 (4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 4th November 2022 informing the public of the nomination, date, time and place of the approval hearing. He also invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominees in conformity with section 6 (9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The memoranda were to be received on or before Friday, 11th November 2022 at 5.00 p.m. (East African Time). At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum for or against the nominee's suitability.

The Clerk of the National Assembly also wrote to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) seeking references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee.

The nominees appeared before the Committee on Wednesday, 30<sup>th</sup> November 2022 for approval hearings. The Committee examined their suitability based on the criteria set out in Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). In addition, the Committee examined their academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on leadership and integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominees; any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question and suitability of the nominees for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the State Departments.

# Committee Recommendation

The Committee having held approval hearings of the nominees regarding their suitability, observed that due process was followed on the recruitment process as provided for under Article 155(3) (b) of the Constitution and the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval Act) (No. 33 of 2011). The Committee therefore recommends that the National Assembly APPROVES the nomination of Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Sports and Arts and Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir, for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Culture and Heritage.

### CHAPTER ONE

### 1 PREFACE

# 1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

- 1. The Departmental Committee on Sports and Culture is one of the twenty Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under Standing Order 216 whose mandates pursuant to the Standing Order 216 (5) are as follows:
  - a) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned Ministries and departments;
  - b) study the programme and policy objectives of Ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
  - ba) on a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;
  - c) study and review all legislation referred to it;
  - d) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the Ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
  - e) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned Ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
  - f) vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments)
  - fa) examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
  - g) make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
  - h) consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
  - i) examine any questions raised by Members on a matters within its mandate.

# 1.2 Subjects under the Committee

- 2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider the following subjects:- Sports; Culture; Language; Creative Economy including promotion of music; Arts; Film promotion and Development; National Heritage and Betting & Lotteries.
- 3. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the State Department for Sports and the Arts in the Ministry of Youth, Sports and the Arts and State Department for Culture and Heritage in the Ministry of Tourism, Wildlife and Heritage.

# CHAPTER TWO

# 2 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

# 2.1 Legal Framework

- 6. Article 155 of the Constitution provides that:
  - 155. (1) There is established the office of Principal Secretary, which is an office in the public service.

(2) Each State department shall be under the administration of a Principal Secretary.

- (3) The President shall-
  - (a) nominate a person for appointment as Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and
  - (b) with the approval of the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries.

(4) The President may re-assign a Principal Secretary.

- (5) A Principal Secretary may resign from office by giving notice, in writing, to the President.
- 7. In light of this, H.E. the President nominated 51 persons for appointment as Principal Secretaries to various State Departments. The President nominated the following persons for appointment as Principal Secretaries for Sports and Arts and Culture and Heritage:

Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke: Nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, Sports

and the Arts; and

- ii. Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir: Nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, Culture and Heritage.
- 8. The Departmental Committee on Sports and Culture has been assigned the role of conducting the vetting of the aforesaid nominees.
- 9. The following Articles of the Constitution statutes/provisions were paramount to the Committee as it executed this mandate:

i. The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011);

- ii. The Public Service Act (No. 10 of 2017) on recommendation for appointment of Principal Secretaries;
- iii. Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;

iv. Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;

v. Article 77 of the Constitution on restriction on activities of State Officers;

vi. Article 78 of the Constitution on Dual Citizenships;

- vii. Article 118 of the Constitution on Public Participation;
- viii. Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;

ix. The Leadership and Integrity Act (Cap. 182);

x. The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015); and

xi. The Public Officer Ethics Act (Cap. 183).

The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011)

- 10. Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides for issues which the relevant House of Parliament (in this case, the National Assembly) is supposed to consider in relation to any nomination. These issues include:
  - i. the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
  - ii. any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and

- iii. the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.
- 11. During the approval hearing, Section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) provides important point, viz:
  - i. An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background (section 6(7), PAPAA);
  - ii. The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate (section 6(8), PAPAA);
  - iii. Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated (section 6(9), PAPAA); and
  - iv. A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall end (section 6(10), PAPAA).

# The Public Service Act (No. 10 of 2017)

- 12. Section 47 (2) of the Public Service Act (No. 10 of 2017) provides qualifications that one must have so as to be eligible for appointment as a Principal Secretary. These are:
  - i. be a citizen of Kenya;
  - ii. hold a degree from a university recognised in Kenya;
  - iii. has at least ten (10) years relevant professional experience, five (5) years of which should have been in a leadership position or at a top management level in the public service or private sector;
  - iv. possess general knowledge of the organisation and functions of Government;
  - v. demonstrates an understanding of the goals, policies and developmental objectives of the nation;
  - vi. has demonstrable leadership and management capacity including knowledge of financial management and strategic people management; and
  - vii. meets requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

# Article 10(2) of the Constitution on national values and principles of governance

13. Article 10(2) of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which include patriotism, national unity, sharing and devolution of power, the rule of law, democracy and participation of the people; human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality, human rights, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalised; good governance, integrity, transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

# Chapter 6 of the Constitution (Leadership and Integrity)

- 14. There are important provisions in Chapter 6 of the Constitution worth pointing out. Article 73 of the Constitution provides that the authority assigned to a State officer (a Principal Secretary being a state officer under Article 260 of the Constitution) is a public trust to be exercised in accordance to the Constitution, demonstrate respect for the people, bring honour to the nation and dignity to the office and promote public confidence in the integrity of the office. Also, the State officer shall have the responsibility to serve the people, rather than the power to rule them.
- 15. The guiding principles of leadership and integrity are listed as selection based on personal integrity, competence and suitability, objectivity and impartiality in decision making, selfless service based solely on the public interest, accountability and discipline and commitment in service to the people.

Article 77 of the Constitution (Restriction on activities of State officers)

16. Article 77 of the Constitution provides that a full-time State officer shall not participate in any other gainful employment and that any appointed State officer shall not hold office in a political party.

Article 78 of the Constitution on citizenship and leadership

17. Article 78 of the Constitution states that a person is not eligible for election or appointment to a State office unless the person is a citizen of Kenya. It also provides that a State officer or a member of the defence forces shall not hold sual citizenship.

# Article 118 of the Constitution on public access and participation

18. Article 118 of the Constitution provides that:

1. Parliament shall:

- a) conduct its business in an open manner, and its sittings and those of its committees shall be in public; and
- b) facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of Parliament and its committees.
- 2. Parliament may not exclude the public, or any media, from any sitting unless in exceptional circumstances the relevant Speaker has determined that there are justifiable reasons for the exclusion.

Article 232 of the Constitution on Values and Principles of Public Service

19. Article 232 of the Constitution provides for the values and principles of public service which include high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women; the members of all ethnic groups; and persons with disabilities.

The Leadership and Integrity Act (Cap. 182)

20. The Leadership and Integrity Act provides a number of obligations to a state officer. These are, among others: to respect and abide by the Constitution and the law, public trust, performance of duties in an honest and accountable manner, professionalism, financial integrity, not to engage in activities that amount to abuse of office, not misuse public resources, accepting gifts that may compromise the officer's duties, wrongful or unlawful acquisition of property, conflict of interest e.t.c.

The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act

21. Section 5 of the Public Service (Values and Principles) Act provides that a public officer shall maintain high standards of professional ethics, including, being honest; displaying high standards of integrity, transparency, accountability, respect to others, objectivity, patriotism, observance of rule of law. (Applies in future upon appointment)

The Public Officer Ethics Act (Cap 183)

22. The Public Officer Ethics Act provides for obligations to be carried out by a public officer. These include professionalism, carrying out duties in accordance with the law, prohibition from unjust enrichment, avoiding conflict of interest, not using office as a venue for soliciting or collecting

harambees; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, not practicing nepotism or favouritism, giving impartial advice, conducting private affairs in a way that maintains public confidence, bar from sexual harassment, submission of declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years (section 26). (Applies in future after appointment)

# 2.2 Qualifications for appointment as Principal Secretary

23. In conducting the Approval Hearing, the Committee was guided by Article 155 (3) (b) of the Constitution, Section 47(2) of the Public Service Act and the provisions of Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).

# 2.3 Message from H.E. the President

24. H.E. the President on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022 communicated the names of the 51 nominees for appointment to the positions of Principal Secretaries including the Principal Secretaries for State Department for Sports and Arts and State Department for Culture and Heritage to the Speaker for approval by the National Assembly pursuant to Article 155 (3). The Speaker in his communication from the Chair issued on Tuesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2022 and pursuant to Standing Order No. 42 referred the names to the Departmental Committees to conduct approval hearings and report within twenty-eight (28) days.

# 2.4 Speaker's Communication and Committal to the Committee

- 25. Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 42, the Speaker of the National Assembly on Tuesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2022 communicated to the House the message from H.E. the President regarding the nominees for appointment as Principal Secretaries for the State Departments for Sports and Arts and State Department for Culture and Heritage. The Speaker informed the House that H.E. the President was seeking approval of the National Assembly on the said nominations before the nominees' appointment.
- 26. In accordance with Standing Order 45(1), the Speaker read the Message from H.E. the President and referred the names of the nominees, their curricula vitae and report of the Selection Panel on the recruitment process to the Departmental Committees to conduct approval hearings.
- 27. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominees and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearings by Friday, 4th November 2022.
- 28. In addition, the Speaker directed that approval hearings should commence on Monday, 14th November 2022 and end on Friday, 18th November 2022. Thereafter, the reports should be tabled in the House not later than Tuesday, 22nd November 2022 so as to enable the House to consider the reports within the statutory timelines.
- 29. However, on 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the Employment and Labour Relations Court in Constitution Petition No. E186 of 2022, Dr. Magare Gikenyi Versus the President of the Republic of Kenya and 55 others and in Constitution Petition No. E192 of 2022 Law Society of Kenya Versus the National

Assembly and 4 others granted ex-parte conservatory orders temporarily staying the vetting process. Consequently, on 16<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the Speaker directed that the vetting process be suspended pending the outcome of the judicial process. In a ruling delivered on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the court dismissed the petitions paving way for resumption of the vetting process. Consequently, the Speaker directed that all Departmental Committees expeditiously conclude the vetting process and report to the House by the end of the Morning Session of Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> December, 2022.

# 2.5 Notification to the Public

- 30. Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".
- 31. The Clerk of the National Assembly on Friday, 4th November 2022 placed a notification in the print media informing the general public of the intention of the Committee to conduct approval hearings, as provided for by Article 118 (1) (a) (b) and (2) of the Constitution and Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), which allows public participation in committee proceedings. The notification gave provision for the submission of memoranda, by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees, by Friday, 11th November 2022 at 5.00 pm (East African Time). At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum for or against the suitability of the nominees.

# 2.6 Notification to the Nominee

- 32. The Clerk of the National Assembly vide an advert placed in the print media on Friday, 4th November 2022 and letters Ref. NA/DDC/SC/2022/001 and Ref. NA/DDC/SC/2022/002 informed the nominees of the nomination by H.E. the President and requested them to appear for vetting by the Departmental Committee on Sports and Culture on Thursday, 17th November 2022 in Committee Room 9, Main Parliament Building. The Clerk of the National Assembly further requested the nominees to bring with them their clearance certificates from the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP).
- 33. Following the *ex-parte* orders by the Employment & Relations Court temporarily staying the vetting process and the subsequent dismissal of the same by the Courts on Tuesday, 29<sup>th</sup> November 2022, the nominees were notified to appear before the Committee for approval hearings on Wednesday, 30<sup>th</sup> November 2022.

# 2.7 Clearance Requirements

34. The Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) and Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) requesting for tax, education loans, integrity, affiliation to political parties and criminal record status of the nominees. The following institutions wrote back to the National Assembly clearing the nominees,

KRA (letter Ref. KRA/5/1002/5(8179) dated 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2022); DCI (letter Ref. DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.XI/208 dated 10<sup>th</sup> November, 2022); EACC (Letter Ref. EACC.7/10/5 VOL XXI (70) dated 7<sup>th</sup> November, 2022); HELB (letter Ref. HELB/RR/112009/190 dated 10th November, 2022); and ORPP (RPP/ORG/34 VOL. VI (41)).

# 2.8 Report of the Selection on the Nomination of Principal Secretary

- 35. Pursuant to Article 155 (3) (a) of the Constitution, the Public Service Commission invited applications from suitably qualified persons for the position of Principal Secretary. The advertisement was published in the print media, Kenya Gazette No. 10536 and on the Commission's Website on 7th September 2022 with a closing date of 20th October 2022.
- 36. On 20th September 2022, the Commission extended the advertisement period by seven (7) days. The advertisement period lapsed on 27th September 2022 with a total of nine thousand one hundred and fifty-four (9,154) persons submitting applications for consideration.
- 37. Four hundred and seventy-seven (477) candidates were shortlisted from 3rd to 6th October 2022 and a further review done on 7th October 2022 to bring the shortlist to Five Hundred and Eighty-Five (585) candidates so as to cater for gender, marginalized/minority groups and PWDs pursuant to Article 232 (1) (h) of the Constitution. Interviews for the shortlisted persons were conducted from 12th to 22nd October 2022.
- 38. The Selection Panel adhered to all provisions of the Constitution in the process of advertising, shortlisting and interviewing the candidates including, merit, gender, ethnic and regional balance.

# 2.9 Committee proceedings

- 39. The Committee having received the names of the nominees was obligated to conduct approval hearings and make determination of the nominees' suitability or otherwise within twenty-eight (28) days as provided for in section 8 (1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).
- 40. The Committee held four (4) sittings during which it examined and reviewed the nominees' certificates, testimonials as well as conducted approval hearings.
- 41. Following the unavailability of some members of the Committee due to exigencies of duty, the Majority Party Whip co-opted the following members in to the Committee to conduct the scheduled approval hearings in accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 192;

## CHAPTER THREE

# 3 APPROVAL HEARINGS

- 42. The Committee conducted approval hearings for the nominees on Wednesday, 30th November 2022. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) and the Standing Orders.
- 43. The Committee examined the nominees using the guidelines in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Committee also considered the following in vetting the nominees:
  - a. Academic qualifications
  - b. Employment record and work experience
  - c. Professional association
  - d. Public office, political activities and affiliations
  - e. Potential conflict of interest
  - f. Suitability to the position
  - g. Tax compliance
  - h. Vision and leadership
  - i. Integrity
  - j. Expectations and Key priorities

# 3.1 Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke

Mr. Mueke was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during vetting as follows:

# 3.1.1 Personal Background

44. Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke is a Kenyan citizen of identity card number 14421440 and was born in Nairobi County in 1976.

# 3.1.2 Educational Background

- 45. Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke, holds a Master Degree in Business Administration (MBA) from Oakland University, Michigan, USA (2006) and a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science from Wayne State University, Michigan USA.
- 46. He sat for his 'A' level examinations at Garbatula High School in 1989 and his 'O' level examinations at Marsabit Boys High School (2000).

# 3.1.3 Work experience/career progression

- 47. Mr. Jonathan Mueke has worked in the private sector all his career life in the following capacities save for Deputy Governor, Nairobi County from March 2013 to August 2017.
  - i. Shareholder and Director at TSG Realty Limited from January 2011 to date;
  - ii. Deputy Governor, Nairobi County from March 2013 to August 2017;
  - iii. Director and Shareholder, Information Technology at eManage Africa Limited, Nairobi Kenya from 2006 to 2013;
  - iv. Information Technology Manager at FiServ, Galaxy Plus, Michigan, USA from 2001 to 2006;

- v. Project Manager, Plant Technologies and Support at DaimlerChrysler Corporation in Michigan, USA from 200 to 2001;
- vi. Software Engineer- Enterprise Messaging at K-Mart Corporation in Michigan, USA from 1999 to 2000;
- vii. System Administrator Technical Services at Wayne State University from 1997 to 1999.

# 3.1.4 Professional Associations & Affiliations

- 48. Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke is professionally affiliated with the following bodies:
  - i. Member, Kenya ICT Network;
  - ii. Member, Computer Society of Kenya;
  - iii. Member, Kenya BPO Society;
  - iv. Member, Association of Storage Networking Professionals, USA; and
  - v. Member, Project Mangement Institute, USA.

# 3.1.5 Honors and Awards

49. Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke received Golden Key National Honor Society, USA

# 3.1.6 Clearance Requirements

50. The Committee confirmed that the nominee had been cleared by KRA, ORPP, DCI, EACC and HELB, having obtained clearance certificates to that effect.

# 3.1.7 Other issues under consideration

51. To examine suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee engaged the nominee in the following thematic areas to determine his knowledge of the sector:

# Suitability and experience the nominee will bring on board to the Sports & Arts Department

- 52. The nominee informed the Committee that he had vast experience in both the public & private sectors that will be useful to the State Department. He indicated that he was a beneficiary of Mandela Washington Fellowship for Young African Leaders, a flagship programme for mentoring leaders from the Community Level and Champions for Coherence in Development Initiatives while appreciating Diversity in governance.
- 53. As a director and shareholder of TSG Realty Ltd, he submitted that he had undertaken successful strategic planning for the private sector and coordinated various sectors in the real estate industry.

# Net worth

54. The nominee submitted that he was worth Ksh. 270 million with interests in land, houses, vehicles, movable and immovable assets.

# Harnessing Sports for socio-economic growth and development

55. The nominee stated that his main focus would be on talent development: discovering talents at a young age at the grassroots level by working together with the Ministry of Education on sports

- matters and also by entrenching sports in the education curriculum. He undertook that if approved, he would accord the Kenya Academy of Sports the attention it deserved.
- 56. The nominee proposed that policies, legislations and regulations ought to be developed and amended where applicable to ensure that the sporting industry was properly regulated.
- 57. He promised that if approved, the Ministry in collaboration with the National Assembly through the Departmental Committee on Sports & Culture will endeavour to develop and market sports in the country.

# Stadia construction in the country

- 58. The nominee informed the Committee that he was aware of numerous stalled stadia construction projects across the country. He attributed this to poor planning by the implementing agencies. He further alluded that in a single financial year, construction of seven stadia were commenced but have since all stalled. This was not technically viable due to budgetary constraints and other overlapping factors.
- 59. If approved, the nominee undertook to do proper planning and stakeholder engagement to prioritise projects. Afterwards, he would employ a sequencing model to construct one stadium after another.

# Financing framework for sports and the management of the Sports, Arts and Social Development Fund

60. The nominee informed the Committee that he would actualize the President's commitment that all the resources coming from the Sports, Arts and Social Development Fund (as per the PFM Act) should go to developing sports infrastructure. He stated that he would achieve that by reviewing the existing regulations to ensure all funds including those allocated to the non – sporting sectors from sports fund were channelled towards developing sports and sporting activities. Afterwards, he would ensure proper management, utilization and accountability of public funds.

# Management of film and creative Arts against piracy and guarantee revenue for government

61. The nominee stated that if approved, his Department will be at the fore-front in the protection of intellectual property rights and would endeavour on consistent payment of royalties to Kenyan artists. The Department will also prioritise on partnerships and stakeholder engagement to enhance innovations and creativity in the arts sector.

# Pending Bills

62. The nominee stated that one of the ways to deal with the recurring issue of pending bills was on strict adherence to the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act. He would achieve this by instituting an audit committee to review the pending bills with a view of assessing the compliance and propriety to the existing laws and regulations governing procurement of goods, works and

services. He further submitted that, if appointed he would leverage on credible procurement plans and government Integrated Financial Management Information Systems (IFMIS) and e-procurement module.

# 3.2 Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir

Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during vetting as follows:

# 3.2.1 Personal Background

63. She is a Kenyan citizen of identity card number 23750759 and was born in Wajir County in 1984.

3.2.2 Educational Background

64. Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir is pursuing PhD in International Relations and Foreign Policy from USIU. She holds a Masters of Arts in Armed Conflict and Peace Studies (2018), and a Bachelor of Law and Shariah (2009) from Zanzibar University.

3.2.3 Work experience/career progression

- 65. Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir was the immediate Vice Chairperson of National Elections Board, United Democratic Alliance (UDA) Party, a position she held since January 2022 prior to her resignation in October, 2022.
- 66. Ms. Ummi Bashir Mohamed has also worked in the following capacities:

i. Vice-Chairperson of National Elections Board, UDA from January 2022 to date;

- ii. County Chief Officer, Department of Public Service and Labour, Wajir County from May 2020 to January 2022;
- iii. Founder and Partner of Ummi Bashir and Company Advocates from 2019 to date;
- iv. Associate Director, the Special Envoy for Somali Situation, Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework from January 2018 to December 2018;
- v. Senior Legal Counsel, Mombasa County Government from February 2014 to December 2017:
- vi. Executive Advisor to UNDP from December 2012 to October 2013;
- vii. Special Assistant and Legal Advisor to the Minister for EAC, March 2010 to November 2012.

# 3.2.4 Professional Associations & Affiliations

67. Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir is a Member of Law Society of Kenya and the CEO of Women for Women Alliance.

# 3.2.5 Honors and Awards

68. Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir does not have any Honor or Award.

3.2.6 Clearance Requirements

69. The Committee confirmed that the nominee had been cleared by KRA, ORPP, DCI, EACC and HELB, having obtained clearance certificates to that effect.

### 3.2.7 Other issues under consideration

To examine suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee engaged the nominee in the following thematic areas to determine her knowledge of the sector:

# Suitability of the nominee for the position nominated

70. The nominee cited exposure to legislation and policies from her education background in legal profession. She has also worked for various organizations like the Ministry of East African Community (EAC) as Special Assistant and Legal Advisor to the Cabinet Secretary, the United Nations Development Programme, Mombasa County Assembly and Wajir County in various capacities. The nominee believed that these exposures prepared her to take up the task she was nominated for.

## Net worth

71. The nominee submitted that she was worth Ksh. 76 million ranging from livestock, land, a vehicle, movable and immovable assets and cash.

# Conflict of interest at the work place

72. The nominee submitted that she would stay away from being conflicted at the work place, declare interest where applicable and recuse herself should she feel that she would be conflicted.

# Adherence to the Public Finance management Act, 2012 and provisions of Article 226(5) of the Constitution on financial probity and responsibility on the part of Accounting Officer

73. The nominee submitted that she would exercise strict adherence to the Constitution and other applicable laws in regard to financial matters and strictly comply with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012. She also emphasized on hiring competent staff, regularly building their capacity and holding them to account. She further stated that would carry out regular internal audits to improve on internal controls and risk management.

# Management of Culture policy as provided for in Article 11 of the Constitution while respecting the independence of the two levels of government

74. The nominee emphasized on the need to have culture incorporated in our communities from the grass roots starting from the elementary education levels. She promised to have culture inculcated in the Competency Based Curriculum and music festivals. She pledged to put measures in place to make culture appealing to the youth and give it media visibility. She further pledged to ensure communities around the country understood and interact with the culture in order to appreciate and celebrate it.

# Pending bills

75. The nominee responded that she would strictly adhere to appropriated budgets and procurement plans of the State Department while undertaking commitments in her State Department. She further submitted that she would undertake upon verification, clearing of existing pending bills by considering it as a first charge for the State Department of culture and heritage in the succeeding financial years. To realize these, she pledged to engage the Committee and the National Treasury on enhancement of budgetary allocation and timely exchequer release.

## CHAPTER FOUR

# 4 OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

- 76. The Committee's observations were guided by Article 155 of the Constitution, section 47 of the Public Service Act and Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) in terms of issues for consideration as follows:
  - i. the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;

ii. any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and

- iii. suitability of the nominees for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is made.
- 77. The Committee made the following observations:

# 4.1 Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke

- 78. The Committee, made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as Principal Secretary for the State Department for Sports & Arts:
  - (1) THAT, in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office since he is a Kenyan citizen born in 1976 in Nairobi County and does not hold dual citizenship.
  - (2) THAT, the nominee has previously served as the first Deputy Governor of Nairobi County from March 2013 to August, 2017. The nominee unsuccessfully vied for Kitui County Governorship in the recently concluded 2022 General Elections. Further, he holds a Master's degree in Business Administration from Oakland University, Michigan, USA and BSC Computer Science from Wayne County Community College, Michigan, USA thus complies with section 6(7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No. 33 of 2011.
  - (3) THAT, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having obtained clearance from the following statutory bodies; the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) and the Higher Educations Loan Board (HELB).
  - (4) THAT, the nominee had not been charged in a court of law in the past three years.
  - (5) **THAT**, the nominee does not hold office in any political party and thus complies with Article 77(2) of the Constitution which prohibits an appointed State officer from holding office in a political party.
  - (6) THAT, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity), Article 77 (restriction on activities of State Officers) and Article 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution.
- 79. **THAT**, the nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative, and technical issues touching on government and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Principal Secretary of the State Department of Sports & Arts.

# 4.2 Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir

80. The The Committee, made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as Principal Secretary, in the State Department of Culture & Heritage:

- (7) THAT, in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to a state office since she is a Kenyan citizen born in 1984 in Wajir County and does not hold dual citizenship.
- (8) THAT, the nominee has previously served as the immediate Vice Chairperson of the National Elections Board of the United Democratic Alliance Party (UDA) prior to her resignation in October, 2022. The nominee worked with United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) in the program of Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework (CRRF) and the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) as the Executive Advisor to the Country Director from December 2012 to October 2013. Further, the nominee holds a Masters of Arts Degree in Armed conflict and Peace Studies from the University of Nairobi, Post Graduate Diploma from Kenya School of Law and Bachelor of Law from Zanzibar University thus complies with section 6(7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No. 33 of 2011.
- (9) THAT, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having obtained clearance from the following statutory bodies; the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) and the Higher Educations Loan Board (HELB).
- (10) THAT, the nominee had not been charged in a court of law in the past three years.
- (11) THAT, the nominee does not hold office in any political party and thus complies with Article 77(2) of the Constitution which prohibits an appointed State officer from holding office in a political party.
- (12) THAT, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity), Article 77 (restriction on activities of State Officers) and Article 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution.
- 81. **THAT**, the nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative, and technical issues touching on government and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Principal Secretary in the State Department of Culture & Heritage.

# CHAPTER FIVE

# 5 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 82. Having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominees, and pursuant to Section 8(2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Committee recommends that the National Assembly APPROVES the appointment of:
  - 1. Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke to the position of the Principal Secretary, State Department for Sports and Arts; and
  - 2. Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir to the position of the Principal Secretary, State Department for Culture and Heritage.

Mr. Jonathan Mwangangi Mueke, nominee for the position of the Principal Secretary, State Department for Sports & Arts, appeared before the Committee at 11:30 am and was vetted under oath pursuant to Article 155(3) of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary) Approval Act, 2011 and the Standing Order 216(5)(e) of the National Assembly. The Committee noted the following:

- The nominee submitted that he was a Kenyan citizen of identity card number 14421440 and was born in Nairobi County in 1976. He averred that he did not hold any other citizenship.
- ii. The nominee was a beneficiary of the Mandela Washington Fellowship for Young African Leaders, a flagship programme for mentoring leaders from the Community Level and Champions for Coherence in Development Initiatives while appreciating Diversity in governance.
- iii. The nominee holds a Master Degree in Business Administration (MBA) from Oakland University, Michigan, USA (2006) and a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science from Wayne State University, Michigan USA.
- iv. The nominee sat for his 'A' level examinations at Garbatula High School in 1989 and his 'O' level examinations at Marsabit Boys High School (2000).
- v. The nominee worked in the private sector all his career life in the other capacities save for Deputy Governor, Nairobi County from March 2013 to August 2017.
- vi. The nominee is is professionally affiliated to several bodies, including:
  - a) Member, Kenya ICT Network;
  - b) Member, Computer Society of Kenya;
  - c) Member, Kenya BPO Society;
  - d) Member, Association of Storage Networking Professionals, USA; and
  - e) Member, Project Mangement Institute, USA.
- vii. The Committee confirmed that the nominee had been cleared by KRA, ORPP, DCI, EACC and HELB, having obtained clearance certificates to that effect.
- viii. To examine suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee engaged him on the following thematic areas to determine his knowledge of the sector:
  - a) On his experience and suitability for the position he was nominated for: the nominee submitted that he had vast experience in both public and private sector. He indicated that he was inaugural Deputy Governor of Nairobi County between 2013 and 2017.
  - b) On matters harnessing Sports for socio-economic growth and development: the nominee stated that his main focus would be on Talent Development, discovering talents at a young age at the grass-root level by working together with the Ministry of Education on sports matters and also by entrenching sports in the Education Curriculum. Kenya

- Academy of Sports should be given more attention. He further suggested that policies, laws and regulations should be developed and amended to ensure that the sporting industry is regulated.
- c) On issues with the development, design and implementation of Stadia infrastructure in the Country. The nominee pointed to stalled projects on the construction of stadia in various parts of the Country, attributing it to poor work plan and pledged to come up with a better working plan based on priority basis.
- d) On the financing framework for sports and the management of the Sports, Arts and Social Development Fund: the nominee informed the Committee that he would actualize the President's commitment that all the resources coming from the Sports Arts and Social Development Fund (PFM Act) should go to developing sports infrastructure. He stated that he would achieve that by review of the existing regulations to ensure all funds including those allocated to non- sporting sectors from Sports Fund were channelled towards developing sports and sporting activities. He undertook to ensure proper management, utilization and accountability of public funds.
- e) On the management of film and creative arts against piracy and guarantee revenue for government: the nominee stated that his Department will be at the fore front in the protection of intellectual property and consistent payment of royalties to Kenyan Artists. He further stated that he will also leverage on prioritizing partnerships and stakeholder engagement to enhance innovations and creativity in the Arts Sector.
- f) On pending bills: the nominee stated that one of the ways to deal with the recurring issue of pending bills was on strict adherence to the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act. He would achieve this by instituting an audit committee to review the pending bills with a view of assessing the compliance and propriety to the existing laws and regulations governing procurement of goods, works and services. He further submitted that, if appointed he would leverage on credible procurement plans and government Integrated Financial Management Information Systems (IFMIS) and e-procurement module.

Ms. Ummi Mohamed Bashir, nominee for the position of Principal Secretary for the State Department of Culture and Heritage, appeared before the Committee at 12:50 pm and was vetted under oath pursuant to Article 155(3) of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary) Approval Act, 2011 and the Standing Order 216 (5) (e) of the National Assembly. The Committee noted the following:

- The nominee was a Kenyan citizen of identity card number 23750759 and was born in Wajir County in 1984.
- The nominee was pursuing PhD in International Relations and Foreign Policy from USIU. She holds a Masters of Arts in Armed Conflict and Peace Studies (2018), and a Bachelor of Law and Shariah (2009) from Zanzibar University.
- iii. The nominee was the immediate Vice Chairperson of the National Elections Board, United Democratic Alliance Party (UDA), a position she held since January 2022 prior to her resignation in October, 2022.
- iv. The nominee was worth Ksh, 76 million with interests in land, livestock and both movable and immovable assets.
- v. The nominee had also worked in the following capacities:
  - i. Vice-Chairperson of National Elections Board, UDA from January to October, 2022;
  - County Chief Officer, Department of Public Service and Labour, Wajir County from May 2020 to January 2022;
  - iii. Founder and Partner of Ummi Bashir and Company Advocates from 2019 to date;
  - iv. Associate Director, the Special Envoy for Somali Situation, Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework from January 2018 to December 2018;
  - v. Senior Legal Counsel, Mombasa County Government from February 2014 to December 2017;
  - vi. Executive Advisor to UNDP from December 2012 to October 2013;
  - vii. Special Assistant and Legal Advisor to the Minister for EAC, March 2010 to November 2012.
- vi. The nominee was a Member of the Law Society of Kenya and the CEO of Women for Women Alliance but does not have any Honor or Award.
- vii. The Committee confirmed that the nominee had been cleared by KRA, ORPP, DCI, EACC and HELB, having obtained clearance certificates to that effect.
- viii. To examine suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee engaged her on the following thematic areas to determine her knowledge of the sector:
  - a. On her suitability for the job; the nominee cited exposure to legislation and policies from her education background in legal profession. She has also worked for various organizations like the Ministry of East African Community (EAC) as Special Assistant and Legal Advisor to the Cabinet Secretary, the United Nations Development Programme, Mombasa County Assembly and Wajir County in various capacities.
  - b. On conflict of interest in the work place; the nominee submitted that she would stay away from being conflicted at the work place, declare interest where applicable and recuse herself should she feel that she would be conflicted.
  - c. On the adherence to the Public Finance management Act, 2012 and provisions of Article 226(5) of the Constitution on financial probity and responsibility on the part of

Accounting Officer; The nominee submitted that she would exercise strict adherence to the Constitution and other applicable laws in regard to financial matters and strictly comply with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012. She also emphasized on hiring competent staff, regularly building their capacity and holding them to account. She further stated that would carry out regular internal audits to improve on internal controls and risk management.

- d. On management of Culture policy as provided for in Article 11 of the Constitution while respecting the independence of the two levels of government; The nominee emphasized on the need to have culture incorporated in our communities from the grass roots starting from the elementary education levels. She promised to have culture inculcated in the Competency Based Curriculum and music festivals. She pledged to put measures in place to make culture appealing to the youth and give it media visibility. She further pledged to ensure communities around the country understood and interact with the culture in order to appreciate and celebrate it.
- e. On pending bills; The nominee responded that she would strictly adhere to appropriated budgets and procurement plans of the State Department while undertaking commitments in her State Department. She further submitted that she would undertake upon verification, clearing of existing pending bills by considering it as a first charge for the State Department of culture and heritage in the succeeding financial years. To realize these, she pledged to engage the Committee and the National Treasury on enhancement of budgetary allocation and timely exchequer release.
