On the Nomination of a Person for Appointment as the Chairperson of Kenya Fish Marketing Authority

"Honourable Members, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 42, I wish to report to the House that I have received a Message from His Excellency the President regarding the nomination of a person for appointment as the Chairperson of Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

Honourable Members, in the Message, His Excellency the President conveys that, in exercise of powers conferred by section 201(1)(a) as read together with section 201 (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act, 2016 and in accordance with the procedure in sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the President has nominated Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo for appointment as the Chairperson of Kenya Fish Marketing Authority. The President now seeks the approval of the nominee by this House.

Honourable Members, Standing Order 45 requires that, upon receipt of notification of nomination for appointments, such nomination shall stand committed to the relevant Departmental Committee of the House for consideration. In this respect, I hereby refer the Message from H.E. the President, together with the Curriculum Vitae and Testimonials of the nominee, to the Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation for consideration.

Honourable Members, section 8 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that, unless otherwise provided in law, the Committee to which such nomination is referred shall consider the matter and table a report in the House within twenty-eight (28) days. In this regard, the Committee is expected to immediately commence the approval process, notify the nominee and the general public of the time and place for holding the approval hearings, and thereafter, upon conclusion of the hearings, table its report on or before Thursday, 6th April 2023 to enable the House to consider the matter within the statutory timelines.
