CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation during the approval hearings of Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo nominee for appointment as the Chairperson Kenya Fish Marketing Authority as requested by H.E. the President and communicated to the House by the Speaker on Thursday, 16th March, 2023.

H.E. the President notified the National Assembly of the nomination of Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo for appointment as the Chairperson Kenya Fish Marketing Authority. The Hon Speaker vide a communication made on Thursday, 16th March, 2023 conveyed to the House the Message from H.E. the President. The Speaker subsequently referred the nominee curriculum vitae to the Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation for approval hearing. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominee and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearing.

In compliance with Article 118 (b) of the Constitution and section 6 (4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on **Thursday 23rd March 2023** informing the public of the nomination, date, time and place of the approval hearing. He also invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominees in conformity with section 6 (9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The memoranda were to be received on or before Thursday 30th March, 2023 at 5.00 p.m. (East African Time). At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum for or against the nominee suitability.

The Clerk of the National Assembly also wrote to KRA, EACC, DCI, HELB and ORPP seeking references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee.

The nominee appeared before the Committee on Friday 31st March, 2023 for vetting. The Committee examined his suitability based on the criteria set out in Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). In addition, the Committee examined their academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on leadership and integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominee; any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question and suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the Authority.

Committee Recommendation

The Committee having held approval hearing of the nominee regarding his suitability, observed that due process was followed in the recruitment as provided for under Section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016) read together with the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Committee therefore recommends that the National Assembly approves the nomination of Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo for appointment as Chairperson, Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

The Committee registers its appreciation to the Offices of the Speaker, the Clerk of the National Assembly, the Director, Departmental Committees and the Secretariat for the support and facilitation extended to it during the vetting process.

In addition, the Committee thanks the nominee for his cooperation during the vetting process. Finally, the Committee appreciates KRA, EACC, DCI, HELB and ORPP for providing references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee.

CHAPTER ONE

1. PREFACE

1.1 Establishment of the Committee

- 1. The Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation is one of the twenty Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under **Standing Order 216** whose mandates pursuant to the **Standing Order 216** (5) are as follows:
 - i. To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
 - ii. To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
 - iii. On a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;
 - iv. To study and review all legislation referred to it;
 - v. To study, assess and analyze the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
 - vi. To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
 - vii. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments);
 - viii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - ix. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - x. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - xi. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

1.2 Subjects of the Committee

- 2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider matters of; use and regulation of water resources, irrigation, fisheries development including promotion of aquaculture, fish farming, marine fisheries, the sustainable use of ocean resources for economic growth and improved livelihoods, except seaports and marine transport.
- 3. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversights the following government Ministries Departments and Agencies (MDAs):
 - i. The State Department for Water and Sanitation
 - ii. The State Department for Irrigation
 - iii. The State Department for Blue Economy and Fisheries
 - iv. The State Department for Shipping and Maritime Affairs

CHAPTER TWO

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal Framework

6. In accordance with the provisions of Section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016) and Sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No. 33 of 2011, His Excellency the President forwarded to the National Assembly, the notification of nomination and curriculum vitae of Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo on 14th March, 2023 for the approval of National Assembly before appointment as Chairperson, Board of Directors, Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

8. The Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation was tasked with conducting the nominee's approval hearing and reporting to the House.

9. While conducting approval hearings, Committees of the House are guided by the following provisions of the Constitution and statutes-:

i. The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011);

ii. Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;

iii. Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;

iv. Article 77 of the Constitution on restriction on activities of State Officers;

v. Article 78 of the Constitution on dual citizenship;

vi. Article 118 of the Constitution on public participation;

vii. Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;

viii. The Leadership and Integrity Act (No. 19 of 2012);

ix. The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015); and

x. The Public Officer Ethics Act (No. 4 of 2003).

The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011)

10. Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides for issues which the relevant House of Parliament (in this case, the National Assembly) is required to consider in relation to any nomination. These issues include:

i. the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;

ii. any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and

- iii. the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.
- 11. During the approval hearing, section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) provides the following important points to be considered:

i. An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background (section 6(7), PAPAA);

ii. The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate (section 6(8), PAPAA);

- iii. Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated (section 6(9), PAPAA); and
- iv. A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall end (section 6(10), PAPAA).

Article 10(2) of the Constitution on national values and principles of governance

12. Article 10(2) of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which include patriotism, national unity, sharing and devolution of power, the rule of law, democracy and participation of the people; human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality, human rights, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized; good governance, integrity, transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

Chapter 6 of the Constitution (Leadership and Integrity)

- 13. There are provisions in Chapter 6 of the Constitution worth pointing out. Article 73 of the Constitution provides that the authority assigned to a State officer is a public trust to be exercised in accordance to the Constitution, demonstrate respect for the people, bring honour to the nation and dignity to the office and promote public confidence in the integrity of the office. Also, the State officer shall have the responsibility to serve the people, rather than the power to rule them.
- 14. The guiding principles of leadership and integrity are listed as selection based on personal integrity, competence and suitability, objectivity and impartiality in decision making, selfless service based solely on the public interest, accountability and discipline and commitment in service to the people.

Article 77 of the Constitution (Restriction on activities of State officers)

15. Article 77 of the Constitution provides that a full-time State officer shall not participate in any other gainful employment and that any appointed State officer shall not hold office in a political party.

Article 78 of the Constitution on citizenship and leadership

16. Article 78 of the Constitution states that a person is not eligible for election or appointment to a state office unless the person is a citizen of Kenya. It also provides that a State officer or a member of the defence forces shall not hold dual citizenship.

Article 118 of the Constitution on public access and participation

- 17. Article 118 of the Constitution provides that:
 - 1. Parliament shall:
 - a) conduct its business in an open manner, and its sittings and those of its committees shall be in public; and
 - b) facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of Parliament and its committees.

2. Parliament may not exclude the public, or any media, from any sitting unless in exceptional circumstances the relevant Speaker has determined that there are justifiable reasons for the exclusion.

Article 232 of the Constitution on Values and Principles of Public Service

18. Article 232 of the Constitution provides for the values and principles of public service which include high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women; the members of all ethnic groups; and persons with disabilities.

The Leadership and Integrity Act (No. 19 of 2012)

19. The Leadership and Integrity Act provides a number of obligations to a state officer. These are, among others: to respect and abide by the Constitution and the law, public trust, performance of duties in an honest and accountable manner, professionalism, financial integrity, not to engage in activities that amount to abuse of office, not misuse public resources, accepting gifts that may compromise the officer's duties, wrongful or unlawful acquisition of property, conflict of interest etc.

The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015)

20. Section 5 of the Public Service (Values and Principles) Act provides that a public officer shall maintain high standards of professional ethics, including, being honest; displaying high standards of integrity, transparency, accountability, respect to others, objectivity, patriotism, observance of rule of law. (Applies in future upon appointment)

The Public Officer Ethics Act (No. 4 of 2003)

21. The Public Officer Ethics Act provides for obligations to be carried out by a public officer. These include professionalism, carrying out duties in accordance with the law, prohibition from unjust enrichment, avoiding conflict of interest, not using office as a venue for soliciting or collecting harambees; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, not practicing nepotism or favouritism, giving impartial advice, conducting private affairs in a way that maintains public confidence, bar from sexual harassment, submission of declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years (section 26). (Applies in future after appointment)

2.2 Qualifications for appointment as the Chairperson

22. In conducting the approval hearing, the Committee was guided by Section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016), Section 47 (2) of the Public Service Act and the provisions of Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).

2.3 Message from H.E. the President

23. H.E. the President on 14th March, 2023 communicated the name of the nominee for appointment to the position of Chairperson Kenya Fish Marketing Authority to the Speaker for approval by the National Assembly pursuant to Section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016), The Speaker in his communication from the Chair issued on 16th March, 2023 and pursuant to Standing Order No. 42 referred the name to the Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation to conduct approval hearing and report within twenty-eight (28) days.

2.4 Speaker's Communication and Committal to the Committee

- 24. Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 42, the Speaker of the National Assembly on Thursday, 16th March, 2023 communicated to the House the message from H.E. the President regarding the nominee for appointment as Chairperson Kenya Fish Marketing Authority. The Speaker informed the House that H.E. the President was seeking approval of the National Assembly on the said nominee before the nominees' appointment.
- 25. In accordance with Standing Order 45(1), the Speaker read the Message from H.E. the President and referred the name of the nominee, his curricula vitae to the Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation to conduct approval hearing.
- 26. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominee and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearing.

2.5 Notification to the Public

- 27. Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".
- 28. The Committee on Thursday, 23rd March, 2023 published a notification in the print media informing the general public of its conduct of the approval hearing, as provided for by Article 118 (1) (a) (b) and (2) of the Constitution and Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), which provides for public participation. The notification gave provision for the submission of memoranda, by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee, by Thursday 30th March, 2023 by 5.00 pm (East African Time). At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum for or against the suitability of the nominee to hold office.

2.6 Notification to the Nominee

29. The Committee vide an advertisement in the print media on Thursday 23rd March, 2023 and letters Ref. NA/DDC/BEW&1/VETT/2023/018 informed the nominee of his nomination by H.E. the President and requested him to appear for vetting by the Departmental Committee on Blue

Economy, Water and Irrigation on Friday 31st March, 2023 in the Main Chamber, Parliament Building. The Committee further requested the nominee to appear with his clearance certificates from KRA, HELB, EACC, ORPP and DCI.

2.7 Clearance Requirements

30. The Committee wrote to KRA, HELB, EACC, ORPP and DCI requesting for tax, education loans, integrity, affiliation to political parties and criminal record status of the nominee. All the agencies wrote back to the National Assembly clearing the nominee.

2.8 Report of the Selection Panel on the Nomination of chairperson

2.9 Committee proceedings

- 31. The Committee having received the name of the nominee was obligated to conduct approval hearing and make determination of the nominees' suitability or otherwise within twenty-eight (28) days as provided for in section 8 (1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).
- 32. The Committee held three (3) sittings during which it examined and reviewed the nominees' certificates, testimonials as well as conducted approval hearing.

CHAPTER THREE

3. APPROVAL HEARING

- 33. The Committee conducted approval hearing for the nominee on Friday 31st March, 2023. While conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) and the National Assembly Standing Orders.
- 34. The Committee examined the nominee using the guidelines in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Committee also considered the following while vetting the nominee:
 - a. Academic qualifications
 - b. Employment record and work experience
 - c. Professional association
 - d. Public office, political activities and affiliations
 - e. Potential conflict of interest
 - f. Suitability to the position
 - g. Tax compliance
 - h. Vision and leadership
 - i. Integrity
 - j. Expectations and Key priorities

3.1 Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo

35. Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo, the nominee for appointment as the Chairperson appeared before the Committee on Friday 31st March, 2023 at 10.00 am and was vetted under oath pursuant to Section 201(1) (a) and 2 read together with the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Orders of the National Assembly. The Committee noted the following:

3.1.1 Date and Place of Birth

36. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen born on 28th December, 1966 in Homabay County. He confirmed that he was a Kenyan citizen and did not hold any other citizenship.

3.1.2 Education and Training

37. The nominee holds a Master of Science (MSC), Finance from the University of Nairobi. He has a Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting option) from the same University from 1988-1991. He went to Githiga High School from 1986-1987, Alliance High school from 1982- 1985 and Marindi Primary School from 1975 – 1981.

3.1.3 Work Experience/ Career Progression

- 38. The nominee informed the Committee that he has over twenty years of experience having served in Public Service. The nominee worked for the following institutions:
 - A Member of Board of Directors in the Agricultural Development Corporation from 2018 to 2020.
 - Nairobi City County Advisor to the Governor in 2016.
 - Member of Parliament for Rangwe Constituency 2008 2013
 - Accountant for the Ministry of Local Government between 1999-2007

 Accountant for Lonrho Motors Limited between 1996-1997 and in the Office of the President between 1992 - 1997

3.1.4 Membership, Associations, Honours and Awards

39. The nominee informed the Committee that he is not a member of any associations and does not have any honours or awards

3.1.5 Financial Net Worth

40. The nominee stated that his total financial net worth comprises income from his consultancy services and his supplies business. He stated that his financial net worth was amounting to one hundred and eight Million Kenyan Shillings (Ksh. 108, 000,000). This comprises of a Nairobi house which costs Ksh. 30 million, Kisumu house which is valued at Ksh. 10 million, a house in Homabay which costs Ksh. 40 million, land valued at Kshs. 25 million, a motor vehicle which is valued at Kshs. 3 million cash of Kshs. 2 million and liabilities that amount to Ksh. 2 million.

3.1.6 Public Office, Political Activities and Affiliations

41. The nominee was a Party Leader for the Green Congress of Kenya 2016 – 2023 however following his nomination he had resigned and therefore was not holding any position in a political party.

 - iv. THAT, the nominee in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, is eligible for appointment to State Office since he is a Kenyan citizen born on December 28th, 1966 in Homabay County and does not hold dual citizenship.
 - v. **THAT**, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity having obtained clearance from EACC, KRA, DCI, ORPP and HELB.
 - vi. THAT, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity), Article 77 (restriction on activities of State Officers) and Article 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution.
 - vii. THAT, the nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the office of the Chairperson and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience to serve as the Chairperson Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.
 - viii. THAT, there was no Memorandum received contesting his nomination and suitability for his appointment.

CHAPTER FIVE

5. RECOMMENDATION

Having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to Section 8(2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 (No. 33 of 2011), the Committee recommends that the National Assembly approves:

The nomination of Hon. Martin Otieno Ogindo for appointment as the Chairperson Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.
