

CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains the proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs during the approval hearing of Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco, nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services as forwarded by H.E. the President and communicated to the House by the Speaker on Tuesday 6th June, 2023.

Pursuant to Articles 132(2) and 155(3) of the Constitution as read with Section 46 of the Public Service Commission Act, 2017, the Public Service Commission forwarded to the appointing authority, H.E The President, names of qualified persons for appointment as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services vide letter Ref. No. PSC.SEC.93/37 Vol. VII (6) dated 31st May, 2023. Consequently, in the exercise of his powers conferred by Article 155(3)(a) of the Constitution as read together with Sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, H.E. The President vide Presidential Nomination 14 of 2023 dated 31st May, 2023 notified the National Assembly of the nomination of Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services. The Rt. Hon. Speaker vide Communication No. 014 of 2023 dated Tuesday 6th June, 2023 conveyed to the House the Message from the H.E The President and subsequently referred the name of the nominee and her Curriculum Vitae to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for approval hearing. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and table its report before the House on or before Wednesday 28th June, 2023. The Rt. Hon, Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominee and the general public of the time and place of holding the approval hearing, by placing advertisements in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website.

In compliance with Article 118 (b) of the Constitution and Section 6 (4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Thursday 8th June, 2023 informing the public of the nomination, date, time and place of the approval hearing. He invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavits) with supporting evidence on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with Section 6 (9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The memoranda were to be received on or before Friday 16th June, 2023 at 5.00 p.m. (East African Time). By the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum against the nominee's suitability.

The Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the nominee vide letter Ref. No. NA/DDC/JLAC/VETT/2023/014 dated 12th June, 2023 inviting Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco for the approval hearing in accordance with Section 6(3) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. He also wrote to the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) and Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) seeking references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee.

The nominee appeared before the Committee on Wednesday 21st June, 2023 for the approval hearing. The Committee examined her suitability based on the criteria set out in Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. In addition, the Committee examined her academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on leadership and integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominee, the constitutional or statutory

requirements relating to the office in question and the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the State Department for Correctional Services.

Committee Recommendation

The Committee, having held the approval hearing of the nominee regarding her suitability, observed that due process was followed in the nomination of the nominee in accordance with Article 155(3)(a) of the Constitution as read together with Sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The Committee, therefore, recommends that the National Assembly **approves** the nomination of Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco for appointment as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services.

Acknowledgements

The Committee registers its appreciation to the Office of the Speaker, Office of the Clerk of the National Assembly, Office of the Director of Departmental Committees and the Committee Secretariat for the logistical support extended during the approval hearing process.

In addition, the Committee thanks the nominee for her cooperation during the Parliamentary approval hearing process. Finally, the Committee appreciates the DCI, EACC, HELB, KRA and ORPP for providing references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee.

1 PREFACE


1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

- The Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs is one of twenty departmental committees
 of the National Assembly established under Standing Order 216 whose mandate pursuant to the
 Standing Order 216 (5) is as follows:
 - To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
 - ii. To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
 - iii. To, on a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;
 - iv. To study and review all legislation referred to it;
 - v. To study, assess and analyse the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
 - vi. To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
 - vii. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments);
 - viii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - ix. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendations of proposed legislation;
 - x. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - xi. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

1.2 Mandate of the Committee

2 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal Framework

- 6. Article 155(3) of the Constitution provides for the procedure of appointment as Principal Secretary as follows:
 - "(3) The President shall -
 - (a) nominate a person for appointment as Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and
 - (b) with the approval of the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries."
- 7. In light of this, H.E. The President nominated Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco for appointment as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services.
- 8. Pursuant to provisions 45(1) of the Standing Orders, the Speaker of the National Assembly committed the nomination to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for consideration by conducting an approval hearing and preparing a report to be tabled before the House on or before Wednesday 28th June, 2023.
- 9. The Committee was guided by the following provisions of the Constitution and statutes in executing its assignment:
 - i. Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;
 - ii. Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
 - iii. Article 77 of the Constitution on restriction on activities of State Officers;
 - iv. Article 78 of the Constitution on dual citizenship;
 - v. Article 118 of the Constitution on public participation;
 - vi. Article 124(4) of the Constitution on consideration of persons for appointment to public office;
 - vii. Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;
 - viii. The Public Officer Ethics Act (No. 4 of 2003);
 - ix. The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011); and
 - x. The Leadership and Integrity Act (No. 19 of 2012).

2.2 Notification of Nomination

- 10. Pursuant to Article 155(3) of the Constitution as read with Section 46 of the Public Service Commission Act, 2017, the Public Service Commission forwarded to the appointing authority, H.E The President, names of qualified persons for appointment as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services vide letter Ref. No. PSC.SEC.93/37 Vol. VII (6) dated 31st May, 2023.
- 11. Consequently, H.E the President nominated Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco for appointment as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services.

2.3 Message from H.E. the President

- 12. H.E the President on Wednesday 31st May, 2023 communicated the name of the nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services to the Speaker of the National Assembly for approval by the House pursuant to Article 155(3)(b) of the Constitution.
- 13. The Rt. Hon. Speaker in his Communication issued on Tuesday 6th June, 2023 and pursuant to Standing Order No. 42, referred the name of the nominee to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs to conduct approval hearing and submit its report within twenty-eight (28) days.

2.4 Notification to the House and Referral to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs

- 14. Article 124(4) of the Constitution provides as follows with regard to the approval of public appointments—
 - "(4) When a House of Parliament considers any appointment for which its approval is required under this Constitution or an Act of Parliament—
 - (a) the appointment shall be considered by a committee of the relevant House;
 - (b) the committee's recommendation shall be tabled in the House for approval; and
 - (c) the proceedings of the committee and the House shall be open to the public."
- 15. Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 42(1), the Speaker, vide Communication No. 014 of 2023 dated Tuesday 6th June, 2023, informed the House of the Message from H.E the

- President regarding the nomination of the Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services for approval by the National Assembly.
- 16. Pursuant to Section 8(1) of the Public Appointment (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Order 45(1), the name and Curriculum Vitae of the nominee were referred to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for approval hearing and reporting to the House.
- 17. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the approval process within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act, 2011. The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominee and the general public of the time and place of holding the approval hearing.

2.5 Notification to the Public

- 18. Article 118 as read together with Article 124 (4)(c) of the Constitution provide that Parliament shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of Parliament and its Committees, including when considering appointment for which its approval is required.
- 19. Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that the clerk shall notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days before the hearing.
- 20. Further, Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that:
 - "Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".
- 21. Pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution as read together with Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Thursday 8th June, 2023 inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*affidavits*) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with Section 6(9) of the Act. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Friday 16th June, 2023 at 5.00 p.m.

- (East African Time). At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memorandum in support or against the suitability of the nominee.
- 22. Further, pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution, Section 6(4) of the Public Appointment (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and provisions of Standing Order 45(3), the Clerk of the National Assembly placed advertisements in the local dailies notifying the general public and inviting Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco to attend the approval hearing on Wednesday 21st June, 2023 in the Mini-Chamber, County Hall, Parliament Buildings at 9.30 a.m.

2.6 Notification to the Nominee

23. The Clerk of the National Assembly vide the advertisement placed in the print media and letter Ref. No. NA/DDC/JLAC/VETT/2023/014 dated 12th June, 2023 invited Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco for the approval hearing in accordance with Section 6(3) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

2.7 Clearance and Compliance Requirements

- 24. On 7th June, 2023, the Clerk of the National Assembly vide letters Ref No. NA/DDC/GEN/VETT/2023/001,NA/DDC/GEN/VETT/2023/002,NA/DDC/GEN/VETT/2023/0 03,NA/DDC/GEN/VETT/2023/004, NA/DDC/GEN/VETT/2023/005 wrote to the DCI, EACC, HELB, KRA and ORPP respectively, requesting for reports concerning the nominee on the following matters:
 - a) Criminal records;
 - b) Ethics and integrity;
 - c) Higher education loan repayments;
 - d) Tax compliance; and
 - e) Political party affiliations.
- 25. The following institutions wrote back to the National Assembly clearing the nominee: DCI vide letter Ref No. DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.XII/159 dated 20th June, 2023; EACC vide letter Ref No. EACC.7/10/5 VOL XXIII (140) dated 16th June, 2023; HELB vide letter Ref No. HELB/RR/112009/V/251 dated 12th June, 2023; KRA vide letter Ref No. KRA/5/1002/5(9148) dated 19th June, 2023; and ORPP vide letter Ref No. RPP/ORG/34 VOL. VII (9) dated 12th June, 2023.

2.8 Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearing

- 26. Section 6(7) and (8) of the Public Appointment (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that:
 - "(7) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.
 - (8) The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate."
- 27. In addition, Section 7 of the Act stipulates the issues for consideration as:
 - a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
 - b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
 - c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointments proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.
- 28. While conducting the approval hearings, the Committee was guided by the provisions of Section 6(7) and (8) and Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

a) Procedure for Nomination

- 29. Article 155(3)(a) of the Constitution confers upon the President the power to nominate a person for appointment as Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission.
- 30. Section 5(1) of the Public Appointment (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 further requires that the appointing authority, upon nominating a person for appointment, notifies the relevant House of Parliament.
- 31. In light of this, pursuant to Article 155(3)(b) of the Constitution as read together with Section 5(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the President notified the National Assembly of the nomination of Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco as Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services.

b) Constitutional and Statutory Requirements

32. The Committee was guided by the following provisions of law on the requirements for appointment to the State Office:

i. National Values and Principles of Governance

33. Article 10 of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which State officers must abide by in discharging their mandate. They include: patriotism; national unity; sharing and devolution of power; the rule of law; democracy and participation of the people; human dignity; equity; social justice; inclusiveness; equality; human rights; non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized; good governance; integrity; transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

ii. Conduct of State Officers

- 34. Article 77 of the Constitution outlines that a full-time State officer must not participate in any other gainful employment and that any appointed State officer must not hold office in a political party.
- 35. Moreover, the Constitution under Article 78 further stipulates that a State officer must not hold dual citizenship but instead shall be a citizen of Kenya only.
- 36. Article 232 provides for the values and principles of public service as: high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy-making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women, members of all ethnic groups and persons with disabilities.
- 37. The Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 outlines the obligations of a public officer as: professionalism; carrying out duties in accordance with the law; prohibition from unjust enrichment; avoiding conflict of interest; not using the office as an avenue for soliciting or collecting *harambees*; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, not practising nepotism or favouritism; giving impartial advice; conducting private affairs in a

way that maintains public confidence; not engaging in sexual harassment; and submission of a declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years.

iii. Qualifications for Appointment as Principal Secretary

- 38. Section 46(1) of the Public Service Commission Act, 2017 provides that the Public Service Commission, in nominating or recommending persons for appointment to public office
 - a) abide by the constitutional requirement of fair competition and merit as a basis of appointment; and
 - b) ensure that the appointment facilitates achievement of a representative public service.

iv. Leadership and Integrity

- 39. The Committee was guided by the provisions on leadership and integrity as stipulated under Chapter Six of the Constitution and the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012. In particular, Article 73(2) of the Constitution provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:
 - a) selection based on personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
 - b) objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - c) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by
 - i. honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - ii. the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
 - d) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - e) discipline and commitment in service to the people.
- 40. Article 75 of the Constitution requires a State Officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties. This Article further prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under it from holding any other State Office.
- 41. Article 77(1) of the Constitution prohibits a full-time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment.

- 42. Article 77(2) of the Constitution prohibits an appointed State officer from holding office in a political party. Article 78 of the Constitution disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan citizens from appointment as State Officers. Further, a State Officer is barred from holding dual citizenship.
- 43. In addition, the Committee considered Section 10 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 which provides that
 - "A State officer shall, to the best of their ability-
 - (a) carry out the duties of the office efficiently and honestly;
 - (b) carry out the duties in a transparent and accountable manner;
 - (c) keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and
 - (d) report truthfully on all matters of the organization which they represent."
 - c) Suitability of the nominee for the proposed appointment having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is made
- 44. The suitability of the nominee was assessed after scrutiny of her background, academic credentials and professional qualifications, work and professional experience, personal integrity as well as her performance during the approval hearing conducted on Wednesday 31st June, 2023.

3 APPROVAL HEARING

45. The Committee conducted the approval hearing for the nominee on Wednesday 21st June, 2023 and was guided by, among others, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the National Assembly Standing Orders.

3.1 Approval Hearing of Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco

46. Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco appeared before the Committee and was orally interviewed to examine her suitability or otherwise. The Committee noted the following:

Personal Background

47. The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen of Identification Card Number 11396537 and does not hold any other citizenship. She was born on 20th February, 1973 in Kiambu County.

Academic and Professional Qualifications

- 48. The nominee holds a Post Graduate Certificate in Trial Advocacy from Trial Advocacy Training Institute and Justice Africa; a Masters in Law (LL.M) on Leadership and Governance from the University of Nairobi; an advanced Diploma in Insurance from the Chartered Insurance Institute of London; a Post Graduate Diploma in Law from the Kenya School of Law; a Bachelor's Degree in Law (LL.B) from the University of Nairobi; a Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) from Precious Blood Riruta Secondary School; and a Kenya Certificate of Primary Education from Riruta Satellite Primary School.
- 49. The nominee is an advocate of the High Court with over twenty years of experience as a legal practitioner having been admitted to the bar on 12th March, 1998. She is also a certified public secretary since 1998.

Work and Professional Experience

- 50. The nominee has worked in the following capacities:
 - a) as a Managing Partner in the firm of Wanyonyi and Muhia Advocates from 2005 to date:
 - b) as a Board Member, Diocese of Murang'a Health Board from 2021 to date;
 - c) as a Board Member, the Association of Alumni Communication from 2021 to date;
 - d) as a Country Board Member, German Doctors Kenya from 2018 to date;

- e) as a Board Member, Supervisory Committee in the Law Society of Kenya (LSK) SACCO from 2017 to date;
- f) as a Director, Johari Schools Limited from 2012 to date;
- g) as a Legal Consultant, Bamburi Cement Co. Limited between March and July 2006;
- h) as Head of Legal Department, American International Group (AIG) Insurance Co.
 Ltd from 2001 to 2005;
- i) as a Legal Officer, Phoenix of East Africa Insurance Co. Ltd in 2000; and
- j) as a Legal Assistant, Insurance Company of East Africa Limited from 1998 to 2000.

Professional Associations

51. The nominee submitted that she is a member of the Law Society of Kenya and the Institute of Certified Secretaries Kenya.

Potential Conflict of Interest

52. The nominee declared that she is currently not associated with any persons or matters that would present a potential conflict of interest should she assume the office of Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services.

Sources of Income and Net-worth

- 53. The nominee estimated her net worth to be Ksh. 80 million comprising of jointly owned assets with her spouse and co-partner in the firm of Wanyonyi and Muhia Advocates.
- 54. She indicated that her current sources of income are from Wanyonyi and Muhia Advocates; dividends from Johari Schools Limited; and sitting allowances from the LSK SACCO and the Diocese of Murang's Health Board respectively.

Pro-bono/Charity Work

55. The nominee is involved in charity work through monetary donations to the Opus Dei, Wings of Compassion and Nyumba ya Wazee. She also provides free legal services to the German Doctors Kenya and the public in various areas including Kibera, Mathare, Ngomongo, and Korogocho.

Integrity

56. The nominee demonstrated integrity. She has not been charged in a court of law or mentioned in any investigatory reports of Parliament or any Commission of Inquiry in the last three (3) years. Further, she has never been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution.

3.2 General and Sector-Specific Questions to Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco

57. The Committee posed several questions to the nominee on her knowledge of the position of Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services. The nominee responded as follows: -

On reforms to the State Department for Correctional Services

- 58. The nominee stated that owing to her capacity as a legal practitioner and the well-resourced staff in the legal department at the State Department, she will spearhead reforms in the State Department through a review of the legal instruments including the Prisons Act, Cap 90, the Borstal Institutions Act, Cap 92, Community Service Orders Act, 1998 and the Probation of Offenders Act, Cap 64 to align it to Articles 28, 43 and 48 of the Constitution.
- 59. She emphasized that, if approved, she would request an additional budgetary allocation to improve the welfare of prisoners and wardens including adequate housing, good healthcare, recreational facilities, financial management, mental health and alcoholism.

On whether the nominee's qualifications as a lawyer and insurance expert suit the position in question

60. The nominee emphasized that being a practising advocate of the High Court, she has handled numerous criminal cases which give her a better understanding of correctional services and the criminal justice system. She noted that correctional services is the tail end of the justice process and thus a critical component of the administration of justice.

On the recovery of irregularly grabbed land from correctional facilities

61. The nominee reiterated the Supreme Court's decision that public land reserved for public utility cannot be sold to private persons. Hence, it was her opinion that in consultation with the Attorney General, she would request for more lawyers to be seconded to the State Department to amplify its efforts in dealing with cases of land grabbing.

- 62. She added that she would cooperate with the National Land Commission and the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission to address the issues of land grabbing facing correctional facilities.
- 63. She also stated that she would ensure that county governments seeking to repossess land occupied by prisons, construct correctional facilities and staff houses for wardens before relocating them.

On her knowledge of the State Department's operations and challenges

- 64. The nominee identified congestion as one of the main challenges facing the State Department. She added that, if approved, she would engage with the Judiciary and other relevant stakeholders to adopt non-custodial sentences in a bid to reduce congestion in prisons.
- 65. She emphasized the need for non-custodial sentences in revolutionizing the State Department by utilizing the labour provided by offenders serving such sentences in prison farms and industries to earn revenue.
- 66. Moreover, she noted that prisoners and wardens continue to live in deplorable conditions. She stated that she would advocate for the improvement of their living conditions in conformity with the Constitution on the right to human dignity and every person's right to good healthcare, decent housing and adequate food.

On whether she has the requisite experience in the criminal justice system

67. The nominee submitted that in the course of her work as a legal practitioner, she has handled several criminal cases in Kibera Law Courts and interacted with offenders. Moreover, she informed the Committee that she has visited several prisons where she witnessed the deplorable living conditions of both prisoners and wardens. She believed that this is sufficient experience in the criminal justice system.

On innovative ways to realize prison reforms in light of inadequate budgetary allocation

68. The nominee reiterated that she would ensure the available resources are utilized prudently, efficiently and in conformity with the principles of public finance as outlined in Article 201 of the Constitution. She added that she would also visit the correctional facilities to ascertain the proper implementation of their work plans.

- 69. Furthermore, she outlined that she would champion revenue increase through the utilization of prison labour in prison farms and industries. She emphasized the good quality of furniture made by prisoners and stated that, to boost the production of such products, she would advocate for the use of modern technology.
- 70. She added that, given the vast land of correctional facilities, she would encourage vertical construction as opposed to horizontal to maximize space while securing the other space for food production.
- 71. The nominee noted that she would advocate for a fully operationalized marketing and advertising department to promote the items produced by the prison industries. She expounded that, if approved, she would oversee the setting up of a SACCO for prisoners and the monies acquired from prison labour would be pro-rated and invested in the SACCO for successful reintegration into society.

On continuation of the efforts of the former PS to realize good living conditions for prisoners and prison officers

72. The nominee informed the Committee that she was conversant with the former PS's initiative of 'One Bed, One Mattress' and that she would further the same through the provision of adequate bedding and linen.

On the management of resources within the State Department

73. The nominee underscored that she is a firm believer in fiscal discipline. She emphasized that, if approved, she would derive her mandate from the Constitution and the Cabinet Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services.

On accurate and specific wealth declaration as a legal requirement

74. The nominee indicated her estimated net worth to be Ksh. 80 million derived from joint assets with her spouse and co-partner in the firm of Wanyonyi and Muhia Advocates.

On fitting in, in the civil service having never worked in government before

75. The nominee underscored that she would actively consult and work closely with the Cabinet Secretary and other officers within the State Department. She added that having been part of the team that prepared the Kenya Kwanza Manifesto, she fully understands the goals of the current administration and would be well-equipped to work in government.

76. She also expressed that she had interacted with various departmental heads in the State Department and appreciated that their vast knowledge and experience would be significant in achieving its set objectives.

On dual citizenship

77. She clarified that she is not a dual citizen.

4 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

4.1 Committee Observations on the Suitability of Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco

78. Pursuant to Section 6(7) and (8) and Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Committee made the following observations with regard to the following issues for consideration:

4.1.1 Procedure for Nomination

- 79. Pursuant to Article 155(3)(a) of the Constitution, the Committee observed that the procedure used to arrive at the nominee was lawful.
- 80. Further, the Committee found that the nominee was nominated by H.E The President from among the names of qualified persons forwarded to him by the Public Service Commission.

4.1.2 Constitutional and Statutory Requirements

81. The Committee found as follows:

- a) That the nominee is a Kenyan citizen and is not a citizen of any other country and therefore meets the requirement of Article 78(1) of the Constitution;
- That the nominee demonstrated an aspiration for integrity in public service and thus meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
 and
- c) The nominee, having been cleared by KRA, HELB, EACC, DCI, ORPP, with regard to tax compliance, higher education loan repayments, ethics and integrity, criminal records and political party affiliations has met the statutory requirements for appointment to the Office.

4.1.3 Suitability of the nominee for the proposed appointment having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is made

82. The suitability of the nominee was assessed after scrutiny of her background, academic credentials and professional qualifications, work and professional experience, personal integrity as well as her performance during the approval hearing conducted on Wednesday 21st June, 2023 and the Committee observed that:

- a) The nominee possesses the relevant experience for the position of Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services. She is a partner in a law firm and has vast experience in developing and managing strategies vital to the running of a firm. A background in management and organizational leadership is a critical tool for any person discharging the role of a Principal Secretary.
- b) The nominee exhibited a clear understanding of the current issues affecting the State Department for Correctional Services. She also shared practical strategies to address the issues. This places her in a suitable position to provide leadership to the State Department for Correctional Services.
- c) The nominee demonstrated a satisfactory understanding of the mandate of the State Department for Correctional Services; the need to promote a just and secure society through the effective administration of justice; and the significance of efficient management of offenders.
- d) The nominee is a Senior Advocate and Partner in a law firm. This demonstrates her ability to effectively manage the funds and resources of an organization. It further demonstrates her ability to discharge the role of an accounting officer that is required of a Principal Secretary.
- e) A nominee ought to accurately indicate their years of experience and employment. This should exclude any internship period.
- f) A nominee ought to provide an accurate and specific wealth declaration to enable the Committee to assess their net worth.

5 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

- 83. Having considered the suitability, capacity and integrity of the nominee, and pursuant to Article 155(3)(b) of the Constitution and Section 8(2) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Committee recommends that the National Assembly:
 - a) **approves** the appointment of **Ms. Salome Wairimu Muhia-Beacco** to the position of Principal Secretary of the State Department for Correctional Services.

The Legal Counsel took the Members through the criteria for vetting

- Pursuant to section 6(8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the criteria for vetting is comprehensively contained in the Questionnaire in the Schedule to the Act. The Questionnaire allows Committees to obtain information on, among other things, —
 - (a) Name of the nominee—to enable the Committee to ascertain the regional background and ethnicity of the nominee.
 - (b) Gender of the nominee—to enable the Committee to ascertain the gender of the nominee. This is to ensure compliance with Article 27(8) that requires the State to take measures to ensure that not more than two thirds of members of appointive bodies shall be of the same gender;

- (c) Age of the nominee—to enable the Committee to ascertain compliance with the provisions of Article 55 of the Constitution on inclusion of the youth in public appointments;
- (d) Nationality of the nominee—to enable the Committee to ascertain the nationality of the nominee. This is to ensure compliance with Article 78 of the Constitution which requires certain State officers to be Kenyan Citizens;
- (e) Educational background of the nominee;
- (f) Employment record of the nominee;
- (g) Honours or awards given to the nominee;
- (h) Membership of the nominee to professional bodies;
- (i) Public office and political affiliations held by the nominee—to enable the Committee to ascertain whether the nominee holds office in a political party. This is to ensure compliance with Article 77(2) of the Constitution which precludes appointed State officers from holding office in a political party;
- (j) Information on whether the nominee has been removed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution which prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under Article 75 (3) of the Constitution from holding any other State Office;
- (k) Nominee's finances;
- Outside commitments that the nominee intends to undertake while in office (if appointed). Article 77(1) of the Constitution prohibits a full time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment;
- (m) Tax compliance status of the nominee;
- (n) Potential conflict of interest—Article 75(1) of the Constitution bars State officers from engagements or association that may give rise to conflict between official or public duties and personal interests;
- (o) Whether a nominee has been charged in a court of law in the past three years; and
- (p) Whether a nominee has been adversely mentioned in a report of Parliament or a Commission of inquiry in the past three years.
- 2. The Questionnaire is largely formulated based on Constitutional and statutory requirements for State Officers and other considerations that are of importance in order to make a determination on the suitability of a nominee.

On academic and professional qualifications, the nominee stated that she holds a Certificate in Trial Advocacy, Trial Advocacy Training Institute and Justice Africa;2021; Masters in Law in Leadership and Governance (LLM), University of Nairobi;2015; Certificate Course in Mid-Level Management;2004; ACII, Certified Chartered Insurer (London); 2003; Certificate in MS Word 2000;2003; Post-Graduate Diploma in Law, Kenya School of Law;1997-1998; Bachelor of Laws (LLB), University of Nairobi;1992-1996; KCSE, Precious Blood Girls Riruta Secondary School;1987-1990; KCPE, Riruta Satellite Primary School, Nairobi; 1986

On her work and professional experience, the nominee stated that she is a managing partner at Wanyonyi and Muhia Advocates;2005 to date; a Legal Consultant, Bamburi Cement Co. Limited;March-July 2006; the Head of Legal Department, AIG Insurance Company Limited;2001-2005; a legal Officer, Phoenix of East African Insurance Company Limited;2000; a Legal Assistant, Insurance Company of East Africa Limited;1998-2000. The nominee further stated that she was the Director and Founder of Johari Schools Limited

On political associations, the nominee stated that she was a board member of the United Democratic Alliance National Election Board;2022

On her net-worth the nominee stated her net worth to be approximately Kshs 88 million held jointly with her husband

On whether her qualifications as an advocate the Nominee informed the Members that she has an experience of 25 years in the legal field having ran a law firm and also was part of the team that crafted the Kenya Kwanza manifesto.

On how she will recover prisons lands, the Nominee informed the meeting that the State Department and the Prison Department has a robust legal team that are up to the task, she also ensured the Committee that she will fully operationalize the legal department to repossess the illegally acquired prison lands.

On her experience to deal with reshuffles to different departments the Nominee informed the Committee that she was part of the team that crafted the Kenya Kwanza manifesto she therefore understands the goals of this government.

On her plans to achieve the goals set by her predecessor the Nominee informed the members that her predecessor has started a one man one bed program that she must make a priority to fulfill.

On how she will improve the Prison facility the Nominee stated that if approved she will effectively, prudently and efficiently monitor the funds appropriated by the National

Assembly, the Nominee also informed the Committee that she will Benchmark other countries such as Norway and Germany to help in searching the best practices.

On improvement of the probation services the Nominee stated that if approved she will rehabilitate, reintegrate the probation services by ensuring the department is well staffed and well managed.

On overcrowded prison facilities the Nominee informed the Committee that if approved with the assistance of the Justice and Legal Affairs Committee she will have a conversation with the judiciary to fast track some of the cases in order to avoid crowded prisons.

Closing remarks the Nominee asked for an increase in the budgetary allocation in order to improve the recreational and the mental health facilities.
