- 1. The Senate assembled at thirty Minutes past Two O'clock.
- 2. The proceedings were opened with Prayer said by the Deputy Speaker.

3. QUORUM OF THE SENATE

The Deputy Speaker, having counted the Honourable Senators present at the commencement of the Sitting and confirming that there was no Quorum, caused the Bell to be rung for ten minutes, pursuant to Standing Order 40;

And there being a Quorum after the expiry of ten minutes;

The Deputy Speaker invited the Clerk to call the Orders of the day.

4. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CHAIR

The Deputy Speaker conveyed the following communications from the Chair: -

i.) Address to Parliament by His Excellency the President, pursuant to Article 132 (1) (b) and (c) of the Constitution.

"Honourable Senators,

Article 132 (1) (b), mandates the President to address a special sitting of Parliament once every year. Article 132 (1) (c) also requires the President, once every year to-

i.Report, in an address to the nation, on all the measures taken and progress achieved in the realization of the national values, referred to in Article 10;

ii.Publish in the Gazette, the details of the measures and progress under sub-paragraph (i); and

iii.Submit a report to the National Assembly on the progress made in fulfilling the international obligations of the Republic.

Further, Article 240(7) of the Constitution requires the National Security Council to *"report annually to Parliament on the state of the security of Kenya."* Ordinarily, this report is submitted to Parliament during the address by the President referred to under Article 132 (1) (b), and Tabled in the Houses of Parliament.

Vide letter Ref. No OP/CAB.26/4A VOL.II/ (52), dated 26th September 2023, the Chief of Staff and Head of the Public Service, informed the Speakers of the Houses of Parliament of the intention of His Excellency the President to deliver his inaugural address to Parliament in accordance with Article 132(1) (b) and (c) of the Constitution. The Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service further requested the Speakers' concurrence to schedule the State of the Nation Address on Thursday, 9th November, 2023, at 2:30 p.m.

Honourable Senators,

Subsequently, and after consultation, the Speakers of the Houses of Parliament acceded to the request from His Excellency the President. A team of officers has been appointed by the Clerks to co- ordinate the event. Further details will be communicated through the Office of the Clerk.

I therefore take this opportunity, to inform you that His Excellency the President, will deliver his inaugural State of the Nation Address to Parliament during a Joint Sitting of the Houses of Parliament on Thursday, 9th November, 2023, at 2:30 p.m in the National Assembly Chamber.

ii.) Plenary sittings to consider proposed removal from office, by impeachment, of Hon. Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County.

"Honorable Senators,

You will recall that at the sitting of the Senate held on Tuesday, 31st October, 2023, I communicated the resolution of the Meru County Assembly, made on Wednesday, 25th October, 2023, for the removal from office, by impeachment, of Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County. Pursuant to Section 33(3) (a) of the County Governments Act and Standing Order 80(1) (a) of the Senate, I also read the charges against the Governor of Meru County to the Senate.

In a Supplementary Order Paper for the sitting held on Tuesday, 31st October, 2023, a Notice of Motion and Motion for the establishment of a Special Committee to hear the charges against the Governor of Meru County was listed pursuant to Section 33(3) (b) of the County Governments Act and Standing Order 80(1) (b) (i) of the Senate. Honourable Senators will however recall that

the Motion was negatived, and that being the case, the default position for the hearing of the impeachment charges against the Governor of Meru County will be held by the Senate sitting in Plenary, acting as the whole legislative body rather than a Special Committee.

Honourable Senators,

In line with the stipulated timelines in the County Governments Act and Standing Orders, a schedule of activities for the impeachment hearing in Plenary has been prepared. I have therefore appointed Tuesday, 7th and Wednesday 8th November, 2023, as the days when the Senate will investigate the proposed removal from office, by impeachment, of Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County. The morning sittings will commence at 9.00 am to 1.00 pm and afternoon sittings at 2.30 pm until conclusion of Business listed in the Order Paper of the day.

Consequently, in today's Order Paper at Order No. 9, a Procedural Motion for alteration of the meeting time of the Senate for Tuesday, 7th and Wednesday, 8th November, 2023, for the impeachment hearing against the Governor of Meru County has been listed in order to facilitate the Senate to conclude the matter within the timelines stipulated in the County Governments Act and the Senate Standing Orders.

7. **QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS**

STATEMENTS

a) Statement, pursuant to Standing Order 52(1)

Nominated Senator (Sen. Esther Okenyuri, MP) made a statement concerning the state visit to Kenya by His Majesty King Charles III and Her Majesty Queen Camilla of the United Kingdom (UK).

In the Statement, the Senator noted that the deep-rooted ties between Kenya and the United Kingdom transcends the colonial era. The Senator observed that presently, Kenya and the UK maintain a good trade relationship with goods and services exceeding Kshs. 100 Billion, being trade between the two countries. Further, the Senator highlighted the cultural and historical ties between the two countries noting the influence UK has on global affairs and international trade.

The Senator further noted the impossibility of overlooking the historical ramifications of colonial oppression that Kenyans endured during the British colonial rule, making specific reference to the struggle for independence and the State of Emergency in 1952. Consequently, the visit by their Majesties to Kenya was of paramount importance in serving as a mirror to our past relations and offering an opportunity to redefine and shape the future relationships of our countries.

In conclusion, the Senator urged the Senate to take a leading role in making a clear declaration on the terms of engagement between Kenya and the UK, thereby establishing the groundwork for addressing our shared history and forging new mutually beneficial relationship between the two countries.
