Rising in his place on a Point of Order pursuant to Standing Order 47(3), the Leader of the Minority Party (Hon. Opiyo Wandayi, EGH, MP) claimed that provisions of the Bill relating to the Offices of the Head of Public Service and the Chief Administrative Secretary as proposed in the Bill were unconstitutional. He sought the determination on the constitutionality of those provisions before proceeding with debate on the Bill;

The Speaker, having noted the weighty nature of the claim, undertook to rule on the matter during the Afternoon Sitting of Wednesday, March 20, 2024. Meanwhile, the Speaker directed that debate proceeds but the putting of the Question shall be done after the Ruling.

Debate interrupted on Thursday, March 14, 2024 resumed;

Rising in his place on a Point of Order pursuant to Standing Order 95, the Member for Kiambaa (Hon. John Njuguna, MP) claimed to move that the Mover be now called upon to reply;

And the Speaker being of the opinion that the claim was an abuse of proceedings and infringement on the rights of Members;

Thereupon, the Fourth Chairperson overruled the claim;

Debate resumed;

Rising in his place on a Point of Order pursuant to Standing Order 95, the Member for Kesses (Hon. Julius Ruto, MP) claimed to move that the Mover be now called upon to reply;

And the Speaker being of the opinion that the claim was not an abuse of proceedings or infringement on rights of Members;

Thereupon, Question put and <u>agreed to;</u>

Mover replied;

Putting of the Question pended as directed by the Speaker.
