6. QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

a) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 52(1)

Nominated Senator (Sen. Tabitha Mutinda, MP) on behalf of the Senator for Mandera County (Sen. Ali Ibrahim Roba, MP) made a Statement concerning the devastation caused by the heavy rains and flooding in several Member States of the Forum of Parliaments of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP -ICGLR).

In the Statement, the Senator highlighted that the FP-ICGLR had expressed deep sadness over the recent heavy rains and flooding in some Member States, which resulted in over 400 deaths and the displacement of more than 234,000 people, with Kenya being the hardest hit.

The Senator observed that the disaster had highlighted the region's vulnerability to climate change and the urgent need for regional and international cooperation to support long-term adaptation efforts. She noted that during the 14th Ordinary Session of the Plenary Assembly, which was held from April 15th to 19th, 2024, in Livingstone, Zambia, focus was placed on "The Role of Parliament in Adapting to Climate Change in the Great Lakes Region." The discussions emphasized the crucial role of Parliaments in formulating effective solutions and decisions for climate adaptation in the region. The Forum stressed the importance of collective efforts in addressing the challenges posed by climate change to ensure a stable and secure future for the Great Lakes Region.

In conclusion, the Senator conveyed the condolences of the FP-ICGLR and solidarity of the Forum with the governments, parliaments and to the people of Kenya, Tanzania, Rwanda and Burundi, who were grappling with the devastating effects of heavy rains and flooding.
