7. QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

a) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 52(1)

The Senator for Nandi County (Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP) made a Statement regarding the contempt of County Governors towards Senate Committees invitations.

Thereupon, the Senator stated that Senate Committees, in carrying out their oversight responsibilities over County Governments, regularly issue invitations to County Governors to attend meetings and address matters within the Committees' mandates. However, a troubling trend had emerged where some Governors consistently failed to honour these invitations, requesting postponements without valid justifications. This, Sen. Cherarkey stated, had hindered the effective discharge of the Committees' responsibilities, negatively impacting the Senate's oversight function.

The Senator cited the specific example of the Governor of Kisii who had failed to attend three meetings of the County Public Accounts Committee in the current calendar year, citing travel abroad as the reason. Additionally, the Governor of Isiolo County did not appear before the Devolution Committee and only provided written responses without any explanation for his absence.

The Senator, while emphasizing that such disobedience of Committee invitations constituted contempt of the Senate's authority and that, if left

unaddressed, it could erode public confidence in the institution, averred that use of Sections 18 and 19 of the Parliamentary Powers and Privileges Act by Committees to compel attendance may not work because the penalties provided were insufficient to deter such behaviour.

The Senator urged the House to consider amending Article 125 of the Constitution and the Parliamentary Powers and Privileges Act to introduce higher penalties for non-compliance, as well as legislative measures to grant it original jurisdiction to initiate impeachment proceedings against a County Governor for gross violations of the law and failure to uphold accountability.
