- 2. The proceedings were opened with a Prayer said by the Speaker.

#### 3. QUORUM OF THE SENATE

The Speaker, having counted the Honourable Senators present at the commencement of the sitting and confirming that there was no Quorum, directed that the bell be rung for ten minutes, pursuant to Standing Order 40;

And there being a Quorum before the expiry of the ten minutes;

The Speaker invited the Clerk to call the Orders of the day.

# 4. MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY - APPROVAL OF THE MEDIATED VERSION OF THE WATER (AMENDMENT) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILLS NO. 33 OF 2023)

The Speaker conveyed the following Message from the National Assembly:

"Honourable Senators,

I wish to report to the Senate that I have, pursuant to Standing Order 46 (3), received the following Message from the Speaker of the National Assembly regarding the decision of the National Assembly on the Senate amendments to the Gambling Control Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 70 of 2023).

The Message, dated Wednesday, 12th March, 2025, was received in the Office of the Clerk of the Senate on Wednesday, 12th March, 2025.

Pursuant to Standing Order 46(4), I now report the Message –

**"PURSUANT** to the provisions of Standing Order 41(1) and 148 (b) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby convey the following Message from the National Assembly—

WHEREAS, on Wednesday, 6<sup>th</sup> December 2023, the National Assembly passed the Gambling Control Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 70 of 2023) and thereafter referred the Bill to the Senate for consideration in accordance with Article 110(4) of the Constitution;

AND WHEREAS, on Tuesday, 8<sup>th</sup> October, 2024, the Senate considered and passed the said Bill with amendments and referred it back to the National Assembly in accordance with the provisions of Article 112(1)(b) of the Constitution;

FURTHER WHEREAS, on Thursday, 16<sup>th</sup> January 2025, the National Assembly <u>negatived</u> a Motion on consideration of the Senate amendments to the Gambling Control Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 70 of 2023), thereby committing the Bill to a Mediation Committee in accordance with the provisions of Article 112(2)(b) of the Constitution;

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Article 112 of the Constitution and Standing Orders 41(1) and 148(b) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby convey the said decision of the National Assembly to the Senate and seek the appointment of nine (9) Senators to a Mediation Committee to consider the Bill in accordance with Article 113 of the Constitution."

#### 5. QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

#### a) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 52 (1)

Nominated Sen. Hezena Lemaletian, MP, made a statement on a matter of national concern, namely; the state of insecurity in Samburu County.

Thereupon the Senator informed the Senate about the escalating insecurity in Samburu County, highlighting a recent incident on 27th February, 2025, where a public service vehicle was ambushed along the Maralal-Baragoi road resulting in two fatalities and several serious injuries.

The Senator expressed concern over the lack of adequate security measures despite repeated calls for enhanced security. She noted that the Maralal-Baragoi road remains a hotspot for criminal activity, with the government's failure to address the issue allowing criminals to operate with impunity leaving the local community vulnerable and living in constant fear.

The Senator condemned the attacks, conveyed condolences to the families of the victims, and reaffirmed her commitment to advocating for the security and well-being of the people of Samburu, who deserved to live without fear and have the right to travel safely within their county.

The Senator called upon the Ministry of the Interior and National Administration, as well as relevant security agencies, to take immediate action and deploy additional security personnel along the Maralal-Baragoi road to restore stability and security in the area.
