THAT, this House adopts the Report of the Budget & Appropriations Committee on the Second Supplementary Estimates for the Financial Year 2016/2017, laid on the Table of the House on Tuesday, June 6, 2017 and pursuant to the provisions of Article 223 of the Constitution and Standing Order 243, **approves-**

- (i) an increment of the total recurrent expenditure for Financial Year 2016/2017 by **Kshs. 6,493,177,978** in respect of the Votes as contained in the Schedule;
- (ii) an increment of the total capital expenditure for Financial Year 2016/2017 by **Kshs.42,132,984,988** in respect of the Votes as contained in the First Schedule;
- (iii) an overall increment in the total budget for Financial Year 2016/2017 by **Kshs.48,626,162,966** in respect of the Votes as contained in the First Schedule; and
- (iv) further resolves that the First Schedule forms the basis of the enactment of the Second Supplementary Appropriations Act, 2017.

“subject to:

- (a) ***Reallocation of Kshs. 507 million within the State Department for Irrigation under the ‘Irrigation and Land Reclamation’ programme from Thiba Dam to the National Irrigation Board to clear pending bills in the following projects: Kshs. 307 million for Bura Scheme Gravity Project, Kshs. 100 million for Dava River Flood Water Control Project, and Kshs. 100 million for Expanded National Irrigation Projects;***

MOTION ON THE BUDGET & APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE ON THE SECOND SUPPLEMENTARY ESTIMATES FOR 2016/2017

Notice is given that the Chairperson of the Budget and Appropriations Committee, Hon. Mutava Musyimi, M.P., wishes to move the following amendments to the Motion of the Budget & Appropriations Committee on the Second Supplementary Estimates for 2016/2017 —

THAT, the Motion be amended by inserting the following words immediately after the words “Second Supplementary Appropriations Act, 2017”–

“subject to:

- (a) *Increment of Ksh 300 million to the National Intelligence Service under the ‘National Security Intelligence’ programme for security-related interventions.*
- (b) *Increment of Ksh 2.5 billion to the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission under the ‘Management of Electoral Processes’ programme for initial payment of printing of ballot papers.*
- (c) *Reallocation of Ksh 90 million within the State Department of Arts and Culture from General Administration, Planning and Support Services as follows: Ksh 50 million to the Kenya Film Commission and Ksh 40 million to the Kenya Film Classification Board under the ‘Arts programme for payment for contracts for ongoing international and local marketing campaigns and procurement of censorship suite, respectively.*
- (d) *Effecting the consequential amendments to the First Schedule and the total sum approved accordingly.”*

The House resolved on Wednesday, January 25, 2017 as follows:-

- I. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on **Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party** be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.

- II. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), this House orders that, each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report submitted to the House, be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.

- III. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), this House orders that each speech in a debate on any **Sessional Paper** shall be limited as follows: -A maximum of sixty (60) minutes, with not more than ten (10) minutes for the Mover in moving and five (5) minutes for any other Member speaking, **including** the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party and that five (5) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and further that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.
