4. **NOTICE OF MOTION-**(Sen. George Khaniri) (Ministry of Education, Science and Technology)

WHEREAS Article 43(1)(f) and 53(1)(b) of the Constitution guarantees every citizen a right to education and every child a right to free and compulsory basic education, respectively;

NOTING that the Teachers Service Commission is mandated to handle employment, deployment, remuneration and discipline of teachers in public schools in Kenya;

CONCERNED that there are great disparities in the distribution of teachers in public schools across the country leading to oversupply in some schools and undersupply in others and ultimately leading to major teacher shortage especially in rural and marginalized areas;

APPRECIATING efforts made by the national government to improve the teacher pupil ratio to international standards in all public schools through yearly employment of teachers;

FURTHER CONCERNED that the statistics on the number and distribution of teachers in public schools is not readily available;

NOW THEREFORE, the Senate directs the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology to conduct a countrywide audit on the distribution of teachers in all public schools indicating the requisite establishment per school and the corresponding number of teachers who are in-post and further that the Ministry submits a report to the House on the matter within ninety (90) days.

5. STATEMENTS

a) Statements pursuant to Standing Order 45(2) (b)

- i) The Senator for Vihiga County (Sen. George Khaniri) sought a Statement from Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Health regarding increased cases of Pneumonia and resultant mortality especially in children under five years and the elderly.
- ii) The Senator for West Pokot County (Sen. (Prof.) John Lonyangapuo) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Education regarding the funding of low cost public boarding primary schools.
- iii) The Senator for Vihiga County (Sen. George Khaniri) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations regarding the campaign against the manufacture and consumption of second generation alcohol in the country.
- iv) The Senator for West Pokot County (Sen. (Prof.) John Lonyangapuo) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Energy regarding the last mile electricity connectivity project.
- v) The Senator for West Pokot County (Sen. (Prof.) John Lonyangapuo) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Finance, Commerce and Budget regarding the utilization of the equalization fund.
- vi) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Finance, Commerce and Budget issued a Statement regarding the regulatory and legal procedures for putting a Bank under receivership.

In the Statement, the Chairperson informed the House that once Central Bank of Kenya (CBK) establishes that a bank has violated the law or is facing certain deficiencies, it notifies the concerned bank, followed by an engagement with the CBK and the bank is given an opportunity to address the deficiencies or violations.

He also informed the Senate that notification of the Kenya Deposit Insurance Corporation (KDIC) of the adverse circumstances surrounding the concerned bank is subsequently done, followed by a discussion on the matter between CBK and KDIC, followed by a determination by the CBK in consultation with KDIC to place the bank under receivership. The CBK then considers the circumstances of the concerned bank and determines the best course of action. The chairperson further noted that formal appointment of KDIC by CBK as the receiver of the concerned bank is done, followed by a press release by CBK on placement of the bank under receivership, whereby stakeholders may also be informed directly and finally a gazettement of the receivership and moratorium is done.

The Chairperson further informed the House that all the regulations were followed in placing Dubai Bank, Imperial Bank and Chase Bank under receivership. In addition, the Chairperson informed the House that placing the banks under receivership was the most appropriate course of action because the banks could no longer operate viably.
