### 4. <u>MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ON THE APPROVAL OF</u> <u>THE COUNTY ASSEMBLIES POWERS AND PRIVILEGES BILL (SENATE</u> <u>BILL NO. 14 OF 2014)</u>

The Speaker conveyed the following Message from the National Assembly regarding the approval of the County Assemblies Powers and Privileges Bill (Senate Bill No. 14 of 2014).

"Hon. Senators,

"Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 41 (1) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby convey the following message from the National Assembly-

Whereas, the County Assemblies Powers and Privileges Bill No. 14 of 2014) was published vide Kenya Gazette Supplement No. 54 of 22<sup>nd</sup> April, 2014 as a Bill concerning County Governments, seeking to give effect to the provisions of Article 196 (3) of the Constitution by providing for the powers, privileges and immunities of county assemblies, their committees and members and to make provisions regulating admittance to and conduct within the precincts of county assemblies;

WHEREAS the said Bill was passed by the Senate on Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> December, 2014 and referred to the National Assembly for consideration;

AND WHEREAS; the National Assembly passed the said Bill on Wednesday, 5<sup>th</sup> October 2016 <u>without amendments</u> and in the form passed by the Senate;

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Article 110 of the Constitution and Standing Order 41 (1) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby convey the decision of the National Assembly to the Senate."

Consequently, pursuant to Article 110 (5) of the Constitution, the Bill will be referred to the President for Assent.

#### 6. STATEMENTS

#### a) **STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 45 (2) (b)**

i) The Senator for Bungoma County (Sen. Moses Wetang'ula) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations concerning the Kenya refugees from

Uganda who have been camping at the Senate gate since Monday,  $10^{\text{th}}$  October, 2016 to date.

ii) The Senator for Nyeri County (Sen. Mutahi Kagwe) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations regarding visa processing reciprocity between Kenya and European nations such as Switzerland and the United Kingdom.

### b) STATEMENT PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 45 (2) (a)

The Senator for Garissa County (Sen. Yusuf Haji) made a statement on an issue of topical concern regarding the plight of the Makonde people living in Kwale County.

Thereupon, the Senator informed the House that Kenya hosts a significant population of the Makonde people residing in Kwale County who first came into the country from Mozambique as labourers over 50 years ago. He informed the House that their population had been increasing over the period since they came to Kenya to a population of about 3,000 persons.

The Chairperson also informed the House that despite having been in the country for decades, the Makonde remain unrecognized by the state and thus are stateless, which had led to stigmatization, alienation and poverty as they could not access formal employment owing to lack of national identification documents.

He called upon the Government to recognize the Makonde community by providing them with citizenship through issuance of relevant documentation to enable them enjoy privileges as citizens of Kenya.

**COGNIZANT** that Article 54 (1) (b) of the Constitution provides that a person with any disability is entitled to access educational institutions and facilities for persons with disabilities that are integrated into society to the extent compatible with the interests of the person;

**RECOGNIZING** that education in Kenya is a shared function of both the county and national governments;

**CONCERNED** that while significant gains have been made under the Free Education Programme introduced in the year 2003, access and participation of children with special needs is generally low across the country and their needs have not been specifically addressed;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Senate directs the Standing Committee on Education to inquire into the performance of the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology in the implementation of the policy statements and strategies made in the National Special Needs Education Policy Framework, 2009 and report back to the Senate within three months.
