Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Health

(i) Question No. 036/2016 by the Member for Matungulu (The Hon. Stephen Mule, M.P.):

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee whether the Ministry is aware that the Global Vaccine Alliance Organization (GAVI) has frozen its cash-based support to Kenya for purchase of vaccines since 2010 due to unanswered audit queries on funds previously

disbursed; why the Ministry has not been preparing the audit reports and financial statements for Kenya's Immunization Support Services (ISS) grant and Health System Strengthening 1(HSS1) grant programmes; why the Ministry has not been providing financial statements to GAVI responding to the audit queries raised on the grants; what remedies has the Ministry made after the loss of the \$34 million funding from GAVI for these two programmes, including providing the timelines and reports on the proposed remedies; and provide information on the status of the funds still unaccounted for under the ISS and HSS1 programmes?

(ii) Question No. 038/2016 by the Member for Mukurweini (The Hon. Kabando wa Kabando, M.P.):

Considering that Article 43 of the Constitution provides that "every person has the right to the highest attainable standard of health, which includes the right to health care services, including reproductive health care; a person shall not be denied emergency medical treatment; and that the State shall provide appropriate social security to persons who are unable to support themselves and their dependents", could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee, what measures are being taken to increase accessibility and affordability to quality healthcare to all Kenyans through the National Health Insurance Fund?

(iii)Question No. 039/2016 by the Member for Kirinyaga Central (The Hon. Joseph Gitari, M.P.):

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the amount of funds set aside for the construction of an ultra-modern teaching, research and referral hospital at the Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI)'s precincts in Kirinyaga County; state the grounds by which KEMRI's Assistant Director for Human Resources at Kirinyaga, Ms. Anne Wang'ombe of Personal No. 22045, was dismissed from her post, clarify whether the matter has been investigated, and further enlighten Members on measures, if any, that have been put in place to ensure that her Constitutional rights have not been violated nor have labour laws been flouted?

(iv) Question No.075/2016 by the Member for Molo (The Hon. Jacob Macharia, M.P.):

Could the Cabinet Secretary explain to the Committee the reason why the Ministry has not taken over the management of the Mkolombozi and Mchorwe Dispensaries including the doctors' quarters in both dispensaries despite completion of construction by the Molo Constituencies Development Fund; why the Ministry has not made the Children's ward and Maternity wings of the Molo Level 4 Hospital since its construction 4 years ago; and why the mortuary's cold room is not functional?

(v) Question No.076/2016 by the Member for Homa Bay (The Hon. Peter Kaluma, MP): Considering that the population of Homa Bay County has increased exponentially to over one million people traversing an area of 3,154.7 km²; and further in view of the fact that this

development continues to put great strain on the few medical facilities in the region thereby compromising the quality of healthcare, could the Cabinet Secretary inform Honourable Members on the timelines for elevating Homa Bay County Referral Hospital into a Level 5 Hospital?

II. <u>Questions under the Departmental Committee on Agriculture, Livestock and</u> <u>Cooperatives</u>

Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries

(i) Question No.074/2016 by the Member for Wajir South (The Hon. Abdullayi Diriye, M.P.):

Considering that the government has put in in place measures to mitigate losses incurred by cattle owners in Northern Kenya; could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the amount of money that was allocated and disbursed to the Kenya Meat Commission during the 2014/2015 financial year; the number of cattle and amount of money used to purchase cattle from cattle owners during the 2014/2015 financial year; and clarify allegations that about Kshs.400 Million budgeted for purchasing of cattle from farmers during the 2014/2015 financial year was misappropriated?

(ii)Question No.082/2016 by the Member for Bomet Central (The Hon. Ronald K. Tonui, M.P.):

Considering that H.E. the President recently gave a directive for the waiver of all taxes in the tea sector, could the Cabinet Secretary, list the specific taxes that have been waived from the tea sector; state the amount of tax waived per kilogram of tea and the amount by which tea farmers will benefit as a result of this waiver; state the eventual increase in the price of a kilogram of tea, both processed and unprocessed; and outline measures to ensure that the new fuel levies imposed under the 2016/2017 Budget do not wipe off the tea tax waiver, thus making the waiver of no substantial net effect?

(iii)Question No.083/2016 by the Member for Manyatta (The Hon. John Muchiri Nyaga, M.P.):

Considering that Kithimu Horticultural Market in Manyatta Constituency of Embu County was earmarked for construction through the Smallholder Horticulture Marketing Programme (SHOMaP) under the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries with a view to improving farm productivity and enhanced incomes from fruits, vegetables and grain, the latter of which is a predominant crop in the region; could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on reasons behind the stalling of the market's construction; state the timelines within which construction shall resume inclusive of the anticipated completion date; and further aver that the longterm benefits of the market to Manyatta farmers shall include improved farm productivity as well as enhanced quality and consumption of fruits, vegetables and grains as envisaged under the SHOMaP Programme?

III. Questions under the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources

Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Water and Irrigation

(i) Question No. 041/2016 by the Member for Kajiado County (The Hon. Mary Seneta, M.P.):

Considering that Kitengela Town is one of the fastest growing urban areas in East and Central Africa, could the Cabinet Secretary explain to the Committee the reasons why the town does not have any registered Water Services Provider long after the enactment of the Water Act 2002; state the actions that have been taken against public officers, including the Chief Executive Officer of Tanathi Water Services Board, who ignored a directive by H.E. the President to establish a Water Service Provider in Kitengela Town in 2014; and further apprise the Committee on timelines within which this institution shall be set up in Kitengela?

(ii)Question No.091/2016 by the Member for Machakos County (The Hon Susan Musyoka, MP):

Considering that Yatta farrow in Yatta Constituency is a key source of water and livelihood for over 100,000 people in Yatta and that over the last few years there have been prolonged closures of the farrow for desilting works funded by African Development Bank, disrupting the supply of water to thousands of households resulting in scarcity of water; could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee when the works will be completed; and plans, if any, to allow some reasonable water distribution on a weekly basis through the canal to the affected areas even as the work is on-going?

(iii) Question No.092/2016 by the Member for Bura (The Hon. Ali Wario, M.P.):

Considering that the Government initiated the Bura Irrigation and Settlement Scheme Rehabilitation Project aimed at enhancing the standard of living of the inhabitants of Bura and resettling about 2500 farming families in the said area through the rehabilitation of irrigation and agricultural drainage systems (i.e. Bura Gravity Project), and additional rehabilitation of infrastructure of about 5500 hectares on the west bank of the River Tana; further in view of the fact that the project consists of remedial and emergency works, construction of new gravity intake with its related structures, construction of a supply canal, rehabilitation of field roads; and in light of the fact that the Project commenced in 2013, could the Cabinet Secretary state the total cost of the Bura Gravity Project and provide Progress Status Report indicating the timelines involved considering that the delayed completion of the Project has led to the loss of lives and livestock?
