3. <u>COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR ON A RETREAT BETWEEN THE</u> <u>SENATE AND THE TRANSITION AUTHORITY</u>

The Speaker made the following Communication from the Chair-

"Honourable Senators,

You may recall, my communication on the 28th May, 2015, in which I informed you that the Transition Authority in collaboration with the Senate has organized a two days retreat to be held at the Serena Beach hotel, Mombasa, from the 18th to 21st of June, 2015 with travel dates being 18th and 21st.

Honourable Senators,

As I indicated in my earlier communication, the retreat is aimed at sharing experiences on the transition to devolved government, taking stock of what has been done and how much still remains to be done for the full transition to be realized. The key areas of discussion shall be-

- 1. Inventory and audit of assets and liabilities;
- 2. Transfer and costing of functions;
- 3. County Umbrella Retirement Scheme;
- 4. Capacity Assessment and Rationalization of Public Service (CARPS) programme
 - i) County Capacity Assessment of uptake functions,
 - ii) County Assemblies' capacity-building,

- iii) County Public Service capacity-building,
- iv) County Executive Committee members' capacity-building,
- v) County legislation capacity-building,
- vi) Transfer and closure of public records and information, and
- vii) Human resource deployment in the public service;
- 5. Urban Areas and Cities Amendment Act;
- 6. Audit of ongoing reforms, projects and programmes; and
- 7. Review of performance of concurrent functions.

Honourable Senators,

An elaborate programme to afford Senators an opportunity to critically discuss issues that have impeded the realization of devolution has been prepared. Resource persons are drawn from the Senate and the Transition Authority.

The expected output of the retreat is to define the next steps, determine the type of support required to complete the unfinished work and an exit mechanism. I therefore urge all of you to find time and attend this crucial meeting to make your contribution.

4. PETITIONS

i) <u>Establishment of the status of Olmorongi Keenyokie Trust on</u> <u>Olmorogi Parcel Land: Ngong/Ngong/1959</u>
