4. STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 45 (2) (B)

- a) The Senator for West Pokot County (Sen. (Prof.) John Lonyangapuo) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Education concerning school fees levied by secondary schools, teacher training colleges and medical training colleges.
- b) The Vice-Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Roads and Transportation issued a supplementary statement on the ongoing renovation of the Kimbimbi-Sagana-Kagio-Kutus and Ngurubani – Kimbimbi roads.

In the statement, the Vice-Chairperson informed the House that the Sagana-Kagio-Kutus road originally had a carriageway width of 6m and unpaved shoulders of 1m on each side. The Vice-Chairperson further informed the House that the shoulders and some parts of the carriageway on the road had been eroded over time, leading to narrowing of the road. Consequently, KeNHA planned to progressively reinstate the road to its original state, and had commenced restoration of the sections between Sagana and Kagio.

The Vice-Chairperson further informed the House that the ongoing renovation of the Sagana-Kagio-Kutus road had been scheduled to be completed in June, 2016, but was delayed by unfavourable weather conditions in the months of March, April and part of May, 2016.

23. MOTION - TO DIRECT THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY TO CONDUCT A COUNTRYWIDE AUDIT ON THE DISTRIBUTION OF TEACHERS IN ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS INDICATING THE REQUISITE ESTABLISHMENT PER SCHOOL AND THE CORRESPONDING NUMBER OF TEACHERS WHO ARE IN-POST

WHEREAS Article 43(1)(f) and 53(1)(b) of the Constitution guarantees every citizen a right to education and every child a right to free and compulsory basic education, respectively;

NOTING that the Teachers Service Commission is mandated to handle employment, deployment, remuneration and discipline of teachers in public schools in Kenya;

CONCERNED that there are great disparities in the distribution of teachers in public schools across the country leading to oversupply in some schools and undersupply in others and ultimately leading to major teacher shortage especially in rural and marginalized areas;

APPRECIATING efforts made by the national government to improve the teacher pupil ratio to international standards in all public schools through yearly employment of teachers;

FURTHER CONCERNED that the statistics on the number and distribution of teachers in public schools is not readily available;

NOW THEREFORE, the Senate directs the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology to conduct a countrywide audit on the distribution of teachers in all public schools indicating the requisite establishment per school and the corresponding number of teachers who

are in-post and further that the Ministry submits a report to the House on the matter within ninety (90) days.
