You may further recall that I informed the Senate that, in accordance with Article 113(1) of the Constitution, I had appointed the following five (5) Senators to a mediation committee to attempt to develop a version of the Bill that both Houses would pass–

- 4. Sen. (Dr.) Boni Khalwale; and
- 5. Sen. Janet Ong'era.

Hon Senators, I would like to inform the House that I have revised the Senate membership to mediation committee to four (4) Senators as follows-

- 3. Sen. (Dr.) Boni Khalwale; and
- 4. Sen. Janet Ong'era.

This is in order to ensure equal number of members from each House in line with Article 113(1) of the Constitution because the National Assembly membership to the committee is four (4). The Members are-

## 7. STATEMENTS

Pursuant to standing order 45(2)(b), the Vice-Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Information and Technology issued a statement regarding malfunctioning of Samsung mobile phones.

Thereupon, the Vice-Chairperson informed the Senate that malfunctioning of some Samsung mobile phones may have been caused by installation, by users, of incompatible applications or simultaneous running of applications beyond the memory capacity of the mobile phone. The Vice-Chairperson

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also informed the Senate that malfunctioning could also have been caused by purchase of and/or use of counterfeit brands which attract purchasers due to their low prices.

The Vice-Chairperson stated that the government, through the Communications Authority of Kenya (CAK), undertakes assessments of communication devices to ascertain whether they meet required standards. The Ministry of Information, Communication and Technology, through the Anti-counterfeit Authority of Kenya, was also running a sensitization campaign to educate the public against purchase of counterfeit goods.

The Vice-Chairperson advised the public to verify whether the devices they were purchasing were genuine before buying which in the case of mobile phones could be done through the short messaging service (SMS) by sending the serial number of the mobile device to mobile code 1555.
