# (i) <u>NOTICE OF MOTION</u> – <u>DECLARATION OF KAMUKUNJI GROUNDS AS</u> <u>A NATIONAL MONUMENT</u>

(Hon. Yusuf Hassan Abdi, M.P.)

**THAT**, aware that the Kamukunji grounds is undoubtedly one of the most important public spaces in Kenya's political history; further aware that it was here that our national leaders held groundbreaking political rallies that mobilized the masses in the struggle for freedom and independence from colonial rule; cognizant of the fact that for the last 40 years, the Kamukunji grounds have continued to play a significant role in the Kenyan peoples' struggle for human rights and democracy, specifically the Saba Saba Rally that brought an end to the one-party rule ushering in a new era of multi-party democracy; concerned that the historic ground has been forgotten and neglected yet the great men and women of this great nation suffered so that we could be free; this House resolves that the Government declares the Kamukunji grounds a protected national monument and a historic place of great importance and transforms it into a safe and livable public space for present and future generations.

#### (ii) NOTICE OF MOTION - ESTABLISHMENT OF A SELECT COMMITTEE TO INQUIRE INTO THE CIRCUMSTANCES &FORCES BEHIND VULNERABILITY OF YOUNG PERSONS TO RADICALIZATION (Hon. Kanini Kega, M.P.)

**THAT**, aware that national security, peace and stability is integral for national development; worried that the stability of Kenya continues to be susceptible to sporadic terror attacks by militant groups; further concerned that the escalating incidences of terrorism and violence could be attributed to radicalization of young people; alarmed that the number of young persons from across the country being lured or coerced into joining

radical terrorist organizations continues to increase; concerned that despite the history of extremism and radicalization in the country, little empirical inquiry has been conducted to determine the forces behind youth vulnerability to religious and other forms of of radicalization: cognizant the fact that spontaneous and reactionary Governmentresponses in combating extremism and radicalization has borne little fruit; appreciating the role that comprehensive understanding of factors behind radicalization and extremism can play in overcoming this vice; this House resolves to establish a select Committee to inquire into and report within ninety (90) days on the circumstances and forces behind vulnerability of young persons to radicalization, and approves the following Members to constitute the Committee:-

#### (iii) NOTICE OF MOTION – IMPROVING MANAGEMENT OF CANCER IN THE COUNTRY (Hon. Gladys Wanga, M.P.)

THAT, aware that cancer is a leading cause of death globally with more than 70% of all cancer deaths occurring in developing countries; further aware that in Kenya, the disease ranks third among the main causes of death after infections and cardiovascular diseases and accounts for up to 18,000 deaths annually, with over 82,000 new cases reported annually; noting that over one-third of cancer patients experience clinical anxiety and depression, profoundly affecting the families psychologically and economically; cognizant of the fact that some of the patients travel up to 600 kilometers to Kenyatta National Hospital (KNH), the only public hospital that hosts most of the oncologists in Kenya; further cognizant of the fact theremaining small number of oncologistsare mainly based in Nairobi; deeply concerned that only a few patients get admission or outpatient treatment due to monetary constraints; this House resolves that the Government mitigates the situation by offering scholarships to at least one (1) Medical Masters student per County to study oncology, and signing contractual agreements with them to serve in designated cancer treatment and management centres; building partnerships with existing medical institutions in local public universities for provision of training opportunities; and emphasizing on the use of telemedicine and E-Medicine to eliminate distance barriers and improve access to medical services.

#### (i) National Employment Authority Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 8 of 2015)

#### New Clause 45 proposed -

**THAT**, the Bill be amended by adding new clause 45 immediately after clause 44 as follows:-

Transitional and saving provisions

45. (1) Upon the commencement of this Act, the functions that were immediately before the commencement of this Act being undertaken by the National Employment Bureau within the Ministry responsible for labour shall be transferred to the Authority.

(2) All property, assets, rights, powers, liabilities and duties, whether arising under any written law or otherwise, which immediately before the commencement of this Act were vested in, imposed on or enforced against the Government in respect of the National Employment Bureau shall, on the commencement of this Act, be transferred to, vested in, imposed on or be enforceable against the Authority.

(3) The lawful directions, orders, rules, authorizations and other things published, made, given or done by the National employment Bureau relating to its functions subsisting at the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been published, given, made or done by the Authority.

(4) Any legal act or thing done or purported to be done or any act or thing omitted to be done on behalf of, or in the name of the National Employment Bureau that relates to its functions before the commencement of this Act, by any person acting in good faith and with due or apparent authority in that behalf shall be deemed to be an act or thing made or done or omitted to be done by the Authority.

(5) The Cabinet Secretary for Finance, may, in consultation with the Cabinet Secretary, by Order in the Gazette direct that any assets and liabilities which immediately before the Commencement of this act, were vested in the government for the use of the National Employment Bureau shall on such commencement vest in the Authority.

(6) Every person who immediately before the commencement of this Act, was an employee of the National Employment bureau shall, upon the commencement of this Act, be employed or appointed as a member of Staff of the Authority for the unexpired period, if any, of the term.

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(7) The employees of the Government who were, immediately before the commencement of this Act, serving in the National Employment Bureau at the Ministry responsible for Labour shall, upon the commencement of this Act be given a option to serve in the Authority and if not appointed by the Authority be redeployed in the Public Service.
