#### 3. **PETITIONS**

The following Petitions were reported to the Senate-

# i) Breach of the Constitution and other Laws by the County Executive and County Assembly of Machakos County

Pursuant to Standing Order 220 (1) (a), the Speaker reported to the Senate a petition received, in the office of the Clerk, from residents of Machakos County concerning breach of the Constitution and other laws by the County Executive and County Assembly of Machakos County.

Pursuant to Standing Order 226, the Speaker invited Senators to comment on the petition and directed that the Petition be committed to the Standing Committee on Finance, Commerce and Budget pursuant to Standing Order 227.

# ii) Unlawful Establishment and Operation of a Municipal Court by the Nakuru County Government

#### 5. STATEMENTS

#### a) Statements pursuant to Standing Order 45(2) (b)

- i) The Senator for West Pokot County (Sen. (Prof.) John Lonyangapuo) sought a statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations, concerning insecurity along the Turkana and West Pokot County boundary, particularly alleged breach to security posed by the construction of a road From Kainuk in Turkana County to Sarmach in West Pokot County, thereby reneging on a peace agreement between the two Counties.
- ii) The Senator for West Pokot County (Sen. (Prof.) John Lonyangapuo) sought a statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Labour and Social Welfare, concerning the status of the once world famous East African Safari Rally.
- iii) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Lands and Natural Resources issued a Statement regarding the pollution of Athi River in Machakos and Makueni Counties.

Thereupon, the Chairperson informed the House that he was aware of the disposal of effluent into Athi River and that the Ministry of Environment, Water and Natural Resources is in the process of addressing the problem.

The Chairperson also formed the House that no Environmental Impact Assessment had been carried out on Athi River and that no action had been taken on officers of the National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA) for dereliction of duty as no officer was found culpable.

The Chairperson further informed the House that NEMA had offices in Makueni and that adequate budgetary allocation would be made for cleanup of the Athi River.

#### b) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 45(2) (c)

### 7. MOTION - REINTRODUCTION OF THE UNTRAINED TEACHER (UT) PROGRAMME AS WELL AS IN-SERVICE TRAINING FOR UNTRAINED TEACHERS IN THE NORTH EASTERN REGION

(Department of Education)

Motion made and Question proposed;

**THAT AWARE** that the country in general and North Eastern region, in particular, currently face an acute shortage of teachers;

**NOTING** that the problem in schools in North Eastern region counties has been exacerbated by the recent refusal by teachers to report to their duty stations in the region;

**CONCERNED** that, the National Government has no plans to overturn the current freeze on regular recruitment of teachers;

The Senate calls upon the National Government to immediately reintroduce the untrained teacher (UT) programme as well as in-service training for untrained teachers in the North Eastern region as a measure to bridge the shortage of teachers in the region.
