4. STATEMENTS

(a) Statements pursuant to Standing Order 45(2)(b)

- i) Nominated Senator (Sen. Godliver Omondi) sought a statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations regarding the security of persons living with albinism in the country.
- ii) The Senator for Kisii County (Sen. Christopher Obure) issued a statement on behalf of the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Roads and Transportation, on the status of road construction projects in urban centres by the Kenya Urban Roads Authority (KURA), as had been requested by Senator for Trans Nzoia County (Sen. Henry Ole Ndiema).

In his response, the Sen. Obure informed the Senate that KURA conducts feasibility studies which enables it to establish the status of roads that require urgent intervention, the traffic volumes and capacity of towns as well as areas that require decongestion. He tabled a list of new roads designed and constructed by KURA since its inception, as well as a list of the roads repaired under routine and periodic maintenance.

The Acting Chairperson also informed the Senate that KURA had repaired several roads within Kitale Municipality including rehabilitation with asphalt concrete overlay. He stated that in the Financial Year 2015/2016, KURA had advertised for routine and periodic maintenance of road projects to be undertaken as per its Annual Work Plan and that KURA has been in consultation with the county governments regarding road prioritization and preparation of the Annual Work Plan as well as involving them in running of the projects.

iii) The Senate Deputy Majority Leader issued a statement on El-Nino preparedness across the counties as had been requested by Nominated Senator Catherine Mukiite.

The Deputy Majority Leader informed the Senate that the El-Nino rains were expected in most parts of the country and that the hazards associated with the excessive rainfall as had been forecasted by the Kenya Meteorological Department include; flooding, landslides and lightning strikes, outbreaks of waterborne diseases and human population displacement.

The Deputy Senate Majority Leader further informed the Senate that the Ministry of Health, working with county governments, development partners and health sector stakeholders had put in place preparedness measures which include sensitization of all county health departments to put in place mechanisms to counter the adverse effects of the rains; convening of a disaster risk management inter-agency coordinating committee with a contingency plan costing Kshs. 2.9 billion; advise to county health departments to plan for El-Nino with their county multi-sector stakeholders; and stepping up of surveillance for water-related diseases countrywide.

The Speaker directed the Senate Deputy Majority Leader to bring a further response on Thursday, 5th November, 2015.

- (j) in addition to what is provided for under any other relevant law, develop and maintain a code of conduct and ethics for the office, specific to auditing, guided by the international code of practice, and code of ethics issued by the International Organization of Supreme Audit Institutions and in consultation with the Public Service Commission and the National Treasury;

- (c) the appointment of a person as Auditor-General is pending; or
- (d) the Auditor General is, for any reason unable to perform the function of his or her office,

then, until a person is appointed to and has assumed the functions of that office in accordance with Section 11 above, or until the Auditor-General

has resumed the performance of those functions, the Public Service Commission shall recommend the most senior officer in the office of the Auditor-General to the President to designate such a person as the acting Auditor –General.

- (2) A person designated under subsection (1) shall meet the minimum qualifications for appointment to the office of the Auditor-General and shall serve for a period not exceeding ninety days.
- (3) When acting in terms of subsection (1), the acting Auditor-General shall have all the powers of the Auditor-General.

17. <u>MOTION – CALLING UPON THE GOVERNMENT TO CONSIDER FORMULATING</u> ADDITIONAL POLICY INTERVENTIONS TO MITIGATE THE PROBLEM OF TRAFFIC CONGESTION IN NAIROBI METROPOLITAN REGION

(Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure)

Motion made and Question proposed-

THAT, **AWARE** that traffic congestion in Nairobi Metropolitan Region is increasingly becoming worse leading to increased costs, longer travel times, constrained economic productivity and adverse health and environmental externalities;

CONCERNED that the economic cost of the congestion is estimated to be Kshs.1 billion annually on account of wasted man-hours and wasted fuel due to vehicular queuing;

APPRECIATING the government's effort in mitigating the problem by expanding infrastructure and initiating other interventions such as installation of traffic lights in the Central Business District;

The Senate now calls upon the Government to consider formulating additional policy interventions to mitigate the problem by:-

- 1. Enacting legislation to allow only high capacity public transport to operate in the city; and
- 2. Creating regulations to:
 - a) Require all deliveries to business premises to be done at night;
 - b) Require construction on roads that are in use to be done at night; and
 - c) Reroute heavy commercial vehicles to use the bypasses.

18. <u>MOTION- URGING THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT AND THE MINISTRY OF</u> LAND, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT TO URGENTLY ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO SURVEY, MARK AND FIX BEACONS FOR ALL THE COUNTY BOUNDARIES

(Department of Land)

GIVEN the clear provisions of Article 6 (1) and the First Schedule which establishes the 47 counties of the Republic of Kenya;

CONSIDERING the clear provisions of the Districts and Provinces Act (Cap 105 A) of 1992 which specifically delineates the geographical boundaries of each county;

NOTING the provisions of Article 188 of the Constitution, which clearly state that the boundaries of a county may be altered only by a resolution of an Independent Commission set up for that purpose by Parliament and with the support of at least two-thirds members of the National Assembly and two-thirds of the county delegations in the Senate;

FURTHER NOTING that the boundaries in counties have not been surveyed and no beacons have been fixed;

CONCERNED that failure by the National Government to mark and fix the county boundaries has led to endless and sometimes violent conflicts, in which innocent Kenyans have been killed and their property destroyed, and is generally perpetuating poverty and underdevelopment in counties;

THIS HOUSE urges the Office of the President and the Ministry of Land, Housing and Urban Development to urgently establish a Task Force to survey, mark and fix beacons for all the county boundaries and to submit a report of the said Task Force to this House on or before 31st March, 2016.
