4. <u>THE ELECTION LAWS (AMENDMENT) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO.37 OF</u> 2016)

Order for Second Reading read;

Motion made and Question proposed -

THAT, the Election Laws (Amendment) Bill (National Assembly Bill No.37 of 2016) be now read a Second Time;

(The Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of Minority Party – 31.08.2016 (PM))

Debate interrupted on Wednesday, August 31, 2016 (Afternoon Sitting) resumed

Rising in his place under Standing Order 95, the Member for Ainabkoi (Hon. Samuel Chepkonga) claimed to move that the Mover be called upon to reply;
