Statements pursuant to Standing Order 45(2)(b)

- (i.) The Senator for Trans Nzoia County (Sen. Henry ole Ndiema) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations regarding the killing of Mr. Joshua Mwangi, a first year student at Maseno University.
- (ii.) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations issued a Statement regarding a demonstration that was allegedly held along Harambee Avenue on 29th September, 2015.

Thereupon the Chairperson informed the Senate that he was not aware of any demonstration or any person or group of persons who were denied the right to demonstrate along Harambee Avenue or Parliament road on 29th September, 2015 and that from the records of the Nairobi County Police Commander, there was no person who had notified the police of any intention to demonstrate.

The Chairperson also informed the Senate that police accorded all citizens equal treatment and, in discharging their duties, police are guided by Article 3 of the Constitution and other relevant laws.

NOW THEREFOR the Senate notes the report of the Inter-Parliamentary Union Expert Mission to Kenya on the framework to implement the constitutional provision of the two-thirds gender rule laid on the Table of the Senate on Thursday, 8th October, 2015 and extends its appreciation to the IPU for the support on the matter.
