WEDNESDAY, JUNE 04, 2014

1. The House assembled at Nine O'clock.
2. The Proceedings were opened with Prayer.
3. **PRESIDING** – the Deputy Speaker
4. **STATEMENT PURSUANT TO STANDING 44(2)(b)**
  - (i) Pursuant to Standing Order 44(2)(b), the Chairperson, Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security issued a Statement regarding the attack and eviction of three Members of Parliament from Samburu County, in response to a request by the Member for Turkana North (Hon. Christopher Nakuleu).

The chairperson informed the House that the Police in the area received information that Members of the public had intended to attack the three Members of Parliament who were booked at Yare Restaurant. The police rushed to the hotel and offered the Members night security and were escorted out of the town the following day, contrary to allegations by the Members that they were escorted out of the hotel at midnight.

- (ii) Pursuant to Standing Order 44(2)(b), the Chairperson, Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security issued a Statement regarding the alleged corruption cases in the Department of Immigration in response to a request by the Member for Saboti (Hon. David Wafula)

The Chairperson informed the House that the Department had requested the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission to conduct an integrity test to all systems and all passport issuing centers and this is an on-going programme. All officers accused of corrupt activities were suspended and arraigned in court and the cases are on-going.

- (iii) Pursuant to Standing Order 44(2)(b), the Chairperson, Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security issued a Statement regarding the protest by boda boda operators in Lowdwar town in response to a request by the Member for Turkana County (Hon. Joyce Emanikor)

The Chairperson informed the House that following incidents of serious accidents involving motor cyclist in the county, police embarked on a routine raid targeting traffic offenders in a bid to bring sanity on the roads. Fines were imposed on offenders ranging from Ksh3,000 to Ksh15,000. This caused demonstrations in Lodwar town and roads barricaded and as a result, many shops were closed down. Investigation in the alleged killing of one Peter Mburu is on-going and when that is complete the matter will be brought before the Director of Public Prosecutions for further action.
