- 1. The Senate assembled at thirty Minutes past Two O'clock.
- 2. The proceedings were opened with Prayer said by the Deputy Speaker.

3. QUORUM OF THE SENATE

The Deputy Speaker, having counted the Honourable Senators present at the commencement of the Sitting and confirming that there was no Quorum, directed that the Bell be rung for ten minutes, pursuant to Standing Order 40;

And there being a Quorum before the expiry of the ten minutes;

The Deputy Speaker invited the Clerk to call the Orders of the Day.

4. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CHAIR

The Deputy Speaker conveyed the following Communication from the Chair:

a) Visiting Teachers and Students from Zion School Utawala, Nairobi City County

b) On Substantiation of facts that a Senator alleges to be true pursuant to Standing Order 105 – Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP

"Honourable Senators,

As you may recall, at the sitting of the Senate held on Wednesday, 24th September, 2025 (Afternoon Sitting), the Temporary Speaker (Sen. Catherine Mumma, MP) directed Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP, to substantiate utterances made in the course of his contribution to the Motion on the report of the Standing Committee on Finance and Budget on the County Governments (Equitable Share) Cash Disbursement Schedule for Financial Year 2025/2026. The direction was as a result of a Point of Order by the Senator for Narok County, Sen. Ledama Olekina, MP, pursuant to Standing Order 105.

Standing Order 105 provides that -

- "(1) A Senator shall be responsible for the accuracy of any facts that the Senator alleges to be true and may be required to substantiate any such facts instantly.
- (2) If a Senator has sufficient reason to convince the Speaker that the Senator is unable to substantiate the allegations instantly, the Speaker shall require that such Senator substantiates the allegations not later than the next sitting day, failure to which the Senator shall be deemed to be disorderly within the meaning of Standing Order 121 (Disorderly conduct), unless the Senator withdraws the allegations and gives a suitable apology, if the Speaker so requires."

Honourable Senators,

In the Point of Order, Sen. Cherarkey, MP, was required to substantiate the statement that –

"I am happy with TIFA survey results. You have seen our party, UDA, is the most popular party in this country. That is why we have elected Wakwabubi; Senator Wakwabubi from Bungoma."

Honourable Senators,

Upon being challenged by Sen. Ledama Olekina, MP, Sen. Cherarkey, MP, was not able to substantiate his statements as required pursuant to Standing Order 105(1). He subsequently requested the Temporary Speaker (Sen. Catherine Mumma, MP) to provide the evidence at the next sitting day in accordance with Standing Order 105 (2). Having acceded to the request, the Temporary Speaker (Sen. Catherine Mumma, MP) directed that the Senator substantiates the statement at the next sitting day.

Pursuant to Standing Order 105 (2), I now invite Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP to forthwith substantiate the claim, as raised in the Point of Order by Sen. Ledama Olekina, MP, failure to which, the Senator shall be deemed to be disorderly within the meaning of Standing Order 121. In the absence of such

substantiation, the Senator will be required to withdraw the statement and apologize to the Senate.

I thank you."

Thereupon the Deputy Speaker invited Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP, to either table evidence to substantiate his statement or withdraw and apologize.

Thereupon, the Senator undertook to submit to the office of the Clerk, via email, a soft copy of a report to substantiate his allegations.
