# 7. QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

# a) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 52 (1)

The Senator for Nandi County (Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP) made a Statement regarding the untimely demise of the late Elijah Kiptarbei Lagat. The Senator stated that the life of Elijah Kiptarbei Lagat, was marked by extraordinary achievements in both athletics and public service. He reiterated that Lagat, born on 19<sup>th</sup> June 1966 in Nandi County, rose from humble beginnings to become one of Kenya's most celebrated marathoners, winning the Boston Marathon (2000), Berlin Marathon (1997), and Prague Marathon (1998), and representing Kenya at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

The senator recalled that, upon retiring from athletics, Lagat joined politics and was elected Member of Parliament for Emgwen Constituency in 2007 and later for Chesumei Constituency in 2013, where he served diligently in several leadership roles, including in the Labour, Sports, and Health committees. The Senator described Lagat as a man of strong faith, a member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, and a leader committed to social welfare and youth empowerment, also serving on the NACADA Board.

He noted that Lagat passed away on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2025 at Eldoret Hospital, leaving behind a legacy of resilience, patriotism, and service. The Senator concluded by celebrating his contributions to sports and public service and expressed condolences, praying that his soul rests in eternal peace.
