The Member for Yatta (Hon. Robert Basil, MP) to ask the Cabinet Secretary for Interior and National Administration: -

Could the Cabinet Secretary provide reasons for the omission of administrative units in Yatta sub-county from Gazette Notice No. 1766 dated February 2024, despite the timely and proper submission by the residents of Yatta?

Could the Cabinet Secretary—

- (iii) clarify whether there is a boundary line between Kenya and Uganda for Lake Victoria and indicate the security measures taken to protect Kenyan fishermen from harassment and exploitation by Uganda Forces?
