The Senator for Bungoma County (Sen. Wafula Wakoli, MP) made a Statement on the extraordinary achievement of Mr. Emmanuel Wanyonyi, who was crowned the 2025 World Athletics Male Track Athlete of the Year.

In the Statement, the Senator highlighted Mr. Wanyonyi's remarkable rise to global prominence, noting that at only 21 years of age, he had delivered exceptional performances on the world stage. The Senator cited Mr. Wanyonyi's victory at the Tokyo World Championships, where he won the 800 metres title in a championship record time of 1:41.44, following his earlier triumph at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, where he claimed gold in 1:41.19, one of the fastest times ever recorded.

The Senator further observed that Mr. Wanyonyi dominated the 2025 season by winning the Diamond League title. Further, in 2025, Mr. Wanyonyi came up top in four of the six fastest 800-metre times. He noted that Mr. Wanyonyi's personal best of 1:41.11 placed him joint-second on the all-time list behind David Rudisha, underscoring Kenya's continued leadership in middle-distance running.

In conclusion, the Senator reflected on Mr. Wanyonyi's inspiring personal journey, from a childhood marked by hardship to becoming a world champion. He commended Mr. Wanyonyi's resilience and acknowledged the crucial role of community support in nurturing his talent. The Senator applauded Mr. Wanyonyi for bringing immense pride to the nation and calling for sustained institutional support to ensure that more young Kenyans can fulfil their athletic potential and elevate the country's stature on the global stage.
