Honourable Members, the **First Message** conveys that on 10th June 2026, the Senate considered and **approved** the mediated version of the Food and Feed Safety Control Coordination Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 21 of 2023) in the form proposed by the Mediation Committee.

Honourable Members, the **Second Message** conveys that on 10th June 2026, the Senate considered and approved the mediated version of the Division of Revenue Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 2 of 2026) in the form proposed by the Mediation Committee.

Honourable Members, you will recall that on 10th June 2026, the National Assembly passed this mediated version of the Bill.

In this regard, **Honourable Members**, the approval of the mediated versions of the two Bills therefore concludes their bicameral consideration. You may note that the Division of Revenue Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 2 of 2026) was assented to by His Excellency the President on 15th June 2026.

I will, in due course, present the Food and Feed Safety Control Coordination Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 21 of 2023) to His Excellency the President for Assent in accordance with the provisions of Article 113(3) of the Constitution. I thank you”
